The theme for the Advent homilies this year is "A LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS," sharing FIVE stories of faith that illustrate this theme. The First Sunday of Advent's Mass references "The Little Italian Chapel" in Orkney, Scotland. Built by Italian Prisoners of War in the 1940s, this chapel united two vastly different cultures in the world of faith, a friendship that remains to this day. At the end of today's Online Mass, a video on the Chapel is offered for your reflection.

Other reflections during this Season of Advent will include St. Pope John Paul II and the "beggar priest" (Second Sunday of Advent), the story of Gina Petrecca-Novelli and the life of a "Hockey Mom" (Immaculate Conception), the charitable work of Mike & Lidia (Estella) Cronk and their ministry to the poor (Third Sunday of Advent) and the story of Dianne Marcotte and the care for the youth within the Momence Community (Fourth Sunday of Advent).



Will You Notice the Shoot?

oday's first reading from the prophet Isaiah offers a familiar Advent image: the shoot sprouting from the stump of Jesse. The verses immediately preceding speak of God walking through the forest with an ax: "The tall of stature shall be felled, and the lofty ones shall be brought low" (Isaiah 10:33). But now, amidst all the destruction, a tiny sign of new life emerges, and the Spirit of God descends upon it, bearing many gifts—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe, delight.

So often, when we scroll through the news, our attention is captured by violence and war and the "mighty" who make great noise when they fall. "Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees," echoes John the Baptist in today's gospel. If we are looking


for where God's Spirit can be found, however, Isaiah reminds us we will need to look elsewhere. We will need to attend to the quiet, fragile resurrections taking place below the surface when it appears as if all has been lost. If we seek wisdom, understanding, counsel,

strength, knowledge, awe, and delight, we will need to look where the little ones of the earth are found. We must have our eyes open for the shoots.

The gospels emphasize that Jesus was one such little one. Although the glory days of his people seemed to have come to a crashing close, they have not. In him, we glimpse the truth that life is stronger than death. We see that the future has not been erased, no matter how terrible the past. In him, we find our hope.

Reflect-

Are my eyes open to the small signs of God's work in the world, or am I too distracted to notice?



Dear Padre,

Do non-Catholics go to heaven?

Yes, they do, because of the grace of God at work in his people. To suggest otherwise would seem to imply that Catholics somehow have a "golden ticket," or some kind of right that simply does not exist.

The Incarnation of Jesus healed the division between heaven and earth, a division established by the "sin of Adam" and confirmed by our own lives of sin. Through his passion, death, and resurrection, all has been restored to the manner that the Father first envisioned through his Creation. The division was between humanity and divinity, not between religious practices and divinity. Catholics



believe and celebrate that God accepts all people of a good heart and a good spirit. God is not blinded by the labels that sometimes blind his people to the bigger reality.

When Catholics, or people of any religion, proclaim exclusivity and specialness, particularly when it concerns eternal life, all people should be very cautious about what they assume. To assume a certain type of arrogance—to yourself and to your belief and life of faith—that excludes others or separates another as "not one of us" simply has no place in the kingdom of God. •





PREPAREN EL CAMINO

San Juan Bautista aparece hoy cuando el Adviento comienza su segunda semana. Juan, el misterioso consumidor de saltamontes y miel silvestre, hace eco de las palabras del profeta Isaías en su llamado al arrepentimiento en la cercanía del Reino de los cielos. Los ritmos de la vida cristiana son muchas veces confusos. Todos los anos conocemos a Juan Bautista y oímos su llamado al arrepentimiento. Todos los anos lo vemos señalando al que vendrá después de él, al Señor Jesús. Sin embargo, cada año las palabras y las acciones de Juan Bautista hacen eco de nuevo en nuestro corazón, porque hemos caído una y otra vez en antiguas trampas pecaminosas. El Adviento nos da otra oportunidad para alejarnos del camino del pecado y aceptar el modo de vida del Evangelio. TRADTCIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 8 de diciembre, la Iglesia celebra solemnemente la Inmaculada Concepción de Maria. A la vez, la Madre de Jesucristo es honrada en Venezuela bajo la advocación de Nuestra Señora de Coromoto, en Paraguay como Nuestra Señora de Caacupé, en Panamá como Nuestra Señora de La Antigua y en Nicaragua como Nuestra Señora del Viejo.

Esta última advocación tiene distintas historias que relatan su origen. Hay quienes dicen que pertenecía a un viejo ermitaño que viajaba con unos marinos. En cierto punto la imagen no quiso

continuar el viaje y el barco no se movió hasta que se bajó el viejo con ella. Según otro relato, Nuestra Señora del Viejo fue traída a Nicaragua por Francisco de Ahumada, hermano de Teresa de Ávila. Francisco viajaba a América y su santa hermana quiso mandar tres imágenes marianas como regalo a los misioneros religiosos que estaban evangelizando en Guatemala, Perú y Nicaragua. Durante el año 1562, Francisco entrego la imagen de la Purísima a los Franciscanos de Nicaragua en el pueblo de "El Viejo," por lo cual los nicaragüenses han declarado por años que "El viejo nos trajo a la Conchita." Hay que saber que el viejo Francisco tenía 41 años de edad cuando paso por Nicaragua. - Fray Gilberto Cavazos- Glz, OFM, Copyright[©] J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.
