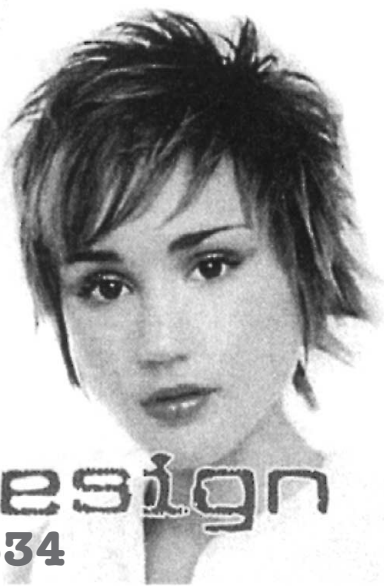

As an Adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals she has adjudicated across the UK and abroad. In 2011 she was honoured to be created one of the first Fellows of the Federation and she is currently Chair of the Fellows.

She has researched into the Practice of Performance and the results have been disseminated across a European Consortium of Conservatoires.

She is an experienced Conductor and has run Choral workshops and courses. She is currently Deputy Music Director of the Harrogate Choral Society.

She is so looking forward to being back at the Camborne Festival.

THE MENIN GATE PRIZE

The Menin Gate Prize of £100 is awarded annually to the Best Young Brass Instrumentalist (including percussion) taking part in Camborne Music Festival.

The adjudicator will award this prize at the festival after listening to the brass and percussion classes.

Cornwall is renowned for its brass bands and we are proud to encourage young people to continue keeping this tradition alive!

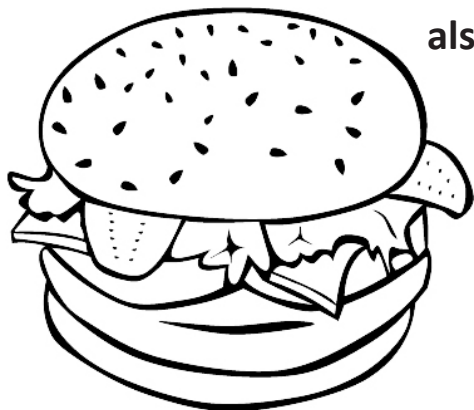

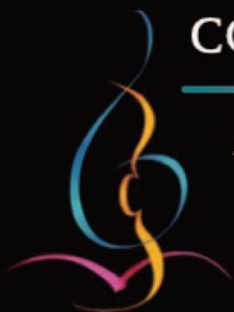
