What can you do to participate in this process? Several things:

- 1. Choose to run for a seat on the board. To do so, call Kaye at the Eaglewood Office 694-6942, to submit your name to our ballot.
- 2. Return your proxy to the Eaglewood Office via mail or drop off in person. We must have 10% of our proxies filled in and returned in order to conduct official business at the Annual Meeting.
- 3. Participate in early voting at the Eaglewood Office or attend the Annual Meeting in person to vote for the new board of directors.

We're also looking at a meet-and-greet on **Saturday, May 4th** with some refreshments. It will be a chance to meet the current board members and hopefully those that are on the ballot as well.

We will be hiring spring clean-up crew again and applications will be accepted at the Eaglewood Office as of **May 1**st. Applications can be found on the Eaglewood website (eaglewoodassn.com) under the Documents tab or can be picked up at the Eaglewood office. Youths 14 years of age and older are welcome to apply.

I'm hoping for a warmer summer this year, or at least one with less rain. Only time will tell.

HOA Dues Increase

No doubt many of you have heard or read that dues are increasing. The decision to raise dues is not an easy one for any board of directors to make, and this time was no exception.

After reviewing the Long-Range Maintenance Plan recommended by a trusted engineering firm, however, it was very apparent that a dues increase would be needed to budget for the recommended replacement and upgrading of infrastructure within Eaglewood.

A letter with detailed information will be mailed to all owners on May 1st and the dues increase of \$10 per month will go into effect with the July 2024 billing. There will be two open board meetings, the Annual Meeting on May 13th and on July 8th during which questions can be addressed.

Please make a note to update your auto-pay starting with the July dues payment.

Facebook is great for getting information out to the community quickly. Unfortunately, it can also be a source of misinformation when residents post their assumptions in private Facebook groups.

The Eaglewood website is an underutilized resource for accurate information. Take a few minutes to check it out and you will find:

- •Contact information for both the Office Manager, Kaye, and the Operations Manager, Seth. Kaye has managed the office for more than ten years, has extensive knowledge of the HOA and is happy to help residents' problem solve. Seth is very approachable and an email about a problem or concern will receive a quick response.
- •The Eaglewood story.
- •Names of the members of your Board of Directors, their position on the board and their term expiration date, board meeting schedule and past meeting minutes.
- Current and past issues of the Eaglewood Newsletter.
- •Payment portal, dues timeline, and the policy that informs the dues timeline.
- •Forms to submit to the Design Committee for approval of outdoor changes such as tree removal, fence construction/paint/stain, driveway extension/repair, changes to exterior of your home, etc.
- •Common area service request form.
- •Documents: Eaglewood PC&R's, Bylaws, Design Committee Rules, Snow Removal Map, Spring Clean Up Crew application, etc.
- •Election information, including bios of candidates and explanation of the voting process.
- •Coming Soon! Information on the Committees and their purposes.

The Design Committee

It's 6:15pm on a Monday evening and a small group of 6 people has gathered at the Eaglewood Office. Some have already put in a full day at work and have rushed to arrive on time. Some have repeated this monthly routine for more than 8 years.

This is a meeting of the Design Committee, charged with ensuring that properties within our neighborhood are maintained to preserve property values.

Chaired by BOD member Anna Tapps, the purpose of the meeting is to review photos and notes from a recent drive-through inspection conducted by employees of Roy Briley Association Management, and to review and approve applications for outdoor changes to resident's homes and yards.

The Committee strives for fairness and there can be lively discussions among committee members trying to come to consensus.

The Design Committee endeavors to preserve the original intent of the developers; to create a carefully planned subdivision which would provide an attractive place to live and conserve the natural beauty and character of the area.

Eaglewood was developed with strict standards for home design and color as well as landscaping. The original plans for Eaglewood did not allow for privacy fencing, for example.

Design trends change over time, along with innovations in building materials. It can be a balancing act to honor the intent of the developers and at the same time allow for change and individual taste, and that is the challenge the Design Committee embraces.

Communication Committee

The Communication Committee is the energy behind this newsletter. A group of four dedicated volunteers (and one junior committee member)

meets four times a year to discuss articles for upcoming issues and assign authors. The articles are then compiled, the newsletter printed and mailed along with the HOA dues statements.

Judicial Committee

The Judicial Committee is charged with adjudicating appeals filed by homeowners who have been assessed a violation fee. Homeowners have 14 days from the date the notice of assessment is received to file an appeal.

The duties of the committee include participating in any email streams between meetings, making all decisions based on the PC&Rs and Design Committee Rules, and to rendering a determination not later than two weeks after receipt of the appeal package.

For homeowners looking to be of service to their community, the committees offer a great opportunity to give back.
