This summer, three specific activities we have planned for the summer are beginning to take shape. **Bobbi Volek and Maddie Meyer** asked me some time ago about hosting a "Vacation Bible School" for the kids in the summer. We have not had one of these for a while in the area and we are really blessed that our young families in the area are getting as invested as they are. VBS will take place the week prior to the Novena from July 20-24; more information about VBS is forthcoming (although I did find the video of what Bobbi and Maddie want to do with the kids that I have put on our website.

Another round of **Birthday Baseball with Fr. Pete takes place on August 13** this year with the Joliet Slammers! The Knights of Columbus provide the transportation, the tickets are \$10 each for the bus and the ticket and the altar servers get to go free. What a deal!

Our **Parish Picnic** will take place in September. More on the picnic is yet to come. We also will talk about the 50/50 Raffle for the picnic in the weeks ahead.

Meanwhile, over at St. Anne's, a couple wonderful souls saw what we had been doing at Pat's and inquired about getting a **St. Anne's Parking Lot Project** similar to St. Pat's. As a response, we asked Scott Crawford to

visit St. Anne's and provide us two bids for the parking lot – it will cost us around **\$24,000** to upgrade the lot in front of the church and the small section of the parking lot adjacent to the senior care center; the price rises to **\$59,000** if we address the entire lot at St. Anne's by the Senior Center.

Towards that end, we inserted an envelope in our St. Anne Novena mailing which will be sent out next week. Jackie Bruhn will talk about the parking lot during the May 31 Mass at the parish as well. The "pipe dream" is that we can get these donations to pave the lots by the St. Anne Feast Day on July 26!

As we have had to navigate a few major storms this Spring, a couple of parishioners suggested that we check the roofs of our buildings to see if the storms had caused any damage to what we have. I thank Mr. Rafael Hernandez for coming down to St. Patrick's and St. Anne's to clean out our gutters, install "leaf guards" on our gutters and to trim a few trees that were hanging over our buildings.

In the course of these inspections, we came to find out that at St. Anne's, a corner of our building has endured a bit of damage from what I have been told resulted from "leaky drains" that got under the outside bricks of the church over the last decade or so and is in desperate need of repair. So far, the estimates coming in for the damage are just under \$10,000; this work needs to be done to preserve our church. If anyone can help us offset the cost of the repairs, please contact the parish office.

St. Anne's Catholic Church and the Shrine of St. Anne are in need of accessible parking for the handicapped and a safer lot for all who visit. We are asking for your support as we work toward our fundraising goal of \$60,000 to provide a safer smoother and more welcoming space for our parish family visitors and community events. Every contribution brings us closer to completing this important improvement for our church home. Thank you for your generosity, prayers and continued support of our parish mission.

All for Jesus

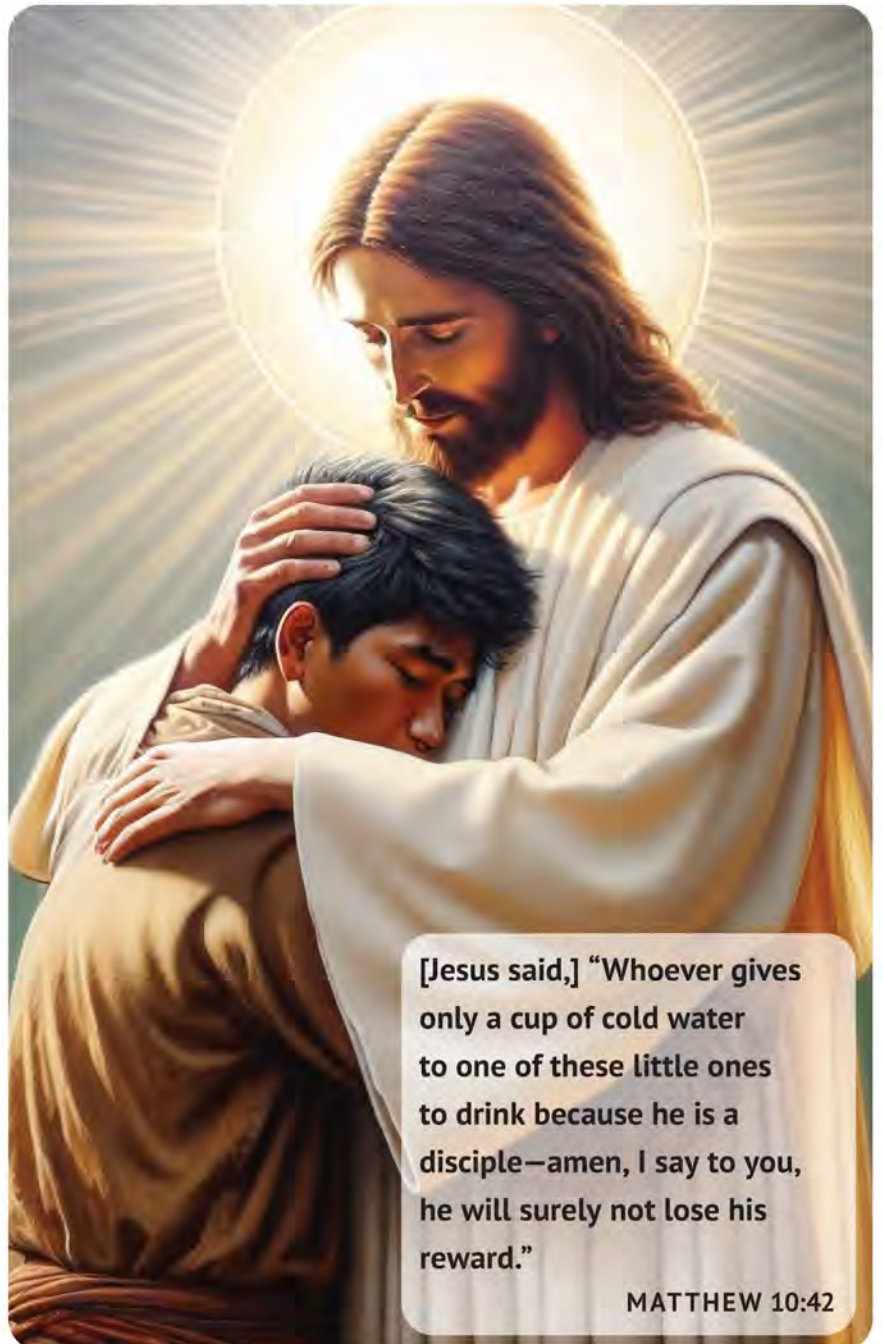
Today's gospel passage is challenging. If anyone other than Jesus told you that if you love your own family "more than me," you are "not worthy of me," you would laugh in their face! Or, is this what scholars call a "semitism"—a culturally conditioned exaggeration used for effect? What about you are "not worthy of me" unless you "take up [your] cross and follow me," or "whoever finds his life will lose it"? Does Jesus mean these literally, or are these metaphors? And what is "a prophet's reward"?

A friend of mine tried an experiment. He took the Gospel of Matthew and read it through from start to finish as if he had never seen it before. He was astonished! Jesus was serious. He meant it—all of it. Try it yourself without looking for loopholes.

The key in the reading today is "for my sake." The standard, the rule, that absolute mark is "me," that is, Jesus himself, only Jesus, always Jesus. And Jesus sets that mark very high. Take up your cross? Jesus was abandoned on the cross. Jesus gave away his Mother from the cross. Jesus lost his life on the cross. But he found that life: resurrection! That is "a prophet's reward," is it not?

I have to love Jesus' promise, a special "reward" for just sharing "a cup of cold water" with a "little one."

It reminds me of Honduras, where I live. Here, a cup of cold water can make the difference between life and death. And that is no exaggeration! ●

**Have I read a whole gospel
from start to finish?**

Dear Padre,

I raised my children in the faith, but two of them left the Church to embrace another denomination, and two others, although still Catholic, have not committed to regular church attendance. I worry about their salvation.

Your experience is not unknown to many Catholic parents. Many mothers and fathers could probably carry on a good conversation with you about their concerns for the faith lives of their children.

The journey of faith has many paths. An individual may think more deeply about the meaning of life or may find religion after a momentous experience or in the process of gathering with a community in which they find support, clarity, shared beliefs, or guidelines for living morally. For those of us who grew up believing, chances are, we were not introduced to religion through logic. Children are brought to church long before they are aware of their need for God. They learn doctrine and attend worship before questions of faith and religion form within them. Passing on the faith is a great gift that parents give, and it will serve these young people well. Your children have the tools to help them find their way, and God continues to be with them. Follow the example of St. Monica and pray for them. Trust this one to God and continue to be a good example. ●

"We are the friendliest church in town."

That sentence or something very similar is the most common statement we've heard in interviews we conducted with church members during consultations. Most people active in a church really do think their church is friendly. These members have relationships and interactions that give them that perceived reality.

But when we interview guests of the same churches, we hear a different story. These guests often think the members are "unfriendly" or "cliquish." They don't have the established relationships members have. They are not familiar with the church facilities. They don't know what to expect.

The church welcome ministry (or whatever your church calls it) has always been important. But the ministry is more important today than it's ever been. Look at six reasons this level of importance has risen.

1. **CHURCH MEMBERS ARE RETURNING TO CHURCH AFTER A LONG ABSENCE.** The pandemic kept them away. Many have returned, but not all have. Some are easing back into church cautiously and slowly. It is critical for the welcome ministry to encourage these returning members to get back into a rhythm and habit of gathering regularly.
2. **MORE NEW GUESTS ARE ARRIVING.** During the quarantine, a number of new residents moved into your community. They have not had an opportunity to visit a church, but they are ready now. For some unchurched people, the angst of the COVID era has them asking questions about God, church, and faith. Some will show up at your church.
3. **CONTEXT HAS CHANGED.** Yes, the world has changed. The local church is a microcosm of some of the contextual changes of our society. Specifically, the ways we greet people in many contexts have changed. Hugs are mostly out. Handshakes are in some places and out in others. The availability of visible sanitizers is necessary in most churches. Those who participate in the welcome ministry are aware of the best ways to greet guests.
4. **FIRST IMPRESSIONS ARE MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER.** Because some of the guests have not been in a church for months, perhaps even a few years, the first few moments they arrive on the church property are critical. They could return repeatedly, or they could decide it's not worth the risk and effort.
5. **FEW CHURCH MEMBERS ARE NATURALLY WELCOMING TO GUESTS.** They naturally gravitate to people they know. They may be uncertain if a person is a guest or a member they don't know. Leaders can exhort church members to be friendly, but the challenge for it to happen will always be there. The welcome ministry fills this void, and the void has been exacerbated during the pandemic.
6. **IT IS BIBLICAL.** While we don't see a formal welcome ministry per se in the Bible, the importance of hospitality is clear and powerful. For example, "When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13). Additionally, Paul's qualifications for church leaders include hospitality (see 1 Timothy 3:2-3).

Your church's welcome ministry has always been important. But it is likely it is more important than ever.
