Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today the Church celebrates ***Gaudete Sunday***, the Third Sunday of Advent. This marks a point of joy and rejoicing as the feast of Christmas fast approaches. The scriptures proclaimed reflect a time of renewal of the human condition as God enters our human nature with His Son. This marks the manifestation of the promise of salvation history with the birth of Jesus Christ, the long-sought Messiah. The Book of the prophet Isaiah poses an almost-lyrical cadence as the restoration of Zion, and the holy city of Jerusalem is realized. The road of suffering of the Jewish people takes them from the slavery of Egypt to the freedom and triumph of Zion. The faithfulness of God is made known in a transformative way; from a barren and forsaken landscape gives way to fertile ground and new life.

We see the triumph of healing and reconciliation over brokenness experienced by human beings. "Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak, say to those whose hearts are frightened: be strong, fear not!" Throughout the Advent season, the words of Isaiah echo the graciousness of God who keeps faith with His people and portends the coming of Jesus. The Messiah is the One who heals the brokenhearted and dispirited; he welcomed the foreigner and the stranger; he brought hope and redemption to a broken world.

The Letter of James offers us great advice not only as we prepare for the birth of Jesus but for our daily way of proceeding. James exhorts us to be patient. He uses the metaphor of a farmer who patiently, quietly awaits the fruits of his hard labor. Patience is a virtue very difficult to live by, especially in our highly driven culture. We are conditioned by our "Silicon Valley Culture" to expect immediate answers to our questions; to get to our destination as quickly as possible; to find easy access to our desires and aspirations.

As people of faith, we realize that this is a false and fleeting comfort. When we live on the periphery, without patience and deeper reflection, we can be easily disappointed and dissatisfied. Patience affords us the opportunity to not only ponder the deeper things in life but to appreciate our God-given blessings. Patience gives us perspective on how we navigate our way through life. Patience is an anecdote falling into the trap and temptation of complaining and rendering judgment and casting aspersions against others. James calls on us to be firm of heart; this is one of the spiritual gifts of the Advent season: to not lose heart, to be stouthearted in anticipation for the coming of the Lord.

Matthew's Gospel speaks to us of the magnanimity of John the Baptist. His example to us is both edifying and instructive as we renew our own call to Christian discipleship. John came into the world as the herald of the Good News; in a profound spirit of humility, his voice never pointed inward to himself but towards the Lord. As he finds himself in a prison cell, knowing that Jesus was indeed the Messiah, he sent his followers to ask Jesus if he was indeed the Messiah. This was done so Jesus could confirm his own identity. "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them."

This is indeed cause for joy and celebration this *Gaudete Sunday*!

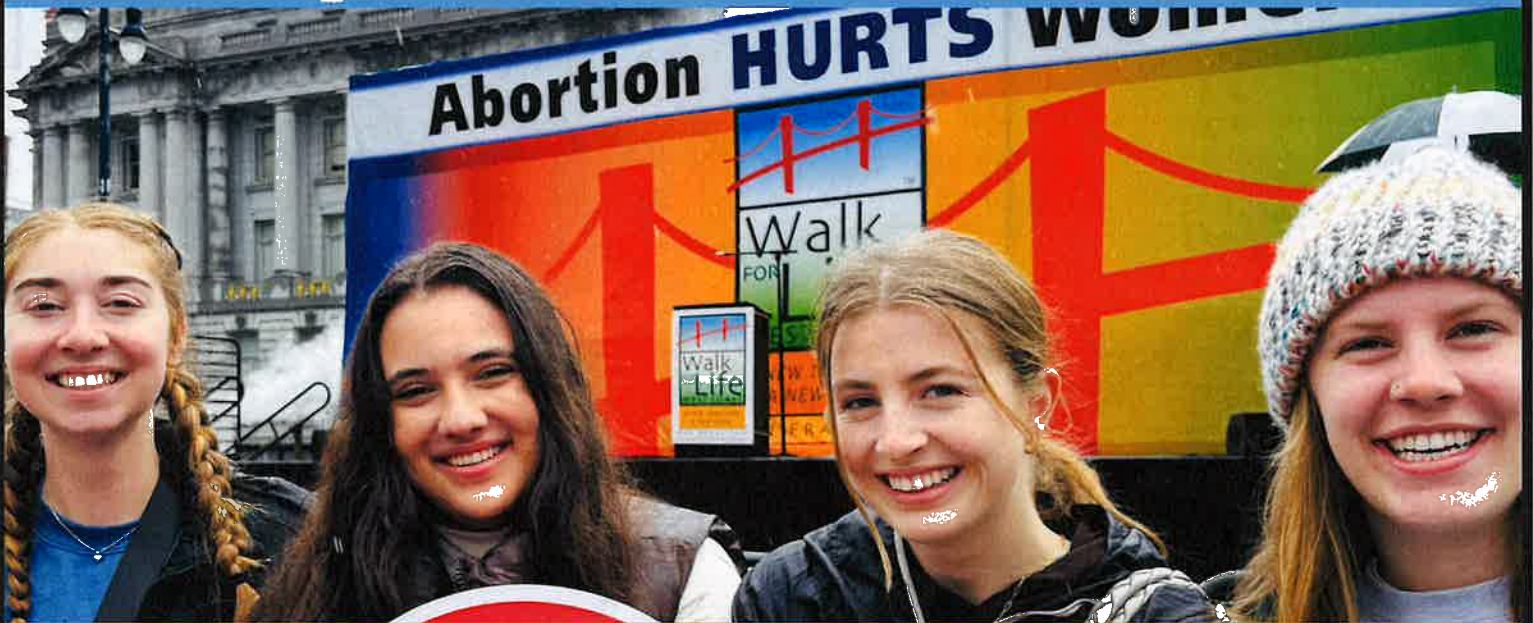

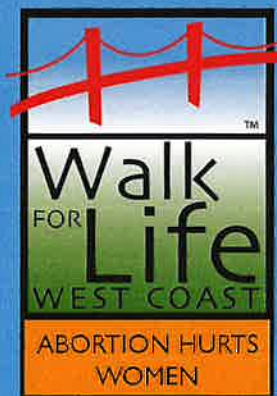
