URGENT INFORMATION

- All keynote speakers and workshop presenters must **register** for the conference as soon as possible and no later than Tuesday 11 Jan. This is also the register we will be using to communicate with conference delegates.
- If you have not sent your Biography, Abstract and title of your presentation, this must reach us by **Wednesday 12 January** (rjconference@rj4all.org).
- The book of abstracts will be published a week before the conference and circulated to all delegates.
- All speakers and workshop presenters will shortly be sent a **PowerPoint template** to use to create their presentations. All presentations from keynote speakers and workshop presenters must be sent to <u>rjconference@rj4all.org</u> by the 14th of January 2022.
- The event will be held over two days. You are presenting on the 24th and you are very welcome to also attend the 25th of January.
- Registration starts at 9:00 and the conference will start at 9:30 and finish at 16:00. Please ensure you arrive promptly.

AUDIENCE

We can predict that there will be a wide range of delegates including criminal justice practitioners (e.g., mediators, lawyers, and probation officers), civil servants (e.g., managers of criminal justice services, probation managers), students, users (victims, refugee, asylum-seeking and migrant women), academia and the third sector. Whilst the majority of the audience will have a relatively high degree of knowledge of the issues discussed, you will need to consider that a small minority might not. Additionally, as there will be international delegates, please refrain from nationally specific language and acronyms. We are expecting around 70 delegates per conference day.

The conference is titled Pandemic no More: Overcoming gender-based violence, exclusion, and mental health challenges. The theme is centred on the impact of the world experiencing one of the most devastating pandemics, causing multiple consequences for our health, social justice, and educational systems. As we get to grips with COVID19's aftermath and how we can support our communities in the years to come, this international conference brings together some of the world's leaders to provide evidence-based solutions on four over lapping challenges:

- Gender-based violence in the context of young people
- Mental health, restorative art, and violence •
- Migrants' integration and community cohesion
- Racism, antisemitism and hate crimes ٠

The first day will cover topics around youth and gender based violence, hate crimes, education, youth work and challenges especially in the context of COVID19. - All keynote speakers will have a timeslot lasting for either 20 or 30 minutes (to see how long each key speaker's individual slots lasts and when, please visit <u>here</u> where you will find the full agenda for the conference on the 24th of January 2022)
- Keynote speakers' presentations will be followed by a 10-minute Q&A where keynote speakers will be asked questions by the audience. The chair of the event will moderate the questions.
- There will be two breaks; one at 11:00-11:30: Coffee & networking and the other at 12:30-13:00: Lunch and networking.
- If using a power point, please ensure you send it before the deadline as we will not be able to upload it on the day.
- > Please ensure your presentation title and abstract reaches us before the deadline.

Information for workshop presenters & workshop chairs

- Before presenting a workshop, all workshop presenters must fill in the call for abstracts form which can be found <u>here</u> if it has not been done already
- There will be four workshops, workshops 1 and 2 will take place from 11:30 to 12:30 and workshops 3 and 4 will take place from 13:30 to 14:30.
- Each workshop will have a chair; the chair is expected to introduce the workshops and the speakers; more importantly, the chair needs to ensure time keeping. For some workshops, chair may also be presenting a workshop. Please ensure that someone else keeps you on time if presenting.
- Each workshop will last for an hour and we are aiming for 3 workshop presenters per workshop. The time will be divided equally and should include both your presentation and questions from the delegates.
- Each workshop will have a different title related to the day 1 theme of Gender-Based violence, youth and hate crimes:
 - 1. Workshop 1: Erasmus "A chance for Change" project
 - 2. Workshop 2: "It is all about youth"
 - 3. Workshop 3: "The power of education"
 - 4. Workshop 4: "Hate crimes & Community"
