MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS 17-45

June 21st, 2026 | 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time

If you have read up to the end of this first chapter, you might have been really bored or very interested. Why? Because this first major chapter of **Magnifica Humanitas** is on the history of the social doctrine of the Church. Why does Pope Leo spend 27 chapters talking about history?

Why study history at all? Simply put, to know the past is to know the present in order to shape the future. If we know what our ancestors have done or failed to do, we may learn and grow from that knowledge. The Magisterium is an ongoing process of developing doctrine through its dialogue with the world and its situations (MH 24). Social doctrine has been developing since the time of the Gospel when Christ valued the lives of the poor and the outcast.

I found it extremely cool how several popes have written on the anniversary of Leo XIII's **Reverum Novarum**. Our current Pope Leo notes that throughout these last years, while things have changed from the 1890s, two things remain: "the primacy of human labor over any mindset focused solely on finance or productivity...and the inseparable link between proclaiming the Gospel and pursuing a more and just social order" (MH 30). The Gospel demands that labor should not be abused for profit.

Since 1891, Pope Pius XI wrote on the 40th anniversary of the document, **Quadragesimo Anno**, to decentralize the economic power in the possession of the few during the Great Depression and proposed the teaching of Subsidiarity (MH 31). Pope St. Paul VI, on the 80th anniversary, wrote **Octogesima Adveniens** which challenged a post-industrial society that if people are left out of the development that benefits human dignity, then Christianity fails to live a "theoretical proclamation of peace" (MH 36).

Pope St. John Paul II wrote TWO documents on Leo XIII's document. On the 90th Anniversary, he wrote **Laborem Exercens** to examine the purpose of work. "Work is...a fundamental good for the person, a principle of economic activity and the key to the entire societal question" (MH 37). A lot

of young people I know today do not see work as the previous Holy Father had suggested due to today's economic circumstances. Ten years later, **Centesimus Annus** came out for the 100th anniversary to reflect on the collapse of the Soviet system (something that John Paul II experienced) and the rise of markets (MH 39).

Certainly there are other popes who wrote on the social doctrine of the Church during these years: Pius XII during WWII, John XXIII on the unification of the people and state, Vatican II on marriage, family, and religious freedom, Benedict XVI on Globalization, and Francis on Synodality and Ecology. All of these Pope Leo XIV mentions. If any of these topics or the ones mentioned beforehand interest you, might I suggest you look into those documents and see what the Church had to say on these matters? They are spoken about chronologically in this document.

Pope Leo, in this first chapter, wants to remind us how this social doctrine has greatly developed in this past century through his predecessors and reminds us what the Church has confronted. In my own reading, I have found this section to be fascinating as some of these encyclicals of the past make me want to dive more into them and see the wisdom of previous pontificates. They make up together a very organic magisterium that addresses the needs of the world, pope by pope.

If you are finding this series interesting or enjoyable, I want to personally invite you to our next Fortify session tomorrow night. Fr. Nate and I will be discussing this document in greater detail and the role of AI in the world and the Church. Otherwise, we'll be back next week for Chapter Two, paragraphs 46-89.

WAYS TO GIVE

HELP US TO MEET OUR CSA GOAL IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Holy Family Parish may be designated as the beneficiary under a donor's qualified retirement plan benefits, including IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, and Keogh (HR-10) plans. Retirement benefits may be the most tax-efficient way to make a gift to the parish.
