Restoring respect through music education in practice: Applying restorative music during the RJ4All youth club in UK

The RJ4All International Institute put the Restoring respect through music education (RRME) into practice during its half-term youth club.

As part of RJ4All's mission to address poverty and provide children and young people with local opportunities, we have introduced the RJ4All Youth clubs. These are held during half-terms and school holidays (Christmas, Easter, and summer breaks). They last for a week and aim to engage children and young people in a variety of activities that target their minds, hearts, and body. Our Youth Clubs are held at the RJ4All Rotherhithe Community Centre and the activities are delivered by our youth workers and a highly qualified team of Personal Trainers, artists, musicians, and project officers.

During the May 2022 half-term youth club we carried out daily music activities that implemented the RRME project using restorative justice music. The results were transformative showing how restorative music can bring down stereotypes, increase cultural awareness and improve community cohesion. 
During the training, the participants found out more about Restorative Justice, as well as best practice examples in Europe. Furthermore, the participants learned more about specific musical activities which they could directly apply to their students to improve social inclusion.

The workshops were held online due to health restrictions but the participants were provided with video examples of the activities, offering them instructions on how to implement the exercises with their students. Find two examples here:

The workshops were attended by teachers, trainers as well as students in education to become teachers, enabling them to improve their skills and knowledge right from the beginning of their teaching journey.

Manisa Social Sciences High School students added color to the event held in the garden of Manisa Special Education Practice School with their fun costumes.

In addition, special students of our school received appreciation for the performances they prepared during the Disability Week (10-16 May 2022, Turkey) celebrated in Turkey and on the day of April 23, National Sovereignty and Children's Day. In addition to the participation of many parents and many disabled children, Yunusemre District Director of National Education and our Branch Manager drew attention to the participation of the event.

The stage performances prepared by the special students of Manisa Special Education Practice School received full marks from the audience. Special students exhibited all their skills with rhythm groups consisting of percussion instruments, modern dance choreographies, rhythmic gymnastics shows, oratorios, and dances accompanied by Turkish-style music performed by fine arts high school students.
