## Internship Program Admissions

**Briefly describe in narrative form important information to assist potential applicants in assessing their likely fit with your program. This description must be consistent with the program's policies on intern selection and practicum and academic preparation requirements:**

Forensic Outpatient Services Track: Psychology Interns provide individual and group counseling to forensic and non forensic clients in both an outpatient mental health agency and in community corrections facilities. Psychology interns work with male and female clients who have committed sexual offenses, as well as working with male and female domestic violence perpetrators. Interns need to be open to working with forensic clients in a structured and respectful manner. Interns also conduct forensic psychological evaluations and work closely with referral sources.

Adult Inpatient Psychiatric Track: Interns work with both forensic and acute care patients in group, individual, and assessment modalities. Patients include voluntary and involuntary civil status patients, forensic patients adjudicated not guilty by reason of insanity, forensic patients adjudicated incompetent to stand trial -nonrestorable, and forensic patients adjudicated incompetent to stand trial – restorable. Some of the activities the interns participate in are: assessment of newly admitted patients, DBT group, NGRI groups, competency restoration services, SAMI-oriented services, illness management and recovery groups and psychological assessment.

Corrections Track: Interns train at two prison locations: a medium and minimum security male prison and a minimum security female prison where they offer individual and group treatment, trauma-based care, psychological evaluations, and crisis intervention.

Applicants are invited for an interviews process where they will meet both with supervisors and with current interns so they can best assess their fit with the program.
