
St. Paul's on the Green is a diverse, affirming, inclusive Episcopal community sharing God's Radical Welcome.



St. Paul's is a thriving community of faith.

Our operating budget comes from a number of sources, including pledges and other trackable income; space-use income from organizations and programs that use our facilities, such as Watch Me Grow Daycare and Rising Stars Performing Arts; one-time gifts and nontrackable open-plate contributions; an annual draw from our endowment; planned gifts and bequests; and fundraisers.

Income and Expenses from 2026 Preliminary Budget






Our 2026 goal for pledges and trackable income is \$483,500.

Reaching this goal will help us begin the new year with a balanced budget.

St. Paul's depends upon your generosity.

Pledges and other forms of intentional giving provide almost three-quarters of our operating budget. For many at St. Paul's, a pledge is more than just financial support—it's a heartfelt expression of gratitude and faith.

How much should you pledge? That's a personal decision we hope you will make only after a period of prayer and discernment. Here is a graph that shows the distribution of our 2025 pledges.
