



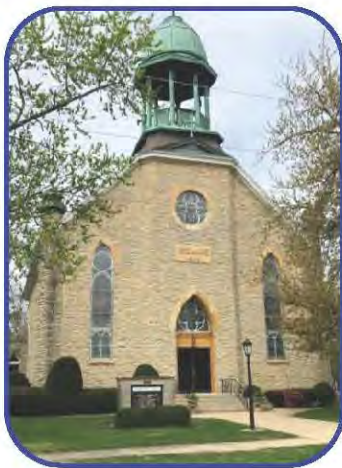

On this Father's Day Weekend, I once again ask you to pray for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. These "fathers" often get underappreciated and often castigated for living the gospel message. This is part of life and this is the gospel message that they are required to follow: "Then they will hand you over to persecution and they will kill you. You will be hated by all nations because of me... but the one who perseveres to the end will be saved." There is a special collection this weekend for Retired Priests; they really need your help. Please pray for those in active ministry – so many of our diocesan priests (especially south of I-80) are alone and need your support and prayers as well.

I certainly ask you to pray for two of our diocesan priests who passed away this last week. Fr. Anthony Nyamai was the pastor of St. Carlo Acutis Parish in Crest Hill; he was to be transferred on July 1 but passed away on June 13. The parishioners in Crest Hill are suffering right now and need your prayers.

Fr. Gerald Tivy also passed away this last week. I served under Fr. Tivy in 2005 while I was asked to serve St. Patrick's in Momence as well.

His assistant priest, Fr. Ken Zigmund, died a few months ago as well and also needs your prayers.

We had one of our larger ordination classes this year but we are still losing more priests than we are bringing in. We need to support the ones we have and we need to encourage our youth to consider this way of life. Please consider being generous in this second collection.

Bobbi Volek and with Madison Meyer, asked if we could bring back Vacation Bible School at the Catholic Church. More information is forthcoming but the bible school will run the week of July 20. Call (815) 472-2864 or (815) 427-8265 to learn more.

I also wish to thank Fr. Tom Conde and Fr. Uriel Martinez for helping us out during my time away. 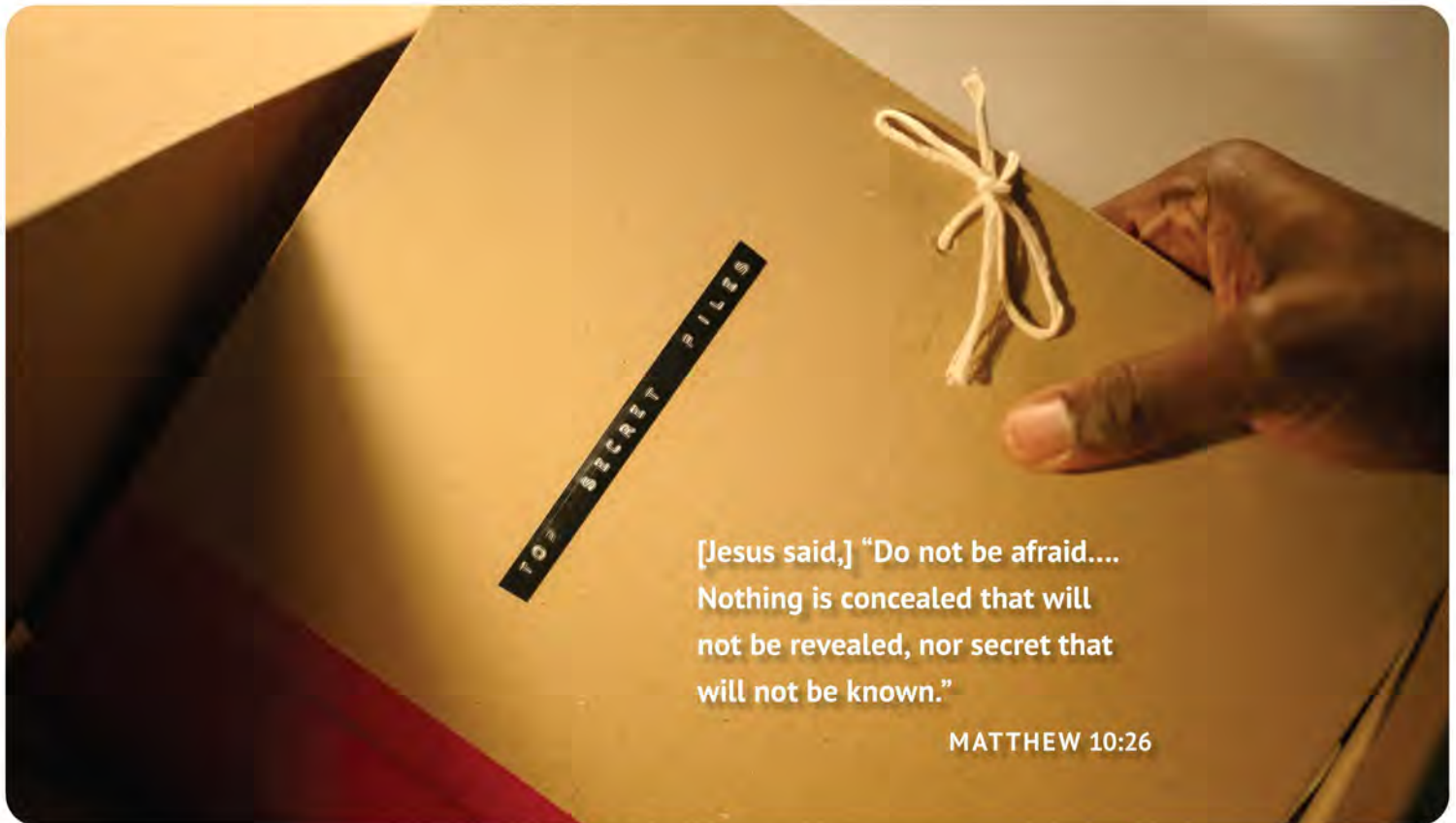

The Freedom of Letting Go of Secrets

Secrets. The disabling fear of discovery. Trying so hard to conceal something that we do not want others to know. Often, we guard secrets closely because we believe we will be embarrassed, punished, or excluded if our secrets are made known.

Sometimes, we hold tightly to secrets because we are ashamed. We keep other secrets because of the dynamics of family life: “We do not share our family business with anyone.” All secrets can be difficult to keep—some more than others. Perhaps the most difficult secret to hold is one that we fear defines our personal integrity and authenticity. It is the fear not only of discovery but also of perception: How will I be perceived if this is made known? Will I still be accepted? Or, even more painful: Will I be rejected, and how complete will the rejection be?

The “good news” of the gospel is that “nothing is concealed that will not be revealed” (Matthew 10:26). In other words, there is nothing that can remain tucked away forever. Everything is revealed in one way or another. Gospel grace and freedom result when a person chooses to freely release whatever it is that burdens them, including closely held secrets. It is the ultimate experience of dying to self to claim eternal life. ●

Reflect

What am I afraid to reveal to others? Can I try telling God?

Dear Padre,

For the past year or so, I have been trying to pray on a regular basis, but I am constantly distracted. My mind wanders so easily. Do you have any suggestions?

Distractions in prayer are an inescapable part of the human condition and the results of our imagination. Even great saints experienced distractions in prayer. Some of their suggestions may help. For example, when St. Thérèse of Lisieux struggled with prayer, she would recite an Our Father or Hail Mary or read from the gospels. Praying as an act of faith or returning to God's presence and love can turn our focus away from other concerns, but, even then, distractions may still arise.

When we become aware of distractions, we should calmly renew our focus and continue our prayer. Saint Teresa of Ávila wrote in *The Interior Castle*, "We should not be distressed by reason of our thoughts, nor allow ourselves to be worried by them.... [Thoughts are] inevitable. Do not let [them] disturb or grieve you." No matter how often distractions return or how long they last, they are not sinful; rather, they are opportunities to show God that we are sincere about praying.

Saint Alphonsus, another great teacher of prayer, reminds us that prayer is necessary, beneficial, and always possible. He advises us to hang in there, because the devil would like nothing better than for us to stop praying. ●


That sentence or something very similar is the most common statement we've heard in interviews we conducted with church members during consultations. Most people active in a church really do think their church is friendly. These members have relationships and interactions that give them that perceived reality.

But when we interview guests of the same churches, we hear a different story. These guests often think the members are "unfriendly" or "cliquish." They don't have the established relationships members have. They are not familiar with the church facilities. They don't know what to expect.

The church welcome ministry (or whatever your church calls it) has always been important. But the ministry is more important today than it's ever been. Look at six reasons this level of importance has risen.

1. **CHURCH MEMBERS ARE RETURNING TO CHURCH AFTER A LONG ABSENCE.** The pandemic kept them away. Many have returned, but not all have. Some are easing back into church cautiously and slowly. It is critical for the welcome ministry to encourage these returning members to get back into a rhythm and habit of gathering regularly.
2. **MORE NEW GUESTS ARE ARRIVING.** During the quarantine, a number of new residents moved into your community. They have not had an opportunity to visit a church, but they are ready now. For some unchurched people, the angst of the COVID era has them asking questions about God, church, and faith. Some will show up at your church.
3. **CONTEXT HAS CHANGED.** Yes, the world has changed. The local church is a microcosm of some of the contextual changes of our society. Specifically, the ways we greet people in many contexts have changed. Hugs are mostly out. Handshakes are in some places and out in others. The availability of visible sanitizers is necessary in most churches. Those who participate in the welcome ministry are aware of the best ways to greet guests.
4. **FIRST IMPRESSIONS ARE MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER.** Because some of the guests have not been in a church for months, perhaps even a few years, the first few moments they arrive on the church property are critical. They could return repeatedly, or they could decide it's not worth the risk and effort.
5. **FEW CHURCH MEMBERS ARE NATURALLY WELCOMING TO GUESTS.** They naturally gravitate to people they know. They may be uncertain if a person is a guest or a member they don't know. Leaders can exhort church members to be friendly, but the challenge for it to happen will always be there. The welcome ministry fills this void, and the void has been exacerbated during the pandemic.
6. **IT IS BIBLICAL.** While we don't see a formal welcome ministry per se in the Bible, the importance of hospitality is clear and powerful. For example, "When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13). Additionally, Paul's qualifications for church leaders include hospitality (see 1 Timothy 3:2-3).

Your church's welcome ministry has always been important. But it is likely it is more important than ever.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1769 los misioneros franciscanos establecieron la primera misión en lo que hoy es la ciudad de San Diego, California. Bajo la dirección de fray Junipero Serra, los hermanos menores pudieron establecer otras ocho misiones, incluyendo la ciudad de San Francisco, en 1776. Junipero o José Miguel Serra, fue hijo de padres campesinos de la Isla de Mallorca, España. Ingreso a la Orden de los hermanos menores (franciscanos) a los dieciséis años y con el tiempo, llegó a ser profesor de filosofía, pero su verdadero deseo era ser misionero en el continente americano, lo que hoy conocemos como Hemisferio Occidental. En 1749, su orden religiosa lo envió a México como administrador del Colegio Apostólico. Poco a poco se fue desprendiendo de sus cargos académicos para establecer misiones entre los indígenas. Aunque algunos afirman lo contrario, Junipero fue arduo defensor de los nativos. En California, más de una vez tuvo problemas con los soldados españoles, debido a que estos abusaban de los amerindios, problemas que lo llevaron a defender los derechos humanos de los nativos ante el Virrey en México. Sus esfuerzos por cristianizar los indígenas de California tuvieron como resultado más de 6000 bautizos durante sus quince años en esa región.
