

# August 28th Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### HUMILITY

Today's readings praise the virtue of humility and offer concrete ways for us to become more humble. The Book of Sirach suggests a practical reason for acting with humility: humble people are more likeable than the arrogant. Even God "finds favor" with those who humble themselves. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus provides real-world suggestions for growing in humility and teaches us never to assume we are better than others. His words change our outward behavior and expand our hearts and minds to care about people we might have dismissed before. This practical, almost "folksy" wisdom about humility helps us behave better in daily life and makes our lofty goal of eternal life more accessible. Our reading from Hebrews affirms that heaven is indeed approachable. The personal love and sacrifice of Jesus have opened "the city of the living God" to us. Humility prepares us for paradise.



In today's Bulletin you will find a letter from the Archbishop about Proposition 1 on the November 8 ballot. In fulfilling his responsibilities as your Pastor, Father Mario asks that you read the letter, become educated about Prop 1, as well as the other six ballot propositions as you prepare to vote Nov. 8, 2022.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The term "Eucharist" originates from the Greek word /eu-ka-ris-tee-a/, meaning thanksgiving. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will resume on First Fridays every month at St. Paul's Church beginning September 2, 2022. Father Mario invites you to stop by and visit with the Sacramental Jesus from 2:00-7:00 PM in St. Paul's Church on the First Friday of every month. We are grateful to the Missionaries of Charity who will prepare the altar and have assured us of their presence in the church.

#### Labor Day Weekend

**Labor Day** is a <u>federal holiday in the United States</u> celebrated on the first Monday in September to honor and recognize the <u>American labor movement</u> and the works and contributions of <u>laborers</u> to the development and achievements of the <u>United States</u>. [III][2][3] The <u>three-day weekend</u> it falls on is called **Labor Day Weekend**.


Beginning in the late 19th century, as the <u>trade union</u> and <u>labor movements</u> grew, trade unionists proposed that a day be set aside to celebrate labor. "Labor Day" was promoted by the <u>Central Labor Union</u> and the <u>Knights of Labor</u>, which organized the first parade in <u>New York City</u>. In 1887, <u>Oregon</u> was the first state of the United States to make it an official <u>public holiday</u>. By the time it became an official <u>federal holiday</u> in 1894, thirty <u>states in the U.S.</u> officially celebrated Labor Day. [4]



Dear Faithful of the Archdiocese of San Francisco,

As you likely know, we are at a critical moment right now in the history of California: voters this November will be asked whether or not they support the "right" to abortion for all nine months, without any restrictions or limitations, being written into our state constitution. It is indeed a very disturbing indication of the state of our current political climate that such a question will be asked in the form of Proposition 1 on the November 8 ballot.

Proposition 1 was passed by the state legislature and signed by the governor, and now must go to a vote of the people, requiring a simple majority for its approval. The California bishops have made defeating Prop 1 our number one priority for this year, and we ask every Catholic in the state to become educated on this dangerous bill, encourage others to oppose it, and support the "No on Prop 1 Campaign" with your prayer, fasting and financial contributions. More information about our efforts in this campaign, including engaging our spiritual resources, is available on the website of the California Catholic Conference (<a href="https://cacatholic.org/prop1">https://cacatholic.org/prop1</a>) and information about efforts in the Archdiocese of San Francisco at this web page: <a href="https://sfarchdiocese.org/noonprop1/">https://sfarchdiocese.org/noonprop1/</a>.

Updates will be sent to the parishes to publish as well.

Finally, I ask you to join in a novena for the defeat of Proposition 1 that begins September 29, the Feast of the Archangels Gabriel, Michael, and Raphael, and concludes October 7, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Information and novena prayers can be found at https://cacatholic.org/prop1.





## **COMMUNICATION AND MERCY**

How many pieces of mail does your family get in a day? A week? The pope receives a huge amount of mail, about thirty large sacks a week.

Within the Vatican Secretariat of State is a special Papal Correspondence Office, staffed by a monsignor and three assistants, whose job is just to sort through and read the mail. The letters are sorted into boxes labeled by language: Portuguese, English, French, Italian, etc. Sometimes the mail includes small gifts or drawings, but most of it asks for prayers and support. The team reads all the Italian mail and forwards the letters to groups that will help with their requests. They send a reply to everyone! Some letters the sorters decide are important enough to pass along to the pope so he can read them himself and decide how he should answer them.

You can write to the pope at this address:



You will need to buy a special international stamp to mail your letter.

The pope did have an email address once, but the last time one was up it crashed the servers. He does have a Twitter account (@pontifex) which has 18.8 million followers.

In January 2016, Pope Francis sent a message titled "Communication and Mercy: A Fruitful Encounter" for the fiftieth World Day of Social Communications. He wrote that the internet, text messages, and social networks are gifts from God. Like all of God's gifts, we must learn to use them responsibly and take care that they are always used for good. Francis asks us to remember that our communications must always contain words that are compassionate and merciful.



Think about sending some sort of correspondence to the pope in the coming days or weeks. What would you write about? What would you ask for? What would you tell him about yourself and your family? What good wishes would you send him?
