Chairman's Message

Dear Friends and Supporters of Driven Re-Entry,

I don't know about you, but for me, it is hard to believe we are not even finished with our first year. To see how far God has taken this organization already is absolutely mind blowing! God has done way more in this short season than I could have ever thought. WOW!

Our dream that became a reality, was to get the men's house renovated, furnished, food, supplies, and operating. Gateway Church graciously donated enough to cover this and a 10-passenger van. I am so grateful how God has stretched the funds. We were able to get some really amazing upgrades in the men's house. The entire house was painted, popcorn ceilings removed, all brand-new flooring, tankless hot water heater (10 guys in one house is a lot of hot water), some new light fixtures, privacy shower glass installed in master bathroom, and cleaned up the landscaping in front. With those funds the entire house was filled with brand new furniture, small appliances, housewares, and TV's. We were under budget! God paved a path for an opportunity to open a women's home. With a portion of the budget left over, we were able to set up and open a women's home!

Driven Re-Entry and Recovery has two homes with men and women finding new life in Christ, Recovery, and Community. The successes we are seeing are men and women be set free, be accountable, and healed. Now these men and women are serving at Gateway Church's Dallas Campus. Our residents often show up feeling completely hopeless, suicidal, and strung out but through the ministry provided are restoring their hope in God and are thriving in ways they never thought possible. These houses have not been populated for a full year yet but we are already seeing these men and women catching the vision of what God has in store for them and finding their purpose in Christ!

The proof is in the pudding! Without your help and support we would not be able to provide this ministry to show these men and women a new way of life. One that is attainable and abundantly filled with purpose and hope! I and the entire Driven organization want to say THANK YOU!



About Driven Re-Entry

Driven Re-Entry is a 501c3 non-profit ministry. Our vision is for societal reintegration of ex-offenders and people recovering from addiction with a 3 phase, 18-month approach. Driven Re-Entry offers an accelerated trajectory for success after incarceration and addiction through biblically based discipleship and mentorship, participation with the local church, as well as the 12 steps of recovery.





Driven Re-Entry aims to duplicate the Lord's gracious intervention and redemption by selecting ex-offenders and people that struggle with addiction that display high potential, high performance characteristics compatible with the ministry's vision. We pray and ask God to show us who should be accepted for Driven. They MUST be Holy Spirit highlighted.



Rehab and Set-Up







Men's home: renovated plumbing repaired, popcorn ceilings removed, painted top to bottom, some new light fixtures, flooring installed, and privacy shower glass installed. All of this was completed under the original budget.

We furnished the men and women's home with brand new everything! Beds, appliances, computers, kitchen goods, and much more under budget!









Men's Home



Our first Driven Resident, Rudy, has become the house manager, had his driver's license reinstated, been to our Prison Campus to serve inside the Michael Unit, helps lead a small group at church, has been promoted from window cleaner to Roofing Project Manager, is being developed for Sr. Leadership, and continues to pour into others. Rudy is fulfilling the God given vision for Driven Re-entry.

We have 4 residents currently that are sober, serving at Gateway Dallas Campus, employed and doing well! New residents have been selected by leadership, are awaiting parole, and we are excited to welcome them on their release date.



Women's Home



With the surplus leftover from the Men's Home startup, we felt the Lord prompting Driven to also start a women's home. The opportunity presented itself to lease an already renovated home in the area. We presented the idea to our Board of Directors, and they unanimously agreed to pursue Driven 2. Once again, we set a budget to furnish the home, and off we went!

Alicia showed up straight from spending time in jail for a drug charge, estranged from her children because of her addiction. We have watched her grow in Christ, sobriety, character, and her leadership. She is now the house manager. Alicia builds up other women in the home and shows them the way to healing and recovery. She also is employed in her chosen career as a vet tech, is working towards reuniting with her children, and serves at church. She is the example to new women of what the Lord can do for them through the Driven process.



Financial Overview

Our financial model is designed around getting each Driven home to self-sustainability. Each resident pays rent for being in the program. Basic food, household supplies, and gas for the house van are provided. It is important to help them in their own path towards self-sustainability, so this program walks them through a process of getting a job, paying rent, learning to save money, tithe, and carry the responsibility of these things while also requiring them to invest in themselves. However, when they arrive at the house, we also give them time to get their feet under them and get their bearing before being asked to pay rent and then rent is assessed based on ability and stair-stepped up as they are able. Our heart is that as they progress in their ability to pay, they do not acquire any debt for rent which can feel heavy and hopeless for them to be able to dig their way out of.

All of our renovations and furniture/household items were done under budget. The biggest challenge we are facing right now is that we want to find high capacity leaders coming out of incarceration who are motivated and willing to give themselves completely to the process because this program is designed to not simply help them stay out of incarceration and addiction but to grow high capacity leaders that own businesses, lead at high levels within the local church, and provide opportunities for others in the same way that Scott and Tabitha are doing. Once God highlights those people to us, we are then dependent on the sometimes-slow legal process as we wait for their release and probation terms to be set. Our current occupancy is lower than our set goal but the pipeline is full and we are anxiously awaiting for them to join Driven at release.






Secondly, God has opened the door for us to partner with Victory Church in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and we are looking into housing options and gathering leaders as we prepare to launch our third Driven home. Your donations go to helping us bridge the gap between the house opening and getting to full occupancy and also to helping us grow into another state where Driven is desperately needed. God has been opening so many doors as we know he cares deeply for these men and women and we want to thank you for your consideration is partnering with us in walking out this important calling.

On the next page, you will find the cost breakdown for each house. The model of the ministry is that the monthly costs are covered by the rent that the residents pay once the house is close to capacity and the residents are able to pay their full rent. Donations help to cover two areas that greatly impact this financial model. The first one is that there is always a gap between when we have identified a future resident and when they have gone completely through the legal process of setting the terms of their probation/parole and getting released from prison. This can be a slow process but we prefer to identify these high level leaders while they are still incarcerated and have a place ready for them to go to directly from their release. Secondly, donations help brideg the gap from when the residents arrive at the house to when they are able to pay rent. They arrive with nothing and we assist in getting forms of identification, employment, bank accounts, and other things needed to help them started on the journey re-entering society.


