

PROPHETS

We reflect upon the voice of the prophet in this Sunday's readings. We hear of the suffering and the rescue of Jeremiah. We hear how Jesus anticipates his suffering and death. As with Jeremiah and Jesus, the prophets were sent by God to the leaders and people of Israel. A prophet is one who speaks truth to the powerful, exposing their darker hidden motives and injustices. The prophet presents a way forward that aligns with God's purposes. A prophet can force people away from a comfortable neutrality or indifference. The prophet creates an urgency to make a choice: Are we content with the status quo, or are we to change our ways and pursue a new and better path? Today, we may also ask, how do we identify and respond to prophets of our time? How might we provide a prophetic voice in our Church and in our world?








Dear Friends in Christ,

At one time or another when an unpleasant message must be delivered, the one who is delivering it says, "Don't shoot the messenger!" With this letter, I am the messenger, and the message is about the 2022 *Archdiocesan Annual Appeal* and St. Paul's Parish.

These aren't the best of times to be sure. While the *Appeal* is for the well-being of Catholic Christians in the San Francisco Archdiocese, the current economic burdens on our people are not to be underestimated nor overlooked. I feel these burdens, too. Nevertheless, I must fulfill my responsibilities as your Pastor as well as I can for the good of the parish, even in these difficult and upsetting times.

Each year we are tasked with participating in the *Annual Appeal* to enable this local Church to proclaim the Good News of Jesus, and to provide vital services to people near us. Without our support, the good works of the Catholic Church in the San Francisco, San Mateo and Marin Counties would be greatly diminished.

As you know, St. Paul's Parish was assessed \$84,431 for 2022. To date, \$27,346 has been received. We still owe \$56,086, and will have to pay any shortfall from our parish operating account on Dec. 31, 2022. To share our burden, I have pledged another \$500, in addition to my January pledge.

I invite you to prayerfully consider whether another donation, large or small, is possible for you and your family budget. Thank you for the donations you have made and the payments you are making on your 2022 pledges.


Join me in praying that we will reach our assessed 2022 Archdiocesan Annual Appeal goal, and be assured of my love and prayers for you in Jesus's name.


