Over my almost thirty years as a priest (even before that!), my youth

ministry years challenged me to pick up a guitar and learn songs that I could sing with the teens at whichever parish I happened to serve. To be honest, I am *lousy* at the guitar – outside of knowing the "Trinity" of chords that serve as the basis for most simple tunes (G-A-D), my limited ability on this

instrument I often utilize at teen retreats or on days of reflection. Once in a blue moon I bring the guitar to Sunday Mass to the sounds of snickers and guffaws from the congregation.

I also came to find out that many of the best sentiments of life I have experienced in my priesthood come from the Christmas Season and Christmas movies and music. Something about this particular feast brings much GOOD out in people, which must be the case when the Hallmark Channel is running Christmas movies in July and Pandora Radio has stations that play Christmas music 24/7/365.

As a challenge to myself, some years ago I set my hand to writing Christmas music for the sake of the faithful that I served at any given parish. I utilize the "Bing Crosby" A-side/B-side approach in the music I write – half the songs are for fun and the other half are based on scriptures or sentiments of the faith.



As a result, on the parish website I included *eight* of those Christmas songs that I simply produced and uploaded for our parishioners and those in the faith. With the help of a record studio in West Chicago, I was able to get help creating these songs and putting them online. When I came to the Border Town Parishes, I turned the songs into simple "music videos" for those who wish to view them.

This type of "Stewardship" is important as well – often we talk about the financial part of stewardship but the "Time" and "Talent" are essential to the faith as well. So many good souls do so many good things at our parishes from cleaning buildings to shoveling walks to praying the rosary to Novenas and other devotions of the faith. I am most grateful this week to Freddy Franco, who assisted two

wedding couples and family grieving the anniversary of a loved one's passing by offering musical skills at these services without cost. God bless all of our volunteers who set the example of faith that model what Christmas is supposed to mean. God bless all of you for yoru contributions to the needy and those in community seeking hope. Please know you are in my prayers!

## **Embracing a Spirituality of Listening**

The most treasured prayer of Jesus' people has long been and remains the Shema: "Hear O Israel, the Lord is God. The Lord is One." Jewish spirituality is grounded not in seeing or touching or tasting, but in hearing. No one exemplifies fidelity to this way of being in the world more than Joseph, as evidenced in today's gospel. Joseph is one who listens to what God's messenger says to him and immediately acts on it. He responds to the call to flee with Mary and Jesus to Egypt. Then, he responds to the call to return home with his family to Israel. As many have noted, Joseph never speaks in Scripture, but he certainly listens, and


he certainly acts on what he hears.

Christmas is perhaps the noisiest season of the year. At gatherings of family and friends with festive music in the background, it often feels as if we are shouting over one another to be heard. It is a season when it can be hard to have deep conversations, even with God. Indeed, it can be such a busy season that sometimes our regular prayer practices fall by the wayside. But, if we do not make space in our daily lives to listen, might we miss messages that are important,

even urgent, for us to hear, as in the case of today's gospel? Messages that require immediate response? What would it look like to carve out a bit of silence in this holiday season, to be like Joseph and reground yourself in a spirituality of listening?

A person who is suffering with a mental illness or disorder, certainly a prerequisite for suicide, may not have the necessary mental freedom to choose something that is understood as grave or mortal. In other words, he or she does not have the necessary requirements for full and free consent of the will.

Not that long ago, suicide was often misunderstood. Thankfully, today we understand the havoc and suffering of mental illness, and that a person can be a victim, even if it might look like he or she is not. The great suffering of those who take their own lives must not be dismissed or discarded. The family members and friends of a person who suffers suicide should also not be judged but should only receive compassion and understanding.
