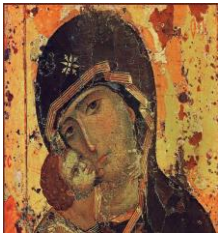

Spiritual Reflection

The celebration of Holy Mass is at the very heart of our Christmastide festivities it allows us to pause, to be still, and to acknowledge the very great gift that God has given us through the birth of His Son at Bethlehem. This gift, the Word made flesh, God becoming man, is the beginning of a wonderful new relationship between our heavenly Father and us. Through the Incarnation, the process of our redemption is begun. The image of the infant Christ, together with Mary and Joseph, is a powerful image. It touches our hearts. It is a sign of hope. This is a special because it helps to renew our sense of hope in the love of God. His love, manifested in the coming of his Son in a stable in Bethlehem, brought us salvation and hope in a new life. This season of celebration reminds us to restore that sense of love within our own lives. However, we are not just celebrating some distant historical event of two thousand years ago. No, we are also very importantly celebrating the presence of Christ among us today, here and now. Emmanuel means "God is with us". This should be the absolute focus of our minds. This is the Christmas message. God is with us. May Christ come into our lives and renew in our hearts that love that gave us the Incarnation.
