NEWS & NOTES

FROM FR. PETE JANKOWSKI

In this history of our faith, the current Bishop of Winona-Rochester (Most Rev. Robert Barron) taught we seminarians that the Church, by its nature, is often "reactive" over "proactive" – this happens to be the way of life. Sometimes we do not prepare for the challenges in our life yet to come because we are so caught up in the present. Sometimes we need to STOP and think about how we get by providing our children with resources for their college education, our retirement, the maintenance of our homes or the betterment of our lives. Planning for our future requires a sacrifice in the present, just like most good results in life are the product of hard work... and a lot of prayer! (As I often say, God may not be able to solve all our problems of today but at least we know we are not alone in this journey.)

That said... we have accomplished a great deal to fall in line with our diocesan policies to maintain what we have and show the bishop's office that we are prepared for what is yet to come. We have been overflowing with our spiritual activities at the Border Town Parishes, the most important thing we can do at our parishes. We have kept up with our building upgrades, now focusing on doing so without breaking our bankrolls. By welcoming the outsider, we have seen a huge growth, especially in our Hispanic Communities (I have told our parishioners that when we welcome the outsider, EVERYONE WINS because we show the bishop's office that we are growing).

We have come to the part of our story that we now need to prepare for the future, which can happen through establishing a "Border Town Foundation" for our parishes. Knowing that the generation who is financing our parishes in such a great way are now moving into their senior years, we continually need to "re-stock the pond" and provide the next generation a good start to allowing the Lord's grace to fill the hearts of our children. Although St. Pat's collection is trending in the right direction, we have seen how at both parishes how a foundation would provide resources that the youth of today's age might not be able to supply on their own. Most institutions have come to this realization – perhaps we should think this way to preserve the Churches under our care.

Between both parishes this last year, we have received well over \$100,000 in Estate Planning Gifts that have allowed us to pay our bills. We received a nice gift at St. Patrick's to install generators at all our buildings this upcoming Spring; at St. Anne's, a generous donation helped us pay our bills the last fiscal year. Our "Online Giving" portal has collected over \$200,000 in donations these last five years (which I why I continue to provide Online Masses which are being watched in the states as well as overseas).

Over the last few weeks, I have been speaking to the farmers of our area, seeing if they can help us with this cause. One farmer mentioned to me that his donations to the parishes we serve have been in the form of "number alliteration" (\$333, \$444, \$555 and even \$4,444.44!) I told him all the donations are fine except for \$666 – add or subtract a dollar but don't give us a donation with the symbol for the devil!!! Another farmer volunteered to donate a cow and the FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS OF HAMBURGER that he would process of said cow to be raffled off at the parish (anyone have room in your fridge for five hundred pounds of hamburger?). Another farmer suggested that, to save money on a parking lot project, that we re-process the roads being unearthed on Route 1-17 to use in paving what we have at St. Pat's! What an idea!

I also encountered a wonderful parishioner who asked me how much it would cost to pave the lot behind St. Patrick's church building. I think the cost is \$100,000 – the parishioner said she cannot give \$100,000 but she can give us a good start towards the project... which is a good thing!

If any of our farmers might consider donating something "when the time comes" as part of an estate gift, if someone who attends our St. An

ne Novena helps us maintain that Novena through a foundation gift, we would be well-served to allow the Lord to work through our communities to offer the same grace as has been offered since the 1850s.

Meanwhile, I continue to celebrate the Online and In-Church Masses for your benefit. I will continue to give of the resources that I could pocket but rather give back to the parishes I serve (I think last year my personal donations topped \$80,000; this year I think it's around \$70,000). I will do my part because YOU ARE SACRED; YOU ARE A TREASURE! Please do your part to help out our wonderful Border Town Communities in 2026 and beyond. Happy New Year and God Bless You! – Fr. Following Jesus Without a Star to Guide Us

“We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage” (Matthew 2:2) describes the spark that sent the Magi on their journey. Something unusual in the sky, interpreted as a sign of something wonderful—in response, they changed direction in their lives and devoted themselves to a completely different path. As wonderful as it might well be, a special star in the heavens is not the ordinary experience of how we learn to follow the Lord or discern his will. If only there could be a sign in God’s universe for each of us, beckoning us forward, clarifying what we need to do, setting down the path that needs to be followed. Perhaps life would be much simpler. Or perhaps not?

Would it truly be less complicated if everything were made clear and certain? Is the manifestation of God’s grace and blessings confined to the straight and narrow, or can we also experience God in the chaos—“in the weeds,” so to speak. Human experience seems to suggest that life is more “gray” than “black and white.” There is real grace in the journey, in making mistakes, even in choosing something that is incomplete. Thankfully, God’s grace does not need perfection to be powerful. We can know and follow God’s will for us in the ordinary moments of day-to-day living. We do not need the extraordinary or the dramatic. ●

Reflect

How can I resolve to look for God in the unplanned, the unexpected, the interruptions?

Dear Padre,

I recently lost my husband of sixty years. I prayed for him through his four-year illness. Since he has died, I cannot pray. Any advice for me?

My heartfelt condolences on your profound loss. When someone we love dies, a part of us dies too. Sometimes, the trauma is so severe that it can even affect our relationship with God.

Psychiatrist Elisabeth Kübler-Ross identified five stages of grief. In the denial stage, some people can't accept the reality of the death. It becomes too much to handle. In the anger stage, some may question their belief in God—especially if their prayer requests (such as, “Please God, if you heal my loved one, I will...”) weren't successful in the bargaining stage. People in the depression stage feel overwhelmed by the reality of the loss and may not always feel like connecting with others—even with God in prayer. However, in the acceptance stage, emotions stabilize, and a person comes to terms with their new reality. Nothing makes up for the absence of a loved one, but people manage to cope and live on.

It's because you loved so deeply that the loss feels so deep. God accepts you completely; God understands how you feel. He wants you to be at peace and live life fully. Our compassionate God yearns to help console you and offer assistance in your healing process until you can embrace him again in prayer. ●

Desde entonces, el uso de nacimientos llegó al continente americano en donde se convierte en la decoración principal para las fiestas navideñas.

Así como en todo país latinoamericano el montaje del Belén es una tradición, lo es también en Venezuela. Con el pesebre venezolano llegan también aguinaldos, parrandas, Misas y patines. ¡Sí! ¡Patines!

Desde la mitad del siglo pasado los venezolanos celebran la época navideña con "patinadas". Estas "patinadas" normalmente se hacen por las mañanas y muchas calles están cerradas a los autos hasta las 8 a.m. para que niños y jóvenes puedan disfrutar de los patines, bicicletas y otros juguetes que les regala el niño Dios.

Por eso, muchos niños duermen con un "cordoncito" atado al dedo gordo de los pies, que cuelgan por la ventana para que los despierten los que pasan patinado.

Pero también podemos exponernos, por culpa de esas expectativas, a perder de vista la gloria divina cuando se nos aparece de verdad. Nos entretendremos buscando la estrella, y nos olvidamos que la estrella no es la señal divina, sino el bebe. Puede que tengamos que persistir en el camino antes de llegar a encontramos con la apariencia real de la gloria de Dios en nuestra vida: Jesucristo.
