

The objective behind the piloting was to broaden and expand the idea of marginalization and inclusion in educational settings. Children from different backgrounds come to share a geographical space during their growing up years. However, oftentimes unknowingly they feel excluded leading to alienation, frustration, and a sense of detachment from the surrounding. This is in addition to the already social marginalization they have been facing in society and in the family. The goal was to provide a safe space to these young minds so that from a very early age they are able to inculcate the feeling of self-esteem. This provides them the much-needed confidence empowerment to face the challenges around them.



The primary target group for this e-course was the professionals in the educational setting. Teachers, educators, and professionals working within the education sector and among children are equipped with varieties of methodologies and practical experiences through this course. The practicality of the course lies in its adaptation to different settings based on the socio-cultural needs of the society and community. This leaves much flexibility with the educators and instructors to modify the methodologies accordingly.

This workshop witnessed the participation of a wide array of professionals within the country. This, in itself, was an inclusive ground to experiment with the available theories. Participants were enthusiastic and were willing to share their anecdotes and experiences of working among the most marginalized. They also were able to share their ideas of modifying the training as per their requirements within the community. Participants received several ideas which were further enriched through collaboration and exchange of knowledge among them.

The trainers and facilitators were trained professionals in the field who created a lively atmosphere during the course of the training. Exercises, individual and group singing, videos from different countries were a regular part of the modules to make it more participatory. Overall it was an engaging session for all.

After the completion of face-to-face training, an evaluation was conducted.

Workshop in Spain

After researching and developing appropriate and effective activities, the RRME partnership has started the workshops for the RRME course in December 2021. The workshops cover topics like

Introducing music activities for social inclusion

During the last months, the Center for Social Innovation disseminated RRME at Schools and also piloted the Face to Face Training to teachers, focusing on the fact that music activities based on the values of Restorative Justice can be applied during the lessons and improve students' inclusion in the classroom. The educators were interested in the material and the relevant best practices that are already applied in Cyprus.

Internally, on December 16th CSI hosted the first hybrid Transnational Partner Meeting in Cyprus. The consortium had the chance to report their progress and set new tasks and goals regarding the project.

Face to face pilot training and E-course implementation in Turkey

Manisa Özel Eğitim Uygulama Okulu III. Kademe, has made all the necessary preparations for the pilot implementation event to be held on January 7, 2022. A total number of 36 participants were in attendance. All the networking activities required to carry out our RRME face-to-face training including the distribution of all visibility products and gifts containing the project logo and information to the participants were carried out at the provincial level. Although we could not host more participants, all music teachers working in Manisa were informed about our piloting event.

Our institution also provided information about RRME E-course to people who could not find the opportunity to participate in the RRME face-to-face training program. So far, 30 people have completed the RRME E-course and obtained CPD accredited certificates.

Realized Event

The "Restoring Respect through Music Education" (RRME) pilot event was held in Manisa Anemon Hotel on January 07, 2022, hosted by "Manisa Özel Eğitim Uygulama Okulu III. Kademe". Our music teachers/trainers, administrations of schools, and district ministry of education from Manisa and Izmir cities were present and participated in the event.

Also, pre-and post-evaluation surveys were conducted, tests were completed for the continuous professional development certification (CPD) and certificates were issued, and the study was concluded with dinner after group photoshoots.

Training Handbook for educators

This Training Handbook has been developed by the consortium of the Erasmus+ project "Restoring Respect through Music Education" (RRME). It is addressed to educators working in schools and informal educational settings. It introduces the concept of restorative justice and aims to provide them with new tools in order to support pupils and young people to become young music mentors focusing on addressing social marginalisation. The Handbook is structured around 5 modules (an introduction module and 4 educational training content modules). Each Module is composed of 2-3 Units. A module involves 4-5 hours of learning. The programme is accredited with Continuing Professional Development (CPD) status (minimum 20 CPD learning points – Intermediate level) by the RJ4All International Institute. It is supplemented by the CPD certified E-course Restoring Respect through Music Education: Addressing social marginalisation. This has been translated into Greek, Spanish, Turkish and German

This e-book is produced as part of the Erasmus+ funded project "Restoring Respect through Music Education" (RRME). The project aims to create a training package to support teachers and other educators in their efforts to enhance the resilience of their pupils when it comes to diversity and community cohesion matters. For this reason, each partner of the consortium delivered a desk-based research on national resources in order to briefly present integration methods for disadvantaged pupils upon the restorative justice values of power-sharing, equality, dignity including policies, legislations, good practices, etc., and to identify gaps and issues in existing practices, focusing on educators' training. This ebook is the result of this research effort.
