Seth's tenure was marked by equipment upgrades, stronger contractor partnerships, and positive relationships throughout the community. Over the past five months, as the Board uncovered substantial information about incomplete tasks and unmet responsibilities, we were reminded of a quote by Associate Justice Thurgood Marshall that has guided our work in charting a path forward:

Hard realities have been faced, and new processes and procedures have been implemented—and will continue to be refined—to strengthen Eaglewood's operations.

Paul is a frequent walker on our trail system and looks forward to keeping it in a usable, enjoyable condition for the benefit of all community members.



Snow Clearing Safety

- We know playing in fresh snow is the best. If you see snow removal crews out working, please keep your kids in your yard or inside until they are done.
- Remember that snow equipment operators are working with reduced visibility – you can see them, but they may not be able to see you.
- Please park your vehicles 4 feet or farther from the streets and sidewalks so equipment has room to maneuver and throw the snow as far off the street or sidewalk as possible. This will help keep costs under control by avoiding snow hauling later in the winter.
- For lighter storms, plows will start work as soon as the snowfall begins to taper off to minimize the need for a second pass. Heavier snow will require multiple passes, performed as conditions dictate.
- Circles will be cleared within 72 hours after the snow stops.
- We do our best to perform removal outside of school and commute times, but Mother Nature isn't always that cooperative, particularly with heavier snowfalls.
- Remember, the operators are only human and need their rest as required by DOT, so if you don't see them out, they may be elsewhere in the neighborhood, servicing their trucks, or grabbing a quick nap to stay sharp.
