PROCLAMATION AND RESOLUTION NO. 2026- 4

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING A STATE OF LOCAL
DISASTER EMERGENCY WITHIN NEMAHA COUNTY,
KANSAS.

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2026, significant storm and rain events flooded substantial portions of Nemaha County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2026, in accordance with direction from emergency management officials with the State of Kansas, Chairman Ben Glace of the Nemaha County, Kansas Board of County Commissioners made an emergency declaration that these events constituted a State of Local Disaster Emergency within Nemaha County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, on June 8, 2026, the Board of County Commissioners of Nemaha County, Kansas met and considered during their regularly scheduled meeting whether the events that occurred on June 5, 2026 briefly described above have caused, or eminently threaten to cause widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in disaster proportion within Nemaha County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, it is the finding of the Board of County Commissioners of Nemaha County, Kansas that such conditions briefly referenced above have created obstructions which endanger the health, safety and welfare of persons and property within Nemaha County, Kansas

NOW WHEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED AND RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NEMAHA COUNTY, KANSAS:

Section 1. Declaration of State of Local Disaster Emergency

The Board of County Commissioners hereby resolves, finds and proclaims, in accordance with the authority vested in it under K.S.A. 48-932 that the events occurring on June 5, 2026 briefly described above have created a State of Local Disaster Emergency within Nemaha County, Kansas. Because of the widespread effects of said events, the disaster area covered by this Declaration is the entire area of Nemaha County, Kansas.

Section 2. Powers of the Board.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby resolves, proclaims and declares that it shall have all rights and/or powers to perform such functions as are vested in said Board by and through the provisions of the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act of 1975.

Section 3. Expiration

The Board of County Commissioners hereby resolves, proclaims and declares that the powers of this Proclamation and Resolution shall remain in full force and effect for a period of seven (7) days unless terminated earlier or renewed by consent of the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Proclamation and Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption by the Board of County Commissioners.
