



MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS 46-89

June 28th, 2026 | 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Chapter two of **Magnifica Humanitas** is an overview of the Church's Social Doctrine. As Pope Leo laid out the history of the previous popes and the new things of their times that the Church had to address, so now Leo wants to use the same principles that helped shaped the last one-hundred years to speak into the new things of our time. With limited space, I can only speak a few.

Starting with the most foundational principle of Catholic Social Teaching is the **Dignity of the Human Person**. Everyone is created for relationship with God. "Human dignity does not depend on a person's abilities, wealth or position in life, nor on the right or wrong choices made; instead, it is a gift that precedes and transcends each person, endowed by God as an expression of his unfailing love (MH 50)." Because of this, everyone possesses rights that grant them that dignity and must never be taken away. The Church says these are inviolable, universal, and inalienable (MH 55).

In our world today, Leo notes that as technological advances have moved so fast, our own recognition of dignity in people starts to become more forgotten. Progress becomes a goal and the means justify the end to some people. And as people move away from an awareness of the dignity of each human being, this can remove certain rights for people for the sake of that progress (MH 56).

Because this foundation can be forgotten, the next principles in the document will fall away as a result. For one, the **pursuit of the common good** will be forgotten. Quoting Vatican II, Leo states the common good "consists in 'the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily'" (MH 60).

It is a principle that allows equity and justice for all people so that they can achieve that relationship with God and dwell in society. It is not something only a few with power must uphold, rather everyone has a role to play in society for the common good. We all have a shared vision,

one that does not neglect any human being no matter how weak they might be (MH 62).

To achieve a greater common good, a higher power must use its resources for the benefit of the people. This is the principle of **Subsidiarity**. We have seen in history how governments can be corrupt when it abuses its power for the sake of societal gain. Communism has shown us how dignity is stripped away and identity is found to be a cog in a machine. Individuals, families, and communities must not be overpowered by the authorities (MH 68).

In the case of the digital age, the higher authority is not the government but rather those who are the technological actors that are pushing the boundaries of AI and its companions (MH 71). The power of AI is really in the hands of the few and that can be dangerous if the actors are not morally upright. "We cannot allow a handful of actors to dictate these processes on their own; instead, we must build forms of cooperation that respect the various levels of the global community and make them jointly responsible for the common good (MH 72).

Tech-Billionaires are constantly pushing the AI bubble to its limits. It has been something that truly has forced its way into our lives at a quick pace. The AI boom only really took off in 2022 when ChatGPT was released to the public. Does it benefit the common good or has the unfilteration of AI harmed the dignity of the members of society?

Among a few other principles, these three principles of social teaching are crucial. We will speak more indepth on what effects AI has for our world and some of its risks. Join me next week in paragraphs 90-130.

WAYS TO GIVE

HELP US TO MEET OUR CSA GOAL IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Holy Family Parish may be designated as the beneficiary under a donor's qualified retirement plan benefits, including IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, and Keogh (HR-10) plans. Retirement benefits may be the most tax-efficient way to make a gift to the parish.
