Internship Program Admissions

Forensic Outpatient Services: Psychology Interns provide individual and group counseling to forensic clients in both an outpatient mental health agency and are offered opportunities to facilitate brief therapy for individuals in community corrections facilities via telehealth. Limitedly, clients may self-refer into services. Clientele may be referred for offense-specific treatment, mental health and/or substance use treatment. Psychology interns may work with male and female clients who have committed sexual offenses and/or domestic violence. Interns need to be open to working with forensic clients in a structured and respectful manner. Interns also conduct forensic psychological evaluations, diagnostic assessments and work closely with referral sources. Services are provided from the office, whether in person or via telehealth.

Applicants are invited for an interviews process where they will meet both with supervisors and with current interns so they can best assess their fit with the program.
