#### SS. PETER & PAUL

I want to thank Bishop Hicks and the staff of the Joliet Diocese to put enough faith in me so I may serve the Border Town Communities for the next six years. The way the diocese works is to assign a priest to a parish for six years as pastor or administrator and then offer the priest a renewable six years in the parish(es), as he has done. By the time I reach the end of the next six-year term, I will be past the age limit of sixty-five. The way this works in the diocese is that at that point, I will not finish the third term by seventy, so usually the bishop would leave a person like me at the parish until seventy (or possibly until I choose to retire up to the age of eighty, I believe).

As I work a great deal with the retired Vicar General of the Diocese (Rev. Joseph Tapella) whom I also serve at the Diocesan Tribunal Office translating marriage documents from Spanish into English (yet another responsibility of mine), I had him write out for me the role of the administrator at any given parish, according to Canon Law, the rules he and I (as well as any ordained cleric) are obligate to follow in the Church. Fr. Tapella writes...

As an administrator, the priest has all the rights and duties of a pastor according to Canon 540 (of the Code of Canon Law). In Canon 532, the pastor / administrator represents the parish in all juridic affairs (financial / administrative etc.). Canon 537 mandates the parish to have a Finance Council, which is a consultative body to the pastor / administrator carrying out his responsibility for the temporal goods of the parish. The members of the Finance Council have no authority over the pastor / administrator.

Essentially, this means that the bishop has appointed me to represent him at the parishes I serve and that the person to whom I have to report each year is him, through the dean of our area (who currently is Very Rev. Matthew Pratscher from St. John Paul II Church in Kankakee. Each year, Fr. Matt and I have met to discuss how things are going at our respective parishes. We speak of the blessings that we encounter in parish life and the challenges that are set upon us.

Concerning St. Anne's, I have explained to Fr. Matt that we have seen an uptick in the spiritual life of the parish. Thanks to good souls like Trevor Runyon, we have begun to implement Eucharistic Adoration at the parish, which the bishops throughout the world have encouraged us to do. Realizing that the Hispanic Community is the one growing population in the Church (that will represent 50% of all Catholics in the US by 2070). Fr. Matt constantly asks me what we have done to build Hispanic Ministry at our parish. Because of the presence of El Cerrito de Camino y Esperanza in our area, we have a wonderful resource to tap into the on community that very much could save St. Anne's in the next twenty years if we allow this, similarly to what currently is happening at St. Patrick's in Momence. The Viatorians have learned this well, as they have tapped into Hispanic Ministry, both in Hopkins Park and in Kankakee.

All of this is dependent on a willingness to encourage participation with all our cultural groups in the area to join us. Lots of good can happen for the parish and a great future awaits the parish, depending on the willingness of the parishioners to allow others in. I wish to thank those who have done just that and hope / pray that we can build off what we have done in the years ahead.

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# **Bloom Where You Are Planted**

f you could change one aspect of your life, what would that be? Financial instability? Arthritis? Addiction? A disruptive family member? Work's daily grind? Finding love? No doubt the answers are as varied as the people who answer the question.

Though the old poster advises us to "bloom where you are planted," sometimes we can feel as if we've been planted among weeds—the people we've been given, the problems that continually pop up, the conflicts that all too often shut out the peace we seek. Just as Jesus sends disciples into every place he intends to visit, the reality for us may very well be that he sends us into the very lives we live even though we wish we could change them. Where we are is where we've been sent. It is in the lives we have that we work out our salvation, for Jesus said, "The kingdom of God is at hand for you" (Luke 10:9).

St. Paul emphasized how important it is for disciples of Jesus to live out their identity as a new creation. British artist and sculptor Henry Moore made the observation that, in life, it is most important that we give ourselves over to a goal or dream, something so all-consuming that we live it morning, noon, and night. And the most important aspect of it, he said, is that it must be something we cannot possibly accomplish. For the followers of Jesus, it is the lifelong task to bloom where we've been planted.

# Dear Padre,

#### At Mass during the Our Father, should we hold hands, lift our hands up, or keep our hands to ourselves?

Among many ancient religions, it was common to extend one's hands toward heaven while praying. This practice has continued in the Mass, where the rubrics indicate that the priest should extend his hands at certain points, including during the Our Father. The celebrant represents all the people with this gesture. The deacon is expressly forbidden to hold his hands up in prayer. There is no particular gesture assigned to the rest of the congregation. Some may be holding hands, some lifting their hands, some standing with arms crossed.



The variety of postures is not a problem in itself. The problem is when people become distracted or judgmental of others. As a rule of thumb, I suggest doing what the rest of the congregation does. As stated in the "Order of the Mass," written by the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy in 2003, "The people are called as members of an organic whole, not as disparate individuals. A Christian assembly that worships 'with one heart and mind' (Acts 4:32) naturally moves toward and consciously chooses a common posture as a sign of its unity. Such common posture 'both expresses and fosters the intention and spiritual attitude of the participants'" (28). The gestures at Mass are not as important as the essence of the Mass, and part of that essence is our unity in the body of Christ.
