STATEMENT OF NEED

Traditional communication methods such as intercoms, two-way radios or mobile applications, can be impractical or unsafe during high-stress situations where discretion, speed, and simplicity are essential. Teachers and staff need an immediate method to request assistance without leaving students unattended or drawing attention to the situation.

We would like to propose implementing the SafeTouch™ Self-Alert System, a wearable, one-touch emergency alert solution designed specifically for K-12 school environments.

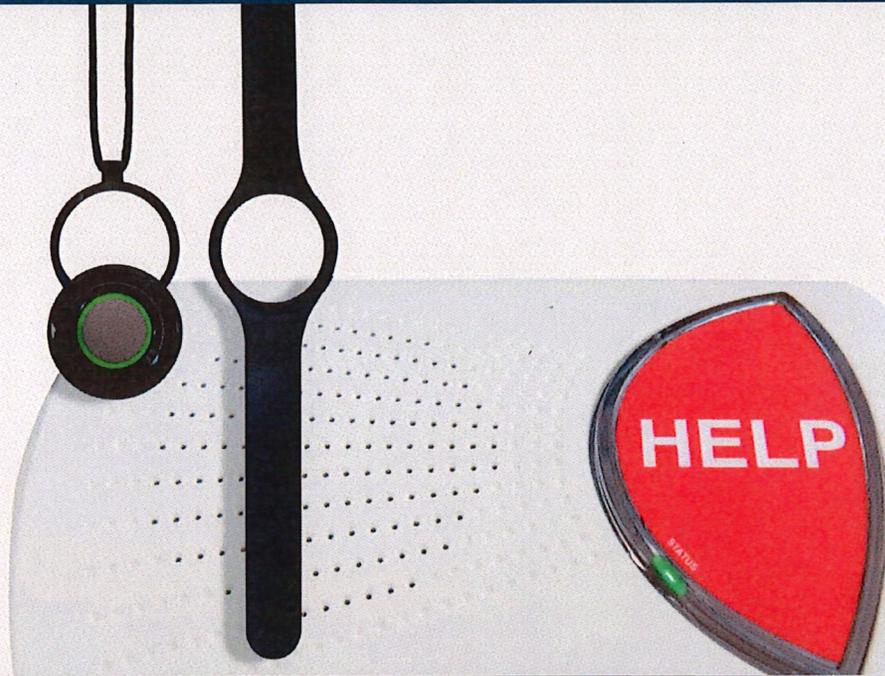

SAFETOUCH™ IS A WIRELESS, WEARABLE EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM THAT ALLOWS STAFF TO SILENTLY SIGNAL FOR HELP DURING

- 01 Intruder threats
- 02 Medical emergencies
- 03 Student crisis
- 04 Violent or disruptive behavior
- 05 School bus incident

HOW IT WORKS

01

Staff member wears a SafeTouch device

02

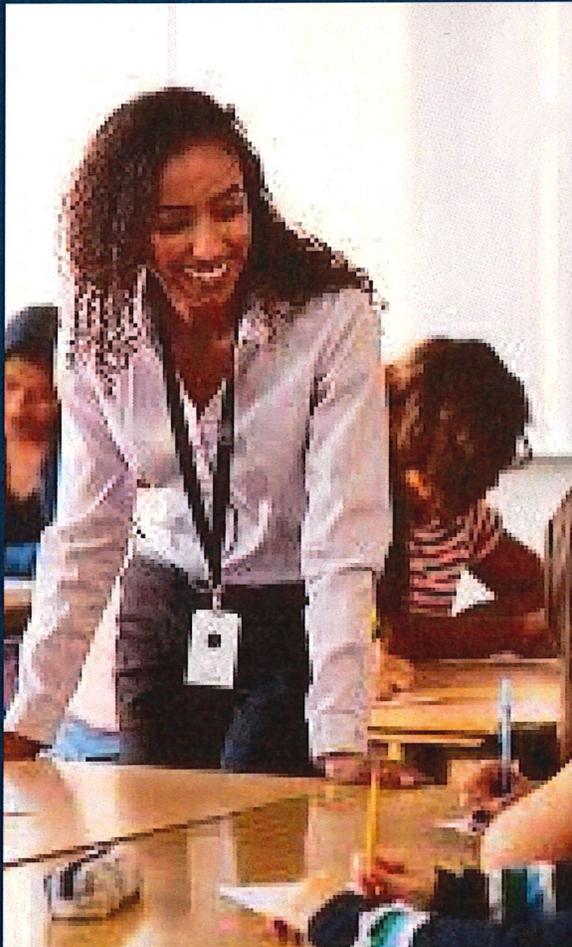
In an emergency, the button is pressed

03

Alert is transmitted instantly to designated response team

04

Location or zone of the alert is identified

permits grant funds to be used for equipment, technology, and systems designed to improve school safety, including communication tools that support emergency response and violence prevention.

PROJECT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

01. SafeTouch™ devices will be deployed to designated staff members
02. Implementation will be completed with minimal disruption
03. Staff will receive training on system use and response protocols
04. The system will be operational immediately following installation
