

St. Patrick's Religious Education Program and Sacramental Programs are the fulfillment of the call of Christ to go out and teach. Our programs use professional teachers and trained catechists, whenever possible, utilizing Diocesan Religious Education programs and resources. Diocesan Retreats for our young people on the Jr. High and High School levels are available to all our students. The National Evangelization Team from St. Paul, Minnesota, offered programs for the last three years on the elementary, Jr. High, and High School level and have been received well by our students and families. Resources, movies, videos and materials from the Joliet Diocesan Religious Education Office are available to all teachers and students for general programming and special areas of interest.

Liturgical preparation is reinforced, and students participate once a month from both the Academy and the public school Religious Education Program in a family mass that is both uplifting and spirited. Joint Academy and C.C.D. Altar Servers Program also support our efforts.

Sacraments are received as a parish; Communion, Confession, and Confirmation are joint programs coordinated by the Parish Religious Education teachers, both in school and C.C.D.

Adult Education programs for parent sacramental preparation are joint ventures involving both school and C.C.D. parents.

Financial maintenance of the program for school and C.C.D. is supported by parish subsidies as is the maintenance of the facilities. We are proud of the dedication of all our teachers, director, and parents in the common effort to teach as Christ. Parish Religious Education Board and School Board monitor the progress and the continued commitment to religious education and the sacramental life of our students. They assist their pastor in his duties to shepherd and teach. We are very grateful for the dedication and the commitment they have shown over the years and are proud of the continuing efforts to provide quality religious education here at St. Patrick's.

St. Patrick Academy parish school is a special effort on the part of our parish to focus on the total Christian education of students and families. Prayer, service, character, and behavior are daily exercise in our student's formation. The Gospel message teaches Christian values and attitudes and are normal lessons in our students routine. The commitment to Christ, the family and neighbor are weekly themes learned by our students in the Academy.

Our school provides a daily hot lunch program for the student. Sports, theater, and public speaking competition are available to all students. Our school is ecumenical in its membership and in its programs. Parents of our Academy students are involved in Market Day, Bingo, Beef Cook-Out, Knights of Columbus, Council of Catholic Women, and serve as Special Ministers, Lectors, Commentators, and Ushers, in order to contribute and support the programs both spiritually and financially. They give much of their time and service.

Catholic Schools are the Good News in Education, and we are proud of the service that our Academy renders to the parish and the church of Joliet. Year after year, we see our graduates excel in area public and parochial high schools. St. Patrick Academy school has been able to maintain and grow in this very special mission of service.

The challenges of our present popular culture and generation make it all the more important to continue our efforts in this area of education.

The first church building for St. Patrick's mission was erected by early Catholic settlers themselves, who hauled the logs and lumber from the timber on the Kankakee River. This building was later replaced by another wooden church which was built under the direction of Rev. Z. P. Birard of St. Anne, who attended Momence for several years.

Rev. A. L. Labrie began the construction of the present church in 1914. The cornerstone was laid on May 8, 1914. Prominent catholics and priests marched in a parade with two bands. It was the most notable Catholic event ever held in Momence. Varnum Parish and Fred Marcotte were the two parade marshals. The first solemn high mass was held in the new church on July 4, 1915, at 10:00 a.m. Miss Catherine Mazur, Mrs. C. A. Violet and Mr. August Rehmer were soloists.

Rev. T. U. Demarais came to St. Patrick Church, sixty years ago, in 1933. His first Baptism was Jean Claire Mackert on July 4, 1933. In September, 1939, he founded Sacred Heart Mission, situated 13 miles southeast of Momence. In December, 1941, with the help of the Holy Name Men of St. Patrick's, he began the building of the church of Sacred Heart. His service to our parish lasted 35 years. We are truly indebted to him for his pastoral zeal in serving the people of God.

On July 4, 1990, St. Patrick's celebrated the dedication of its church and first mass. Former pastors, assistants and parishioners commemorated the dedication with a flag ceremony and a breakfast. Msgr. Halpin, Fr. Dedera, Fr. Burns, Fr. Driscoll, Fr. Heramb, Fr. O'Shea, Fr. Richter, Fr. Settles, and Fr. Taschetta, with parish deacons, Jeff Jacob and Dan Hessling, joined in the prayers and celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the parish and 75th Anniversary of the church building.

For 87 years, St. Patrick Academy has provided a Catholic education to students in Momence. The large school complex and spacious grounds were once home to the Servants of the Sacred Heart of Mary, who operated a boarding and grade school and, until about 27 years ago, a girl's high school. The school is now staffed by lay teachers. The support of the pastor and parishioners has been vital in continuing its strong tradition of religious education.

The value of the dollar certainly has changed in the last 74 years since this collection was published. It is true that our membership has increased. It is true that we have been blessed, in the past, with benefactors who have enabled us to continue our mission because of their generous donations. Stewardship, tithing, and the use of envelopes brings a business approach to faith. We are in God's business. Our buildings, education programs, and services are not for the sake of political or financial reward but are directed to a higher purpose in serving God's people on earth so that we may all obtain God's Kingdom in heaven.

It is our hope that sincere and faithful members of our parish will realize that this mission of ours needs the support, prayers, and financial assistance of everyone. It is not infrequent that some Catholics do not share in the care and the maintenance of their church and programs leaving the burden on 60% of their parishioners. This neglect and lack of accountability is unfortunate and, when confronted, frequently is met with the threat of leaving the church or the excuse of past sins or disagreement in Doctrine.

The compassion of Christ embraces us all, and we will continue to live by His standards, making sure to not look at the speck in our brother's eye before removing the beam in our own. A profound debt of gratitude is owed to all who support this parish in its work, both financially, in service, and in prayer.
