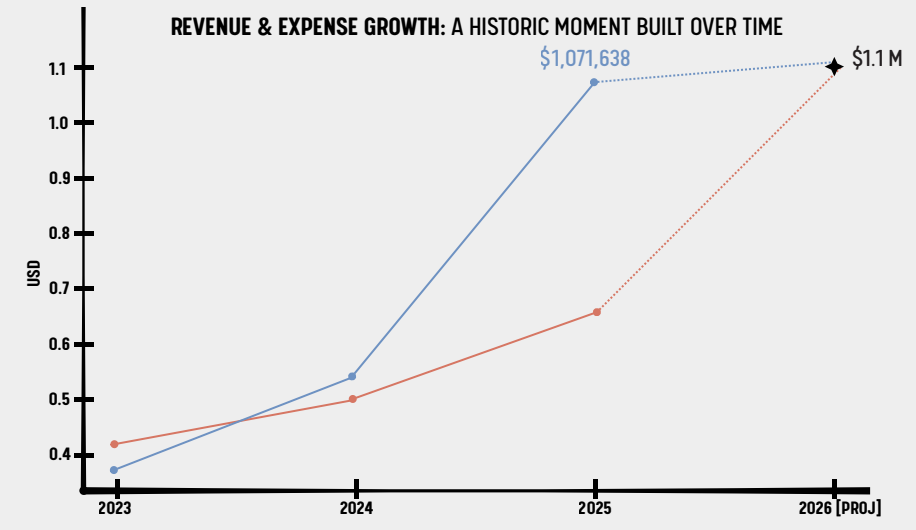

## CEO LETTER

Dear Embers Community,

As we reflect on 2025, I am filled with deep gratitude for the remarkable ways God has continued to grow and mature the Embers community. This year has been marked not only by measurable expansion, but by a deepening of trust, of partnership, and of shared commitment to the long journey of intergenerational freedom.

In 2025, Embers experienced significant growth in both financial support and volunteer engagement, a testament to the faithfulness of this community and to the clarity with which our mission is being carried forward. Alongside this growth, we refined our programs and strengthened our Theory of Change, listening closely to our local teams and the families we serve. These refinements have allowed us to respond with greater wisdom, humility, and sustainability to the complex realities facing women and children emerging from trafficking and exploitation.

One of the most life-giving moments of the year came through our **Legacy Education Career Fair**, hosted in partnership with a local church—a true companion in this work. What we experienced that day felt like loaves and fishes multiplied. In order to serve **15 of our college students**, many of whom are the first in their families to imagine professional vocations, more than **50 professionals**, spanning a wide range of 14 industries, generously offered their time, stories, and wisdom. It was a powerful picture of God's abundance—of what becomes possible when the wider community shows up to say, *You belong. Your future matters.*

This year, Embers served **552 individuals, including 9 whole families journeying toward reintegration, 108 children** and their families, **40 individuals through our Legal Aid Clinic**, and **16 mothers and their newborn babies receiving maternal health care**. Through our outreach efforts, nearly **2,900 people were reached with care, prevention resources, and support**.

We also continued to take small but meaningful steps toward economic restoration, with individuals participating in job training and securing employment—quiet victories that signal restored agency and hope.

**Behind every number is a sacred story.** Mothers choosing safety and dignity. Children growing in health, education, and imagination. Young people beginning to envision lives marked not by survival, but by calling. As in years past, our daily prayer rhythms—marked by gratitude, intercession, and tears—have grounded this work in the presence of God, who continues to meet us faithfully in the midst of both joy and burden (Psalm 127:1).

Every initiative at Embers is born from a daring dream—one that refuses short-term solutions and instead commits to long obedience and generational healing. From continued investment in education and maternal care to whole-family restoration and community reintegration, we remain steadfast in our calling to walk alongside those whom Jesus loves so deeply.

From the depths of my heart, thank you for your faithfulness, generosity, and trust. This work belongs to all of us, and it is a privilege to journey together.

# Embers History



## 1998 PROGRESS/ TRANSFORMATION

A recent college graduate **Haejin Fujimura** receives a clear and enduring calling: to protect children from violence and to stand with those whose lives are shaped by injustice. This moment marks the beginning of a lifelong vocation—one that would require patience, courage, and unwavering faithfulness.

## 2002 LEARNING THE WORK OF JUSTICE

Haejin interns with International Justice Mission, where she helps support the launch of IJM's Cambodia office. Immersed in frontline justice work, she gains firsthand experience in anti-trafficking advocacy, legal intervention, and survivor care—forming the foundations of a future vision.

## 2014–2017 SEEING WHO WAS LEFT BEHIND

**Haejin, alongside Nelli Kim and Brianna Johnson**, travels repeatedly to India. There, they encounter women trafficked as children who had become mothers—and the children born into brothels alongside them. It becomes clear: while many organizations focused on rescue, **entire families were being left behind**. A new vision begins to take shape.

## 2002–2013 YEARS OF PREPARATION

Over the next decade, Haejin supports and collaborates with multiple anti-trafficking and justice initiatives locally and globally. These years are marked by listening, learning, and humility—discerning what works, what fails, and who is too often left behind.

## 2019 EDUCATION, JUSTICE, AND PARTNERSHIP

Embers launches **Legacy Education**, opening pathways to higher education and vocational training for trafficking survivors and youth at risk. That same year, Embers co-creates:

- **Celebration of Freedom & Success** with IJM, honoring survivors' milestones
- A **Legal Aid Clinic**, officially authorized by the **District Legal Services Authority (DLSA)**, expanding access to justice at the community level

## 2017 EMBERS IS FOUNDED

**Embers International** is formally founded with a bold, generational vision. In the same year, the dream of transforming an abandoned former brothel into a place of beauty and healing is born. Embers launches its first collaborative initiative, the **Christmas Project**, restoring dignity and joy to trafficking survivors through shared celebration.



## 2020 LOVE IN A TIME OF CRISIS

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Embers responds at scale—serving **1.7 million meals** and helping build an **oxygen plant** at a hospital. In the same year, Embers launches the **G.R.A.C.E. Initiative**, providing long-term quality education with wraparound services for children ages 2 through high school.

## 2023 STRENGTHENING THE WHOLE FAMILY

Embers launches **Roots & Wings**, its intergenerational family-strengthening program—designed to keep mothers and children together while restoring identity, agency, and belonging within healthy community.

## 2021–2022 A GENERATION TAKES ROOT

- **120 children** are enrolled in the G.R.A.C.E. Initiative
- The **first graduates of Legacy Education** complete professional programs of nursing – seeds planted years earlier begin to bear visible fruit.

## 2024–2025 INTERGENERATIONAL BREAKTHROUGH

- **9 families** formally enrolled in Roots & Wings
- **15 students and graduates** in 10 different industries in Legacy Education
- **First G.R.A.C.E. graduate** enrolled in junior college
- **First child born into the Roots & Wings program**—in a hospital, not a brothel
  - For the first time, a child begins life outside the cycle of exploitation.

## 2018 A CENTER OF COURAGE IS BUILT

The **Sahasee Embers Center** opens—Sahasee meaning “courageous.” Once a place of exploitation, it becomes a life-giving center for healing, education, and community restoration. What was broken begins to bear beauty.

## 2026 A NEW SEASON BEGINS

Embers appoints its **first full-time CEO**, marking a **new chapter of organizational maturity**. With a **24-year vision for the child born into Roots & Wings**, Embers commits—not to short-term relief—but to a full journey from birth to adulthood, alongside families and the global community.

# FACTORS OF TRAFFICKING

## RISK

Risk factors are not isolated; they are systemic and generational. In the communities Embers serves, vulnerability is not simply a present condition; it is formed over time through entrenched social hierarchies, poverty, and exclusion, and it is passed down to the next generation.

### EXAMPLES

- Illiteracy and limited access to educational pathways
- Food insecurity
- Housing instability
- History of abuse, particularly sexual abuse
- Substance dependence
- Family or social networks already caught in trafficking
- Undocumented immigration status

## PRO-TECTIVE

Protective factors are active and relational and must be intentionally built. They often begin with the simple but profound act of being seen and known.

### EXAMPLES

- Supportive adult relationships
- Positive self-image and strong self-esteem
- Understanding of healthy relationships
- Consent and refusal skills
- Awareness of trafficking
- Perception of legal rights
- Knowledge on how to keep safe
- Having basic needs met
- Community connections

NOTE: Traffickers target the convergence of poverty, social exclusion, illiteracy, and isolation — where vulnerability has been shaped over generations. Breaking that cycle requires more than rescue. It **requires consistent and long-term commitment.**

# Breaking Three Generations of Darkness

HOW A THIRD-GENERATION SURVIVOR IS REWRITING THE FUTURE FOR CHILDREN BORN IN THE RED-LIGHT DISTRICT

In South Asia's red-light districts, exploitation is often passed from mother to child, like a cruel inheritance. **Children born in brothels face alarming rates of exploitation, especially girls.** Yet even in places where hope seems extinguished, restoration becomes possible when sustained care takes root.

In 2019, six-year-old Mina\* stepped through the doors of Sahasee Embers Center—our community-based safe haven where Embers' programs come to life. She was the third generation of trafficked women in her family. Her grandmother Sama\* had been...



trafficked across borders as a child and forced into a brothel. Mina's mother Rashmi\* was born there and set on the same path. Fragmented documents across countries left them legally invisible. Mina's father vanished early, leaving Rashmi to raise baby Mina alone.

Determined to break the cycle, Sama enrolled Mina in **G.R.A.C.E. Initiative—Embers'** comprehensive education program—in an effort to change the course of her granddaughter's fate.

### The G.R.A.C.E. Initiative

The G.R.A.C.E. (Generational Restoration and Children's Education) Initiative is built on an integrated approach that serves both trafficked mothers and their children together; a departure from the models that treat them in isolation. The program provides English-medium private school education to children born into and living in the red-light areas alongside sustained family support, recognizing that child's restoration must address the whole relational ecosystem.

Because exploitation is intergenerational, restoration must be as well.

At the Center, Mina began to thrive. With Sama as her steady attachment figure, Mina received education, care, and the steady reinforcement that she could have a different future. When Sama fell seriously ill, Embers' team nursed her back to health, recognizing that Mina's hope was deeply tied to her grandmother's presence.

Mina blossomed into a bright, curious, polite child. She gained fluency in English, met national academic benchmarks (rare for children in her circumstances), and overflowed with dreams and joy.

For six years, hope continued to grow.



### THEN THE WORLD BROKE

In June 2025, a massive immigration enforcement sweep hit the district. Without legal documents of entering the country (an absence directly tied to their trafficking), Rashmi and Sama were detained and forcibly repatriated. Their already precarious status collapsed overnight.

Eleven-year-old Mina was left alone at a police station, soon to be separated from her only family across national borders.

In that moment, she did not withdraw or freeze in fear. Instead, she courageously demanded a phone call—to Embers' local team.

What followed was a complex, cross-border effort navigating systems not designed for children like Mina—caught between immigration enforcement and child protection frameworks.

Embers' local team mobilized lawyers, NGOs, government child protection agencies, and anti-trafficking units in two countries. They located Rashmi and Sama, connected them with local partners, gathered documentations, and worked through processes that too often separate families rather than reunite them.

During this time, Mina was temporarily placed with the mother of another G.R.A.C.E. student—remaining within a familiar and trusted community while reunification efforts continued.

### THE CHOICE NO CHILD SHOULD BEAR

Child welfare officials gave Mina two options: enter a government shelter (thereby losing her school and community) or return to her grandmother's village in a country and language foreign to her.



Most children in her position would become another statistic. But Mina had six years of formation with Embers—education, relationships, and a growing sense of her own worth.

In July 2025, before a panel of government child protection agency officials, this small 11-year-old did the unthinkable: she insisted on speaking for herself.

Facing a panel of officials, she stood tall and said clearly:

**"I've been attending my English-medium school for six years," she said. "I must go back to my school without any more absences. I can't lose my school."**

Her clarity and eloquent plea—delivered with childlike candor and unshakable conviction—moved the officials. In an unprecedented decision, they overrode standard policy: Mina could remain in her school. She would reside in the shelter temporarily, but continue her education and remain connected with the Sahasee Embers community while reunification efforts continued.

A new precedent was set—one that recognized continuity of care as essential to a child's well-being.



# THE JOURNEY CONTINUES

Today, Mina still attends school. She continues to learn, to grow, and to hope.

She misses her mother and grandmother deeply. Communication across-borders remains difficult, often entangled in **systems that fail to account for the realities of trafficking.**

And yet—**Mina is not alone.**

As we wait for Mina to be reunited with her family, Mina remains rooted in a community that knows her, where she is safe, seen, and supported.

Mina was expected to become the third generation of exploitation. Instead, she is becoming the **first generation to break the cycle.**

Her story shows what becomes possible when we view survivors not as isolated individuals, but as whole families on a path of restoration journey, and when we remain present long enough for that restoration to take hold.

It is **the testimony of a grandmother's fierce love, a community's refusal to accept predetermined fates, and one small girl's unquenchable fire.**

It is a flame that will not be stopped.

## **EMBERS MODEL:**

Embers' model of care delivers key **benefits tailored to the realities of the red-light district** : Why keeping families together matters.

- Preservation of cultural and community continuity. **Children stay connected to their language, traditions, festivals, and social networks,** reducing the dislocation common in stranger or institutional placements.
- Greater stability for siblings. Especially vital in migrant families, where **siblings often face separation**; our approach keeps them together in familiar settings.
- Enhanced emotional resilience. Familiar caregivers offer comfort and trust, leading to better mental health and fewer behavioral challenges during crises.
- Support for family reunification. By providing temporary kinship care, we create space for advocacy (like bail efforts) while strengthening families for safe, lasting reunions.

# Roots & Wings

## NEW BIRTHS

**His name is Adam.**

Adam is eight months old. From the moment he entered the world, he has been full of life—his laughter fills a room, and his eyes have not had to see the shadows his mother once endured.

He is the third child born to a woman who survived a decade of a life she never chose, defined by hopelessness and violence. His older siblings were born in the dim back rooms of a brothel, where their first cries were lost in the same violence that had overtaken their mother's world. **But Adam's beginning is different.**

He is the **first child born into Embers' care under its Roots & Wings program.** He received full prenatal care, was delivered in the safety of a hospital, and came home to an environment **where care is consistent and safety is real.**

His birth marked a turning point—something sacred. For the first time, a family stood at the edge of a new life, a future built on a promise. Still, Adam's birth wasn't the end of the story; it was the real beginning of the work.

Embers now walks alongside Adam's family as restoration takes root over time. His mother is learning, for the very first time, what it means to live in safety.

We are journeying with his siblings as they gradually unlearn the instincts of survival and grow into the steady rhythms of school, friendship, dignity, and belonging. And we are looking out for Adam, **protecting his future with patient, gentle care that refuses to rush,** but instead sits in the joys of healthy formation.

**This is what we mean by a covenant. Embers Roots & Wings isn't a program with a fixed timeline.** It is our promise to stay with Adam's family during their long journey. We remain through the setbacks and the hard days, through the slow process of rebuilding trust. We provide education, livelihood pathways, and community support **so that Adam can stand as a young man who knows, without a doubt, that he was born into freedom.**

Because of this commitment to restoring the whole family, one single birth has become a turning point for an entire lineage. Adam isn't just a child who was saved. **He is the first of many** who will inherit a completely different story, one written in hope and sustained by our enduring presence.

## **NOTE:**

Most of the women and children Embers serves come from **communities historically placed at the bottom of South Asia's deeply ingrained caste hierarchies**—often labeled "**untouchable**" or socially "**impure.**" Though these classifications were formally abolished by mid-twentieth century constitutional reform, their effects continue to shape today's lived experience.

Comprising an estimated **16-17% of the population in affected regions,** these communities are disproportionately impacted by poverty, sex trafficking, bonded labor, forced migration, and gender-based violence.

# ASHA

## *our Hope*

### A MOTHER FULL OF LIGHT

Asha, a mother living in the shadows of a red-light district, began to reconsider her own future after seeing the quiet transformation in her two daughters through Embers' G.R.A.C.E. Initiative.

Married as a child, Asha's dreams and education were cut short before they could take root. **She became a mother as a minor** herself and carried forward responsibilities without the opportunity to complete her own formation.

Then she witnessed something extraordinary: **through the G.R.A.C.E. Initiative, Asha watched her daughters** step into the program with bright, eager eyes. Asha watched her girls stand taller, speak with pride, and start to dream for their future. In their growing light, **she saw the future she had once lost**—and the mother she **still longed to become**.

In that moment, love became her strength. With resolve and unbreakable devotion to her children, Asha enrolled in a primary education completion program. She is learning letters and numbers, **but more importantly she is reclaiming her voice**, modeling courage, and showing her children that it is never too late to rise toward intergenerational flourishing.

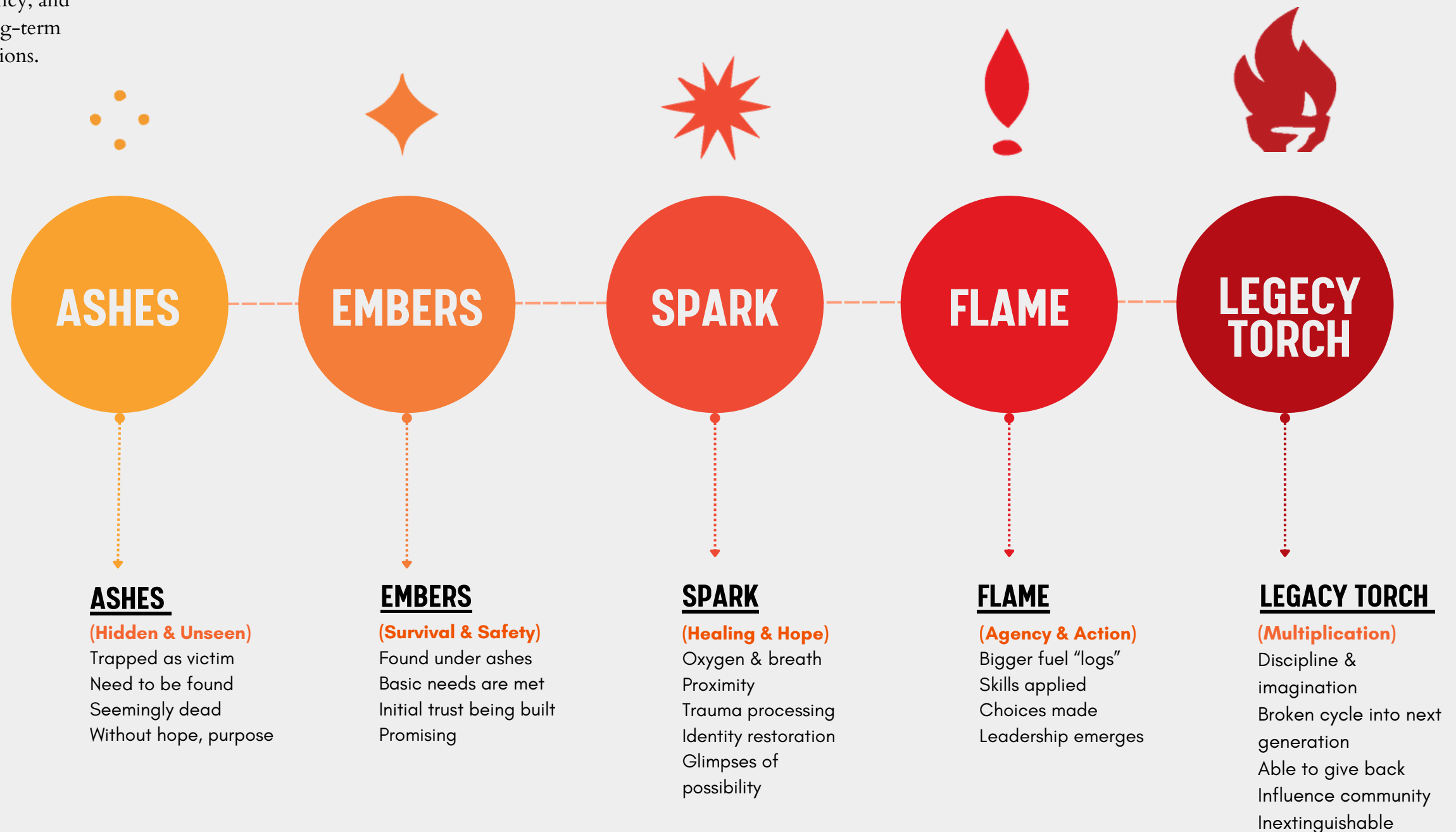
# Transformation Arc

The Embers Transformation Arc traces the journey from vulnerability to flourishing—moving through stages of ashes, ember, spark, flame, and ultimately, lasting legacy.

Each stage represents growth in trust, agency, and belonging, shaped through consistent, long-term relationships rather than isolated interventions.

This framework counters the urgency that can disrupt care. It recognizes that restoration is not a single event but rather a gradual process that develops over time, encompassing setbacks, resilience, and ongoing presence. It recognizes that restoration is not a single moment, but a process that unfolds over time—through setbacks, resilience, and continued presence.

For the mothers and children Embers walks with, the destination is not merely survival - it is becoming a source of light that radiates outward, multiplying **freedom into generations beyond.**



# THEORY OF CHANGE

## OUR APPROACH

**Whole family care is necessary to create a secure home base for the flourishing of the next generation.** Addressing both mothers and children is essential to breaking exploitation cycles. Real change requires more than knowledge transfer or short-term solutions. Transformation involves reshaping identity, habits, and daily practices.

### PROBLEM

Human trafficking inflicts profound, intergenerational trauma on victims and their families, perpetuating cycles of exploitation, re-trafficking, orphaning, eroded sense of belonging across mothers, children, and subsequent generations.

In Turbhe, trafficked victims, along with their children, are trapped in intergenerational exploitation and abuse. There is no effective program model that supports multiple generations to break free from recurring vulnerabilities and enter into sustained restoration and healing.

# Flames of the Future

EMBERS' CAREER FAIR, OCTOBER 2025

## FROM INHERITED OPPRESSION TO EMERGING VOCATION

One October morning, fifteen students from Embers' Legacy Education Program arrived at their first career fair dressed in professional attire, many wearing blazers for the first time.

To anyone watching, they looked like any group of emerging professionals: poised, prepared, and ready. What was invisible was the histories they carried — shaped through generations of poverty and systemic injustice.

**"When our students entered the Career Fair, all of us did not immediately recognize them because of their confident, graceful poise,"** recalls Haejin, CEO of Embers International, her voice still catching with emotion months later. **"They were transformed beyond being youth from the underprivileged community into becoming the future generation of leaders and change-makers."**

These students are the first in their families to attend university. They are pursuing pathways in nursing, engineering, law, hospitality, education, and entrepreneurship. Their presence in those rooms reflects more than individual achievement. It is a rupture in inherited exploitation.

## PARTNERSHIP TO FUEL THE FLAMES

The career fair grew from a collaboration between Embers and a local church whose ministry serves young professionals across the city, united by a shared conviction to connect marginalized youth to networks they could never access alone. More than seventy attendees, including industry leaders across multiple sectors, gave Embers students the chance to explore vocational possibilities and be seen for their potential rather than their past.

One volunteer described watching a student present her résumé to a hospitality executive: "She knew exactly what she wanted to learn. She spoke with clarity and confidence. You would not know that just two years ago, she was uncertain if she would complete secondary school."

That moment held years of quiet formation becoming visible — belonging that was cultivated slowly and intentionally, expressing itself as confidence and hope.



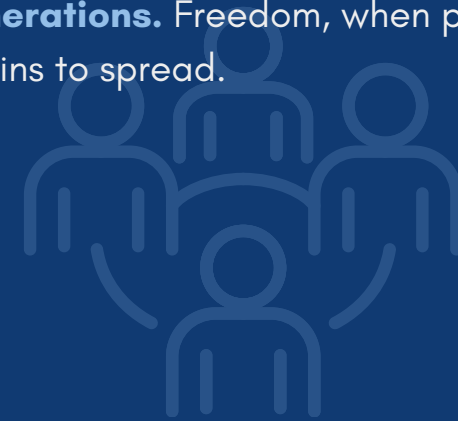
## CONTINUING IMPACT

The results were tangible: three students secured employment and one received a competitive internship in the culinary arts.

The broader impact extends beyond these individual milestones. When Legacy students gain employment:

- Younger siblings find someone to look up to
- Mothers witness hope taking shape
- Graduates return to mentor others, strengthening their communities

As opportunity becomes accessible, **dignity is reinforced, and new patterns begin to take hold across generations.** Freedom, when planted deeply, begins to spread.

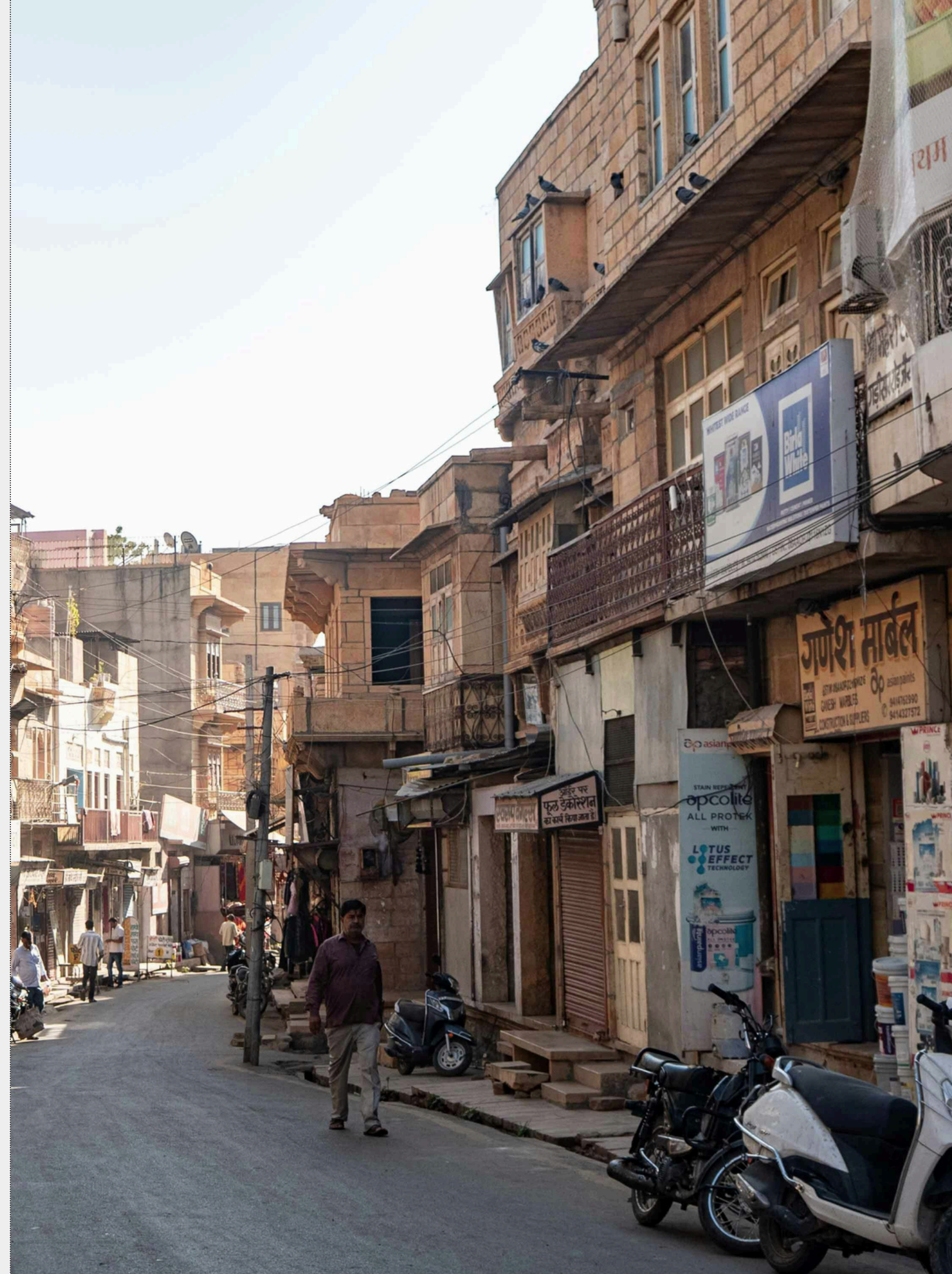

# INTERCESSOR STORY

## PRAYER AS THE FOUNDATION OF MISSION

Embers Intercessor – Jacob B.

**Embers International’s work is impossible without prayer.** That might sound like an exaggeration, but through my work as assistant to Haejin and Makoto Fujimura—CEO and Artist Advocate Counsel for Embers, respectively—I’ve had a front-row seat to a hidden but vital spiritual arena: Embers’ daily prayer meeting.

The rhythm is routine; the work that happens here is anything but. Each workday at 11:30, my co-workers and I pause our tasks, gather or Zoom into the “Embers studio” conference room at our office, and devote thirty minutes to sustained intercession on behalf of Embers’ clients, field team, and partners. According to typical business metrics, we might be tempted to see this dedicated half hour as a nice, Christian gesture but ultimately a waste of time. After all, Embers’ US-based team is made up of part-timers and volunteers. There are only so many hours in a day, and with the majority of Embers’ staff half a world and many time zones away, each minute counts. **But God’s metrics are not our metrics. Through the prayers of Embers’ staff and volunteer intercessors like me, I’ve witnessed miraculous outcomes to seemingly impossible circumstances.**

That’s not to say we’re doing anything special in these brief minutes each day. Rather, God invites us into his work of beauty and justice, of restoring broken lives and bringing hope to the darkest places.



EMBERS INTERCESSOR

Prayer matters to Embers because this work has real spiritual dimensions which cannot be discounted. As Lesslie Newbigin (frequently quoted by Haejin Fujimura, Embers’ CEO) wrote, “The deepest motive for mission is simply the desire to be with Jesus where he is, on the frontier between the reign of God and the usurped dominion of the devil.”

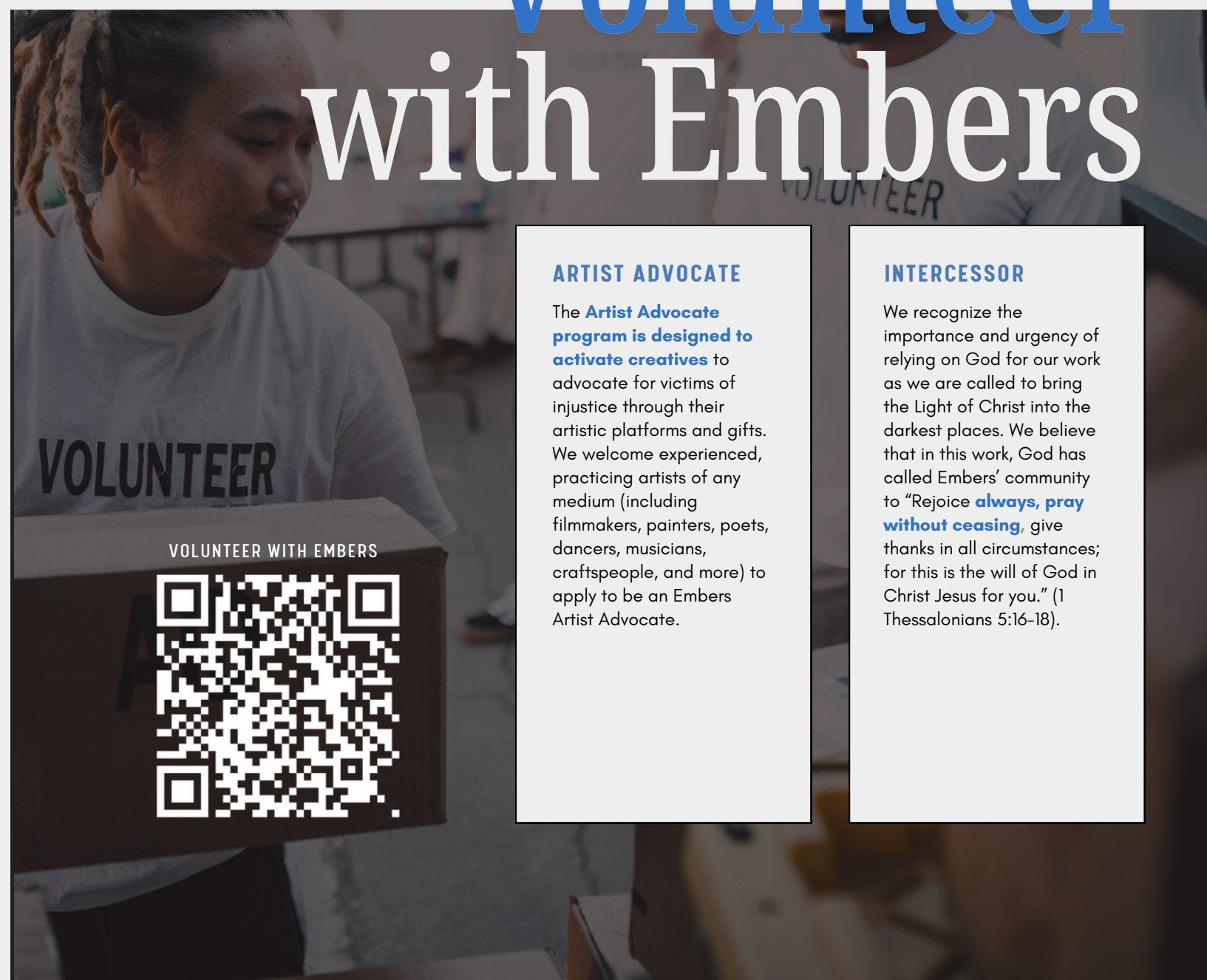
And that’s what this work is all about—mission. But Embers’ mission goes so much further and deeper than that word might sometimes imply. **Freedom from intergenerational cycles of violence requires a holistic vision of restoration that encompasses all areas of life:** individual spiritual renewal, certainly, but also economic empowerment, trauma care, access to education from grade school through university, safe housing, a renewed sense of agency

and dignity for mothers and children who don’t even have a concept for that. Prayer can (and does) move mountains; it also changes us who pray, shaping our imaginations and expanding our hearts to know the fullness of Christ’s will for the community we serve. Embers’ work is holistic because the gospel is holistic, and prayer gives us the eyes to see.

**But Embers can’t do it alone.** Embers Intercessors, along with our other volunteer programs of Embers Artist Advocates and Embers Ambassadors, are part of an ecosystem which sustains this work,
