MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS 131-180

July 12th, 2026 | 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time

If you came to our last Fortify session with Fr. Nate and I, you would have seen a video of me doing 4-5 consecutive backflips. What may seem impressive, and impossible for my abilities and form, is rather fake! I asked AI to create a video to address one of the main issues with AI today: Mis/Disinformation. Not only that, but Leo in chapter four speaks how we are invited by the digital transformation "to rediscover truth as a common good, to protect the dignity of work and to safeguard freedom against all forms of dependence and commercialization" (MH 131).

False or Misinformation has been around for some time now, but AI has the ability to amplify its effects (MH 132). Not only can it be used to make silly content for clicks, propaganda can easily be made and made to look VERY believable. "Those who control digital platforms and means of communication have a considerable ability to affect the collective imagination and to present a particular vision of reality as desirable" (MH 136). With no way to tell, many have fooled by AI.

Regimes happen in the world when truth and facts are distorted and fiction and falsehoods change the narrative. Not to mention how AI can make easy access to violent, inappropriate, and degrading material all at the typing of a single sentence.

AI also attacks the dignity of work. I say dignity because work "is a requirement of the human condition" (MH 149), which helps man take on that God-given command to take care of the garden by working at it (Gen 2:15). It is a "fundamental dimension of the human experience for not only is it a means of sustenance, but it is also a context for expression, relationships and contributing to the community" (MH 154).

We've heard headlines of AI and robotics stealing jobs away and it will continue as everything is more and more automated. It "de-skills" workers and reduces them to mere surveillance (MH 150). The antithesis of work, slavery, finds new forms in the unaccountability of AI.

The means of acquiring materials for devices or microprocessors use adults and children, mostly women, to work in harsh conditions all for the sake of "computational flow." Criminals use AI to assist in human trafficking as well: reducing their victims to "data" or "packages" (MH 173).

Does this all warrant its unrestricted use in our day and age? Certainly not. Our reliance on this technology has been shown in schools to reduce critical thinking and skill mastering. It is extremely saddening to see how many teachers are resenting their careers because of a generation that cannot behave or read and now AI continues to challenge their pedagogies (MH 144).

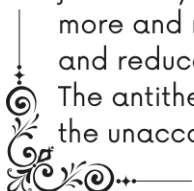
The Family must hold as the first cell of modeling good behavior (which heavily requires parents to not be so dependent on technology) and teaching the basics and fundamentals. There must be a good balance of work and rest within and change to make living conditions more stable (MH 169). The Family is in a rough spot today, but higher authority must do what it can to increase this stability and lessen the grip of AI in the workforce.

At the same time, the issue comes back to the actors. The rapid spread of AI and technological advances are pushed not for the good and common care for society, but to be on the next Forbes list or earn as much money from shareholders as one could. Truth, work, and freedom have all come under attack.

Next week, we will look at the last chapter and conclusion, paragraphs 181-245. I pray you have been learning and reading along with me. It certainly has been an excellent document.

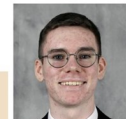

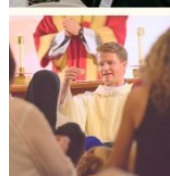

HELP US TO MEET OUR CSA GOAL IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Holy Family Parish may be designated as the beneficiary under a donor's qualified retirement plan benefits, including IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, and Keogh (HR-10) plans. Retirement benefits may be the most tax-efficient way to make a gift to the parish.

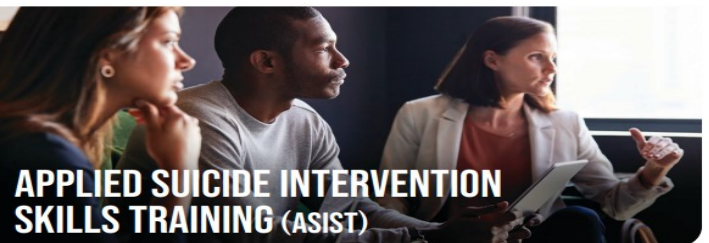

APPLIED SUICIDE INTERVENTION SKILLS TRAINING (ASIST)

What Does ASIST Offer?

LivingWorks ASIST is a two-day, two-trainer, workshop designed for members of all caregiving groups. Family, friends, and other community members may be the first to talk with a person at risk, but have little or no training. ASIST can also provide those in formal helping roles with professional development to ensure that they are prepared to provide suicide first aid help as part of the care they provide.

The emphasis is on teaching suicide first-aid to help a person at risk stay safe and seek further help as needed. Participants learn to use a suicide intervention model to identify persons with thoughts of suicide, seek a shared understanding of reasons for dying and living, develop a safe plan based upon a review of risk, be prepared to do follow-up, and become involved in suicide-safer

community networks. The learning process is based on adult learning principles and highly participatory. Graduated skills development occurs through mini-lectures, facilitated discussions, group simulations, and role plays.
