YOUR FEEL-GOOD STORY TODAY ...

On the first day I arrived at St. Patrick's Church in Momence (August 1, 2019), the diocesan brass sent in their personnel to "inspect" the windows of the parish. I was told that the diocese was inspecting windows at every parish around the

diocese, but, in reality, they were only doing it with This US. is because I had a reputation for getting things done without breaking the budget and most often getting outside funds to take care these projects; the diocese still does not understand how

we are able to get these things done. I try to teach people that the three words that serve as the best fundraiser that you could ever have are, "do unto others." At my last parish, we were able to use this mentality to pave the entire parking lot of our church at no cost to the parish and to renovate entire buildings on the cheap. In fact, two city council members purchased a plot of land behind the parking lot at the parish and I paid \$1,000 out of pocket for the "gully" that connected the land to our parking lot.

When I arrived in Hopkins Park, St. Anne and Momence in 2019, I had four houses that looked like "Sanford and Son" on acid that needed to be renovated. Thanks to a whole bunch of wonderful people, we have been able to renovate roofs, build bathrooms, and renovate complete houses under our care for the fraction of the cost that it would normally take.

Earlier this year, Wally Martin (my "house flipper" who does most of my work) told us that it was probably a good time to replace the windows in the St. Patrick Rectory before the tariff prices go up. He

gave us a ridiculously cheap cost of \$11,000 to replace over TWENTY windows in the rectory of St. Patrick's. Thanks to a couple nice donors, we got the money and in July, Wally started changing the windows with his group of workers.


Between this and eradicating St. Patrick's \$330,000 debt over the last four years (pictured is me signing the final check, surrounded by some of the major players at St. Patrick's Church), we have given St. Pat's a fighting chance to persevere for years to come (not to mention an growing Hispanic com-munity that started at ZERO in 2019

is often larger than our other services at the parishes combined!). God bless the good at St. souls St. Patrick's. Anne's and all our benefactors. as well as all of you for all the good work you have done for us in God's name!

I also wish to

thank Antonio Elvir for the repair work he did on the side stairwell of our church. Anthonio and maintenance man Artemio Ojeda are going beyond the call of duty and we are really grateful for their kindness!

As a sidenote... The diocesan brass returned exactly one year later after I arrived in 2019 to so-called "reinspect" the windows. They still wonder how we are able to get things done around here...

R emember this: Jesus said, "one's life does not consist of possessions." But, if not that, what then?

Think back upon your memories: the first warm day of spring, when the fireworks of new life exploded upon you; laughing so hard that your sides hurt, and you and your friends could not stop laughing even to breathe; walking barefoot in the dewy grass; your best friend telling you you're best friends; learning to finally ride a bike no-handed and thinking that you moved up a rung on the ladder of awesomeness; the first time you dared to risk reaching for the hand of someone you discovered you liked more than anyone else; the unbelievable wonder at the birth of your child; making googly faces at a burbling baby, and the baby googling back; your child snuggling into

Dear Padre,

Sometimes after Mass, I go to the late service at a "Bible church" with the rest of my family. Once a month, this church serves communion, but they make it clear that it is only as a memory of Jesus and the Last Supper, and that Jesus is not present at communion. Is it OK to receive this communion?



The Catholic understanding of Holy Communion includes not only the understanding of Communion as the Body and Blood of Christ, but it includes something more. Communion is a statement of belief and a statement of belonging. When Catholics participate in the sacrament, they are identifying with divinity as well as with the community of believers who are joined together in "one mind and in one spirit." It is an act of unity, a real "communion." Even though the Bible church clearly teaches a different theology of communion, it would seem to me that, for a Catholic, the fullest meaning and understanding of Communion is important and worth witnessing to. For this reason, I would refrain from participating in communion at the Bible church. Do so quietly and respectfully, because what is being celebrated is important; it just does not have the full meaning that you understand is necessary.
