# The Fr. Kouris Korner

STAY AND PRAY

May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2026 | The Ascension of the Lord

*"Every action you take is a vote for the type of person you wish to become. No single instance will transform your beliefs, but as the votes build up, so does the evidence of your new identity."*  
James Clear, Atomic Habits

With the current OCIA season coming to a close until August, I had a chance to breathe ever since the busy season of Lent. As a first year priest, it does come at you fast and it was a good marathon until the season of Easter began. Having some extra time now, I asked myself what I could do for that time and the best answer in prayer was to do some recollection over my goals.

I knew coming into my first year of priesthood, there are still habits and goals I wish to achieve as a human being whether it's bettering my prayer life, managing my time off in healthy ways, or learning more about the Faith. So this time of Easter has been good to just evaluate myself, what things I do that I like or things that I am doing that I am not too pleased about.

One habit I wanted to seriously correct was having a consistent time for my daily prayer. In the seminary, men are eventually asked to pray one full hour each day. That is a great challenge! In my first year, we started with praying just for 30 minutes a day. Though this seemed more manageable, it was still a challenge to find that time each day and when I did find that time, not fill it with distractions. Eventually, I got into the habit of praying consistently every day and began practicing silence with the Lord.

The key lesson I learned in seminary was that Prayer is not an activity, but a relationship that we enter into. By spending time with God, we are building a relationship with our God, with our Savior. Like how you and I can have a relationship and get to know each other, our God is the same. The major difference between us and God is that God has way more things to share other than just his likes and dislikes. He shows us the plan for our lives and how we can grow more deeply in our Faith.

I love how Christ himself emphasizes the importance of prayer in his life and today in the Acts of the Apostles we hear for Ascension: "While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but **to wait for 'the promise of the Father...'**" (Acts 1:4 NABRE). He does not ask the Apostles to immediately convert the world, but rather to wait and pray for the Holy Spirit to strengthen them. They need to receive a very special Gift from the Father, the Holy Spirit. In this, their relationship with God, they are able to do wonderful things after Pentecost.



To us priests, this relationship is non-negotiable. If we forgo our daily prayer time with God, we risk operating our vocation as if it were some sort of career that depends all on us. Whenever I miss my daily prayer, the day is completely off. I am too focused on myself and my connection to God weakens. When I exited seminary, I had to design and claim a new schedule because the life of a seminarian and the life of a parish priest are very different. Hence I had to do whatever I needed to do to make sure this time of prayer is set and consistent.

Are you building your relationship with God outside of Mass? Is your prayer a "non-negotiable" aspect in your in life? I hope it is, because as Christians, we have every reason to spend time with God but we often tell ourselves it isn't possible given our schedule. If that is the case, then we need to redesign our schedule and claim that small set time each day to be with the Lord, otherwise we will not grow at all in the spiritual life.

# WAYS TO GIVE

HELP US TO MEET OUR CSA GOAL IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

## CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

## SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

## LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

## BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

## IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

## MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

## RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Holy Family Parish may be designated as the beneficiary under a donor's qualified retirement plan benefits, including IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, and Keogh (HR-10) plans. Retirement benefits may be the most tax-efficient way to make a gift to the parish.
