

REGULAR SESSION  
MARCH 9, 2026

The Board of Nemaha County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, March 9, 2026 in the Commissioner’s Room of the Nemaha County Courthouse. The meeting was called to order with Chairman Ben Glace leading the flag salute. Present also were Commissioners Joe Dalinghaus and Jason Koch, and County Clerk Mary Kay Schultejeans recording the minutes.

Ben Glace led those present in an opening prayer to begin the meeting this morning.

The board set the agenda for today’s meeting. Joe Dalinghaus moved to approve the agenda for March 9, 2026 as presented. Jason Koch seconded the motion. The motion carried with all voting aye.

The board reviewed the minutes from the March 2, 2026 meeting. Joe Dalinghaus moved to approve the minutes as presented. Jason Koch seconded the motion. The motion carried with all voting aye.

Chairman Ben Glace called for Open Public Forum to begin at 9:11 am. Todd Grimes came before the board to speak during today’s forum. Chairman Ben Glace ended public forum at 9:34 am.

Commissioners decided to table the Request for Proposal for a new EMS building at this time.

**Road and Bridge/Solid Waste Report:**

Road and Bridge/Solid Waste Supervisor Adam Kuckelman submitted a written report advising the board that:

- the truck drivers are hauling rock on Pennsylvania Ave.
- steel bids will be opened March 16<sup>th</sup> at the meeting at 9:30 am.
- he is requesting oil bids from Ergon and Vance Brothers for the 43 miles of chip and seal road projects this summer. The bids will be opened March 16<sup>th</sup> at the meeting at 9:30 am.
- the recycling baler is having issues and a technician will have to come in to repair it.
- he is not planning to attend this meeting unless specifically requested to do so.

Treasurer Kim Bontrager came before the board to speak to Commissioners about a bad check received recently for property taxes. Commissioners advised Kim that they would talk to County Counselor/County Administrator Austin Parker about this issue later today.

Commissioners took a short break at 10:00 am.

Joe Dalinghaus let Commissioners know that Koch and Company has six trailers that they would like to sell. Commissioners would like Road and Bridge/Solid Waste Supervisor Adam Kuckelman to take a look at the trailers to see if he wants them or not.

Sheriff Rich Vernon came before the board to speak to Commissioners about the placement of speed limit signage on J Road south of the City of Seneca.

The board reviewed vouchers submitted by the different departments to be paid this week. Jason Koch moved to approve the AP warrants to be paid on March 9, 2026 as presented. Joe Dalinghaus seconded the motion. The motion carried with all voting aye.
