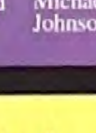


Move Over Michael!

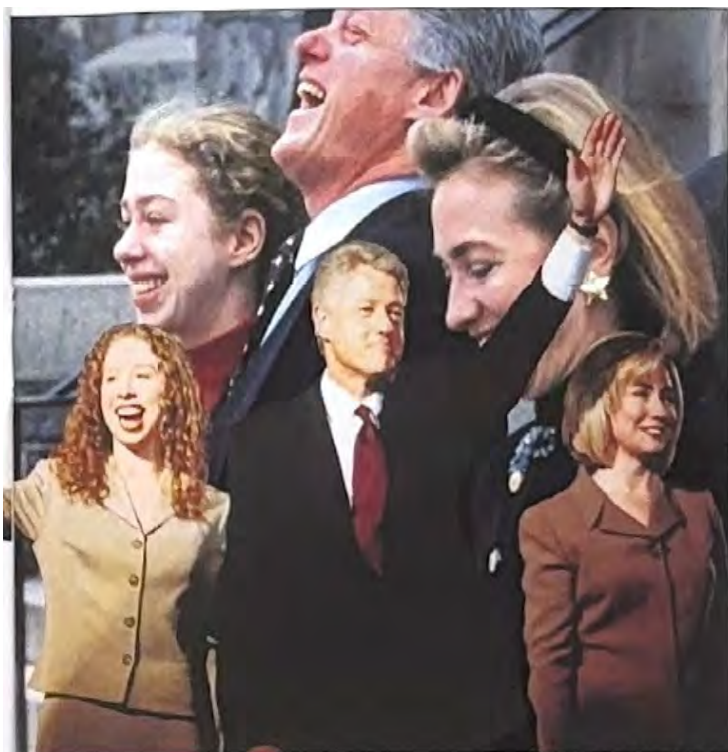
Everything but X-Ray Vision

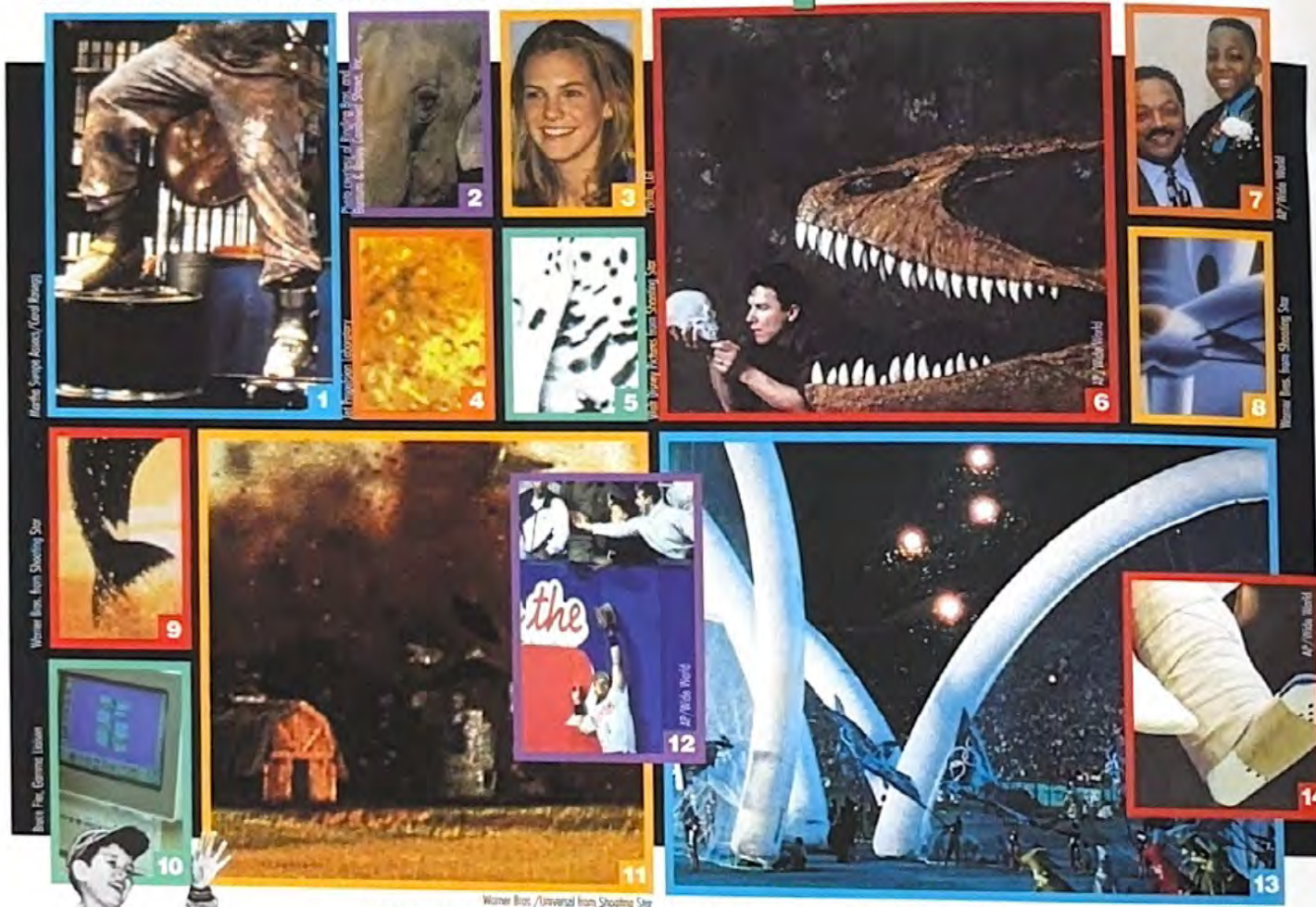
