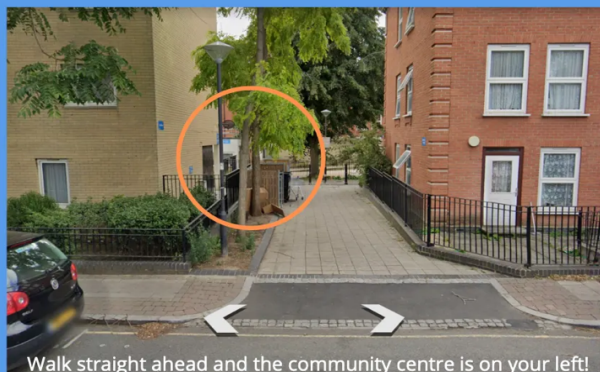

### How to find us!

Address: 30 Plough Way, London, SE16 2LJ



**By Rail/Tube:** The venue is approximately an 8 minute walk from Surrey Quays overground station.

**By Bus:** Buses 199, N199, 47, 108, 188 and 225. Alight at the stop closest to the Royal Courts of Justice in Strand.

**Vehicle:** We are located within a residential area where a car park is located, however spaces are limited and mostly used by residence. If you choose to park, you may also require a parking permit.

#### **From Premier Inn Greenwich to RJ4All Community Centre:**

- Direct buses: 199 or 47 or 255 (around 30 mins journey)
- 6 min bus (177) to New Cross Gate station + 3 min overground train (direction: Highbury & Islington) to Surrey Quas

## NEAREST AIRPORTS

**GATWICK AIRPORT** - is located 28 miles south of London

### Trains

The Gatwick Express is a direct train service into central London. Trains run every 15 minutes between Gatwick Airport's South Terminal and London Victoria Station every day from 5am to 12.30am. The journey time is 30 minutes and the service is non-stop to Victoria station.

Thameslink provides direct trains from Gatwick Airport to Blackfriars, City Thameslink, Farringdon and St Pancras International that leave four times an hour.

Tickets for Gatwick Express £19.90 and Southern and Thameslink are from £10-17.30. For better prices it is best to buy all tickets in advance online at [www.gatwickexpress.com](http://www.gatwickexpress.com) , [www.thameslinkrailway.com](http://www.thameslinkrailway.com) and [www.southernrailway.com](http://www.southernrailway.com)

### Coach

National Express goes to London Victoria amongst other locations to London from £7 single and takes about two hours. Tickets, prices and times can be found online on [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com)

**Taxi** £60-90. Use an authorised black taxi or minicab and confirm prices before departing. Uber is also an option you might use.

**HEATHROW AIRPORT** - is located 20 miles west of London

### Trains

Heathrow Express train is the fastest way to travel into central London. The journey to London Paddington takes about 15 to 20 minutes. Trains to London leave Heathrow Airport from approximately 5am until 12am. It costs £22 single, to book online go to [www.heathrowexpress.com](http://www.heathrowexpress.com)

TfL services run from London Paddington, calling at Ealing Broadway, West Ealing, Hanwell, Southall, Hayes & Harlington and Heathrow Central (Terminals 2, 3, and 4). For Terminal 5, there's a free train transfer service from Heathrow Central.

The TfL Rail journey time is about 25 minutes from Paddington to Heathrow Central. You can use pay as you go Oyster, contactless or train tickets. A single fare is about £3.10 depending on the time you got it and the zones you go through. ### Coach

National Express runs frequent coach services between Heathrow's central bus station and Victoria Coach Station. The journey takes between 40 and 90 minutes, depending on the route. Some services stop en route in Hammersmith or Earl's Court. Services from Heathrow commence at approximately 4.20am and run until 10.20pm. It costs from £6 single, you can book online [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com)

**Taxi** £60-90. Use an authorised black taxi or minicab driver and confirm prices before departing. Uber is also an option you might use

**LUTON AIRPORT** - is located north west of London

### Trains

There are frequent trains to London from Luton Airport Parkway train station. A regular shuttle bus links the airport to Luton Airport Parkway train station in around 10 minutes.

Thameslink operate direct trains to London Bridge, Blackfriars, City Thameslink, Farringdon and St Pancras International. There are six trains leaving every hour and trains once an hour through the night. The journey to London from Luton Airport, including the bus transfer, is roughly 40 minutes.

You can buy return train tickets if you're also planning to get the train to Luton Airport at the end of your trip. A single ticket is about £16.20 from Luton Airport, that includes the shuttle bus price, or it can be paid separately. ### Coach

National Express services depart from bays 4, 5, 6 and 10 outside the airport terminal. There are 75 services between Luton Airport and central London every day. The journey time is roughly one hour and 15 minutes. Pick-up and drop-off points in central London are: Finchley Road, St John's Wood, Marylebone, Portman Square, Golders Green, Victoria Rail Station and Victoria Coach Station. A single ticket is from £9 on [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com)

**Taxi** - £50-60. Use an authorised black taxi or minicab and check prices before departing. Uber is also an option you might use.

**STANSTEAD AIRPORT** - is located north east of London

Trains Stansted Express is the quickest way into Central London. Trains depart from the train station, which is located directly below the airport terminal, every 15 minutes. The journey time to London Liverpool Street is 47 minutes and 36 minutes to Tottenham Hale (to connect to Stratford and the London Underground Victoria Line for the West End). Train services from the airport run at 00,15, 30 and 45 minutes past the hour, with services operating from 5.30 through to 12.30 in the evening. A single fare is £19.90, but prices can vary. ### Coach

National Express operates a 24-hour service to Victoria Coach Station with stops at Golders Green, Finchley Road, St John's Wood, Baker Street and Marble Arch. A second service stops at Liverpool Street via Stratford, Whitechapel, Shoreditch, Bethnal Green, Mile End and Bow. There are several coaches an hour during the day. Prices start from £8 (plus £1 booking fee) for a single ticket. To book a ticket go to [www.nationalexpress.com](http://www.nationalexpress.com)

**Taxi** - £40-50. Use an authorised black taxi or minicab and check prices before departing. Uber is also an option you might use.

## EUROSTAR TRAIN

All trains are direct from Paris, Brussels, Lille, Amsterdam, Rotterdam, as well as our connecting destinations in France, Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany, with an easy change in either Paris, Lille or Brussels. This option is more expensive and prices vary a lot depending on your departure destination and time, but it is hassle free and you arrive at the city centre at St Pancras International. ## ABOUT LONDON

London city is the capital of the United Kingdom. It is among the oldest of the world's great cities, its history spanning nearly two millennia and one of the most cosmopolitan. By far Britain's largest metropolis, it is also the country's economic, transportation, and cultural centre. London is situated in south-eastern England, lying astride the River Thames some 50 miles (80 km) upstream from its estuary on the North Sea. The population including Greater London is 8,173,947. Modern London has the equable climate of South East England, with mild winters and temperate summers.

July is one of the warmest months to visit London... fingers crossed the weather will be on our side, for you to have some time to enjoy the city in the sunshine! Below are some of its top attractions that you can check out during your stay here. Enjoy 😊

## GETTING AROUND THE CITY

Like many cities, it can feel hard to navigate all the different areas when you first arrive! For help with navigating all the different public transport available, we recommend the apps: **Google Maps** (particularly for walking) and **City Mapper** (includes the price differences too).

To summarise, London has the following **public transport services, run by Transport For London (TFL)**:

- Buses – *cheapest option, at £1.65*
- Tubes (“The London Underground”)
- Overground Tubes (“The Overground”/“The DLR”)
- Trains

**To use these TFL services, you can simply “tap in” - tapping your contactless debit/credit card on the yellow reader.** This is generally the most common & cheapest option. Make sure you always use the same card, and you'll only be charged for the journeys you made that day – usually a maximum of £7-8.

Or, you can purchase a **daily Travelcard** – this gives you unlimited travel on all TFL services, for £14.40.

To note:

- For **buses**, you “tap in” (tapping your contactless debit/credit card or showing your ticket) just once, when you get on the bus
- For all **Tubes & Trains**, try to remember to “tap in” when you go through the barriers to enter AND when you leave

## TOP PLACES TO VISIT IN LONDON

### LONDON EYE



Gain admission to one of London’s top attractions by booking your London Eye ticket in advance. <https://www.londoneye.com/tickets-and-prices/> The Lastminute.com London Eye reaches a height of 443 feet (135 meters), and when riding in the large, air-conditioned capsule, you get clear views of landmarks including Big Ben, St. Paul’s Cathedral, and Buckingham Palace. Your ticket includes entrance to the companion 4D Cinema Experience.

## SOUTH BANK



South Bank is a beautiful riverside stretch at the heart of Central London. From theatre, exhibitions, free events, concerts, shopping, drinking and dining, South Bank offers something for everyone. Founded in 1753, the British Museum in Bloomsbury has a collection covering two million years of history. Showcasing human knowledge in all forms, it was the world's first public museum of its kind and attracts more than six million visitors each year. The British Museum is **free** to enter and includes access to its permanent galleries. Special exhibitions usually require a fee.
