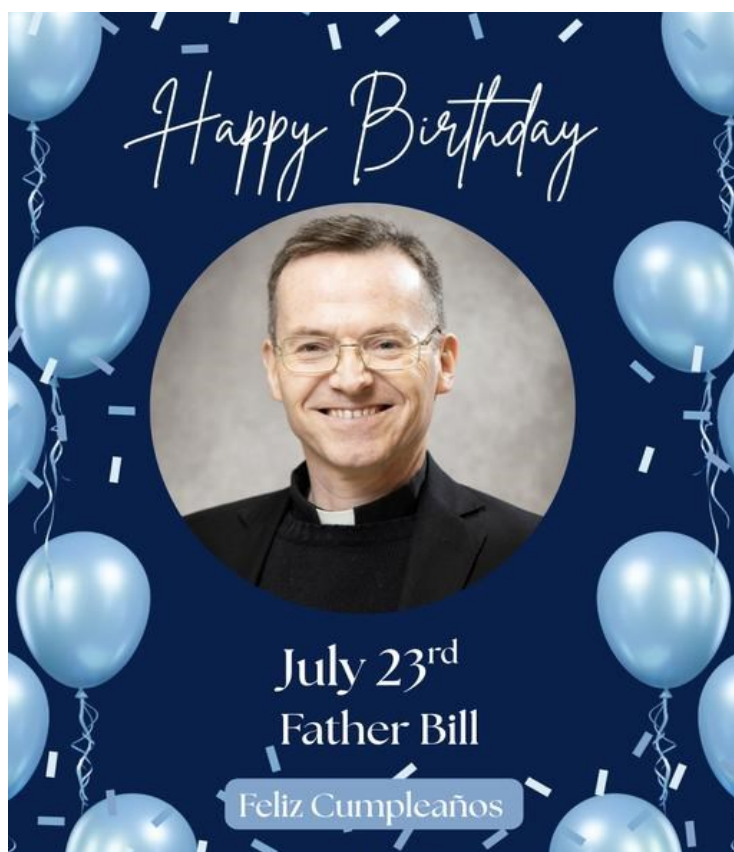

MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS 181-END

We return one more time to a conflicting set of images: a Culture of Power vs a Civilization of Love, Babel vs Jerusalem, inhumanity vs humanity. Chapter five and the conclusion present the two roads we must choose as a world. AI may be an issue that will accelerate current issues and especially warfare (MH 183) but the main issue is the current paradigm shift we've experienced in the last 100 years since the last major world wars.

A Culture of Power exists in our world, one of which desires domination over all things. This culture of power "infiltrates society, changes relationships and behaviors, and grows by normalizing war, pursuing ever-greater military power, taking advantage of the crisis of multilateralism and fueling a false realism that insists that there is no alternative" (MH 188).

War is changing in our day and age. The presence of terrorists groups are not nations looking to merely gain victory over their enemies or oppressors, but rather use war for the means of profit and exercise power (MH 196). AI and technology continually remove personal responsibility (MH 199). In its place is efficiency and convenience: to blow up your enemies without ever moving a finger.

It reminds me how easy it is to be extremely uncharitable online when all we are doing is expressing our anger to a profile picture rather than the actual human in front of us. All this happens due to a crisis in the multilateral system which reduces complex issues into a "us vs them" mentality (MH 202).

In this arises a false realism, as Leo puts it, that makes us believe that war is unfortunately necessary and inevitable because of history's countless examples (MH 205). True justice will never be "achieved" until our enemies are blown to smithereens. Hence we can let religious extremism and identity-based fanaticism with irrational economic policies push out agendas and propaganda which sows fear into the heart of a nation (MH 206).

What are we to do? Fight against this by building a civilization of love. God raises up men and woman at the right times throughout history to lead the charge for change (MH 211). These are the great Saints who stood the test of time and shown us that God's will can be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Everyone is called for the building up of society and everyone has talents that no one else can provide (MH 212). We must cultivate a healthy realism, seeing the world as it is and carving a viable path forward (MH 218). This includes the realm of cyberspace, which must be understood and shaped for the common good (MH 225).

What I see through Leo's words is that the Church has always been the middle ground and pathway between the extreme choices in life. Hence as a Church, we never ally with a political party and call all to repentance towards Jesus Christ, the blueprint of humanity. In the midst of a chaotic world plagued with sin, the Church is a beacon of light, a hospital of sinners for sinners, struggling to do God's will now for the life to come.

I love the ending how Leo calls us to unity through the Eucharist and the "Amen" we say in response to the Sacred Species. "We are brothers and sisters in him. And in Christ, though many and diverse, we are one: In Illo uno unum" (MH 235). In avoiding Babel through our unity, we become like the people of Jerusalem in Nehemiah, being faithful to the truth, to education, to authentic human relationships, to shared responsibility, and to justice and peace (MH 237-241).

I hope you enjoyed reading **Magnifica Humanitas**. It was a fascinating document on the "res novae" of our times. I look forward to more from Pope Leo's writings.

CASH

Cash is one of the easiest ways to make a charitable contribution. A cash contribution can be a check, money order or cashier's check.

SECURITIES

A gift of securities may be given so that the donor receives a tax deduction equal to the fair market value of the donated assets while avoiding capital gains tax on the donated assets. Holy Family Parish will work with you to facilitate the donation of both marketable and closely held securities.

LIFE INSURANCE

Life insurance is an easy way to make a significant contribution. You may give a policy that is no longer needed, take out a new policy, or name the Holy Family Parish as a beneficiary of an existing policy. Direct the proceeds, cash value of policy, or any portion of it to benefit your parish.

BEQUEST

By instructing a bequest in your will, you can specify an amount or percentage from your estate naming Holy Family Parish as a permanent beneficiary.

IRA CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Using a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified organization, such as Holy Family Parish. It is only available to IRAs and individuals who have reached a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age, currently 73 years old. Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your RMD requirement and reduces the taxable amount of your IRA distribution. This lowers both your adjusted gross income and taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability.

MEMORIAL GIFTS

Making a donation in memory of someone special reflects your desire to make a lasting impact on the lives of others, just as your honoree has done. You may also include the desire for memorial gifts to be made in your name as part of your final plans. You may choose to designate memorial gifts for a particular purpose of your choice at Holy Family.

RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

Holy Family Parish may be designated as the beneficiary under a donor's qualified retirement plan benefits, including IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, and Keogh (HR-10) plans. Retirement benefits may be the most tax-efficient way to make a gift to the parish.
