MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS 90-130

Chapters three and four are the real meat of the issue of AI. Here, we see more of how our current topic fits our world rather than looking at history and traditions. A key focus I want to look upon in chapter three is the AI "Arms race" and AI's role in relationships.

With AI, an advancement that only has just gotten to the public in recent years, we may have jumped the gun. Leo calls back to what Pope Francis mentioned in *Laudato Si'* about the rise of the Technocratic Paradigm in which lets efficiency, control, and productivity be the end and leaves humanity to be mere cogs in a machine (MH 92-93). As I mentioned last week about Subsidiarity, the main powers at play here are not the government, but those who are developing and funding AI that must not overpower the common good.

Yet, Leo mentions how whenever we want to look at AI and data on AI, it is probably already outdated (MH 98). Most forms of artificial intelligence are built on Language Learning Models (LLMs) which are frameworks that learn overtime through gathering and sifting through data. This has the implications for several companies to have the best and outperforming AI on the market for users to engage in. At the same time, because it is so new to the public and constantly growing, we barely understand the nature and the role of AI in our world.

Instead of getting rid of it, because, like the automobile, it simply is part of life now, Leo wants us to use the expression of "disarming AI" (MH 110). To disarm is not to destroy it, but to rid it of this "race" to have the biggest and most advanced AI on the market that the Technocratic Paradigm is pushing for. This creates an "anti-human vision" where certainty and total control become gods (MH 112).

Artificial Intelligence must not be thought of as artificial **human** intelligence. No matter how much it is advertised to be a "companion" like that in sci-fi media, it only can mimic how we operate based on data. It does not "undergo experiences,

[does] not possess a body, [does] not feel joy or pain, [does] not mature through relationships... Nor [does it] have a moral conscience..." (MH 99). In fact, has a tendency to be biased to the user, often agreeing rather than being ultimately a voice of reason (MH 102).

It may simulate a human relationship, but it leaves out that real tension and experience of a real person. Not every person is going to have 100% access to information, regularly agree with you, and be available at any time you want. Leo mentions how we can rely on this and "lose the very desire to form genuine human connections" (MH 100). AI eliminates human flaws, which is an underlying goal for certain movements like Transhumanism and Posthumanism (MH 116).

People in a starved world crave and yearn for real connection and AI is a sad place to fill that gap. What fears we may think of in the future are already here as people are "marrying" their AI chatbots because they believe their AI companion "truly understands them." Of course it does, AI will never get mad at you. It is built to be agreeable, any less and we could see something out of the Terminator movies.

Ultimately, **technology** is the extension of human skill (as the Greek root, **Techne**, means skill). As much as the automobile or airplane are extensions of humanity's ability to travel, the book is the extension of humanity's ability to remember information. AI must contribute without eliminating what it means to be human. This severely includes relationships, a core function of living in society, but also prayer since that is relationship with God. If we lose that, we lose that connection to God and let AI control us. We continue in Chapter four next time, paragraphs 131-180.

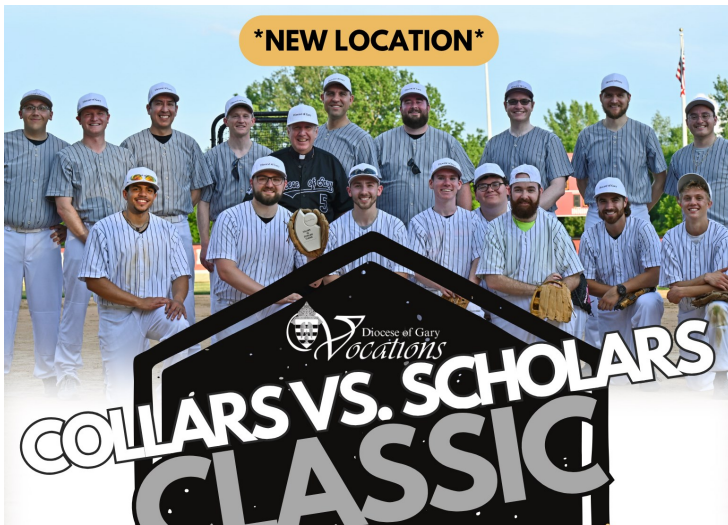

CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

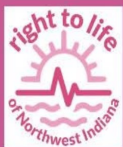
RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

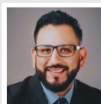

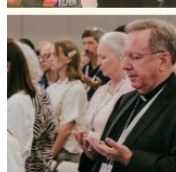
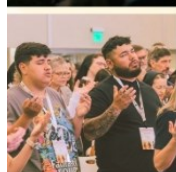
