

# **Friends of the Woodford Library Vocational Scholarship Instruction Sheet—2026**

## **Instructions**

**Background:** The economy of today and tomorrow will require able-bodied and well-trained workforce that includes not only college-educated professionals but millions more who choose to cave out productive and well-paid careers from alternative education and skills training programs and trade programs.

The Friends of the Library has given scholarships to college-bound students for many years. We have realized that other types of training and certificate programs after high school also require tuition or fees.

So, for the first time, the Friends of Woodford County Library (Versailles and Midway) is offering a \$1,000 non-college scholarship to one (1) graduating senior from Woodford County High School (WCHS) at its awards ceremony this spring. Any questions about the scholarship or the application can be directed to William Robbins or Emily Grimes. A scholarship application form is available from the WCHS (Student Hub) website.

**Eligibility:** Any Woodford County resident who is a graduating senior and has been accepted or plans to be enrolled in one of these fee-based programs is encouraged to apply:

- 1) a short-term certificate
- 2) a bona fide job skills training program
- 3) a technical or jobs training community college program.

**Submitting Applications:** Applications may be handwritten or typed and emailed or mailed to counselor Emily Grimes or registrar Amy Tucker and postmarked by April 1, 2026. You can apply online through the WCHS website.

The deadline for submitting the completed application form online is: April 1, 2026. The winner will be publicly announced at the WCHS Awards ceremony in May.

**Selection Process:** The selection committee of the Friends of the Woodford County Library Board of Directors will review all completed applications submitted by the deadline. The recipients will be notified of their selection during the week of April 27th.
