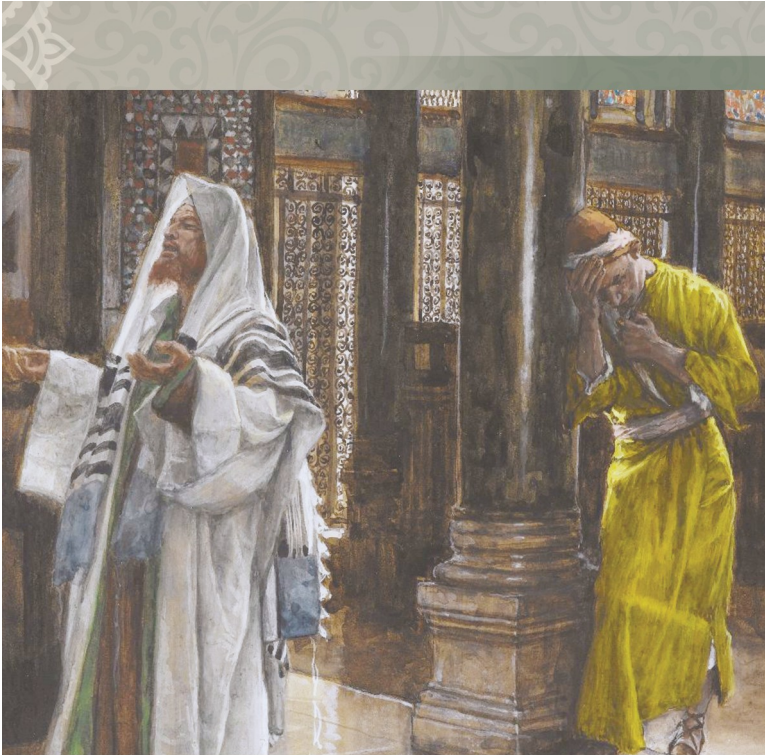

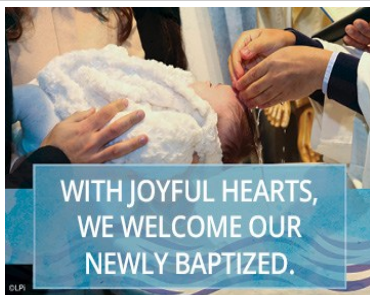

Advent is the liturgical season the Church sets aside for us to prepare for the expectant joy of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at His second coming. The readings (First Reading, Second Reading and Gospel) for these 4 weeks are interwoven with themes that build through the season. Our music and decorations are chosen to echo the themes. Finance Council News

Finance Council reviewed the festival with Samantha Valdivia. We are grateful for the wonderful job Samantha did leading the festival. We discussed key challenges which contributed to the festival deficit including lack of volunteers, cost of bands, weather and ordering too much food. There was a stated goal to try to bring the English and Spanish speaking communities closer together through the festival. The Finance Council will meet in November and make a recommendation for next year's festival. We are finalizing our investment strategy with eCIO. eCIO already has a catholic values strategy that we are validating and will confirm and adopt in November. West Allis city inspectors came through the St. Rita school on Tuesday, October 21 and will document their findings. We believe all went well and are hopeful to close on the St. Rita school by early November. We are planning to move all of our staff to the Holy Assumption site. Timelines are still to be determined. Thank you to all who contributed to our parish flood victim relief. What you all did to help your fellow parishioners was amazing! Parishioners contributed \$8,539.09 to the fund. The September Fish Fry contributed \$3,228. The Parish matched at \$10,000 for a total of \$21,767.09 for flood victim relief. Six parish families requested relief and all will be receiving relief. One family cited damages below \$1,000 and this family will be receiving \$250. One family identified damages between \$3,001 and \$5,000 and this family will be receiving \$1,500. Four families identified significant losses well above \$5,000. Based upon the review of their significant losses, each of these four families will be provided \$5,004.27. Checks will be sent to these families soon. We want to acknowledge the Spanish speaking community for running fantastic taco sale fundraiser which netted \$2,400 in profit. In addition, many Spanish speaking members donated food, time and other resources to make this fundraiser so successful. Thank you to the Spanish speaking community and apologies that this has not been reported earlier.

El Consejo de Finanzas revisó el festival con Samantha Valdivia. Estamos agradecidos por el maravilloso trabajo que Samantha realizó dirigiendo el festival. Discutimos los principales desafíos que contribuyeron al déficit del festival, incluyendo la falta de voluntarios, el costo de las bandas, el clima y el pedido de demasiada comida. Se estableció un objetivo de intentar acercar a las comunidades de habla inglesa y española a través del festival. El consejo de finanzas se reunirá en noviembre y hará una recomendación para el festival del próximo año. Estamos finalizando nuestra estrategia de inversión con eCIO. eCIO ya tiene una estrategia basada en valores católicos que estamos validando y confirmaremos y adoptaremos en noviembre. Los inspectores de la ciudad de West Allis visitaron la escuela St. Rita el martes 21/10 y documentarán sus hallazgos. Creemos que todo salió bien y esperamos cerrar con la escuela St. Rita a principios de noviembre. Estamos planeando trasladar a todo nuestro personal al sitio de Holy Assumption. Los cronogramas aún están por determinarse. Gracias a todos los que contribuyeron a la ayuda para las víctimas de inundaciones de nuestra parroquia. ¡Lo que hicieron para ayudar a sus compañeros feligreses fue increíble! Los feligreses contribuyeron con \$8,539.09 al fondo. La venta de pescado de septiembre aportó \$3,228. La parroquia igualó con \$10,000, para un total de \$21,767.09 para la ayuda a las víctimas de inundaciones. Seis familias de la parroquia solicitaron ayuda y todas la recibirán. Una familia indicó daños por debajo de \$1,000 y recibirá \$250. Una familia identificó daños entre \$3,001 y \$5,000 y recibirá \$1,500. Cuatro familias identificaron pérdidas significativas bien por encima de \$5,000. Basado en la revisión de sus pérdidas significativas, a cada una de estas cuatro familias se le proporcionará \$5,004.27. Los cheques deberían enviarse a estas familias antes de que termine el mes. Queremos reconocer a la comunidad de habla hispana por organizar una fantástica venta de tacos que generó \$2,400 de beneficio. Además, muchos miembros de habla hispana donaron alimentos, tiempo y otros recursos para hacer que esta recaudación de fondos sea tan exitosa. Gracias a la comunidad de habla hispana y disculpas por no haberlo informado antes.

Mass Intention Information

The practice of requesting a Mass for loved ones is a meaningful Christian tradition. The following policies encourage parishioners and friends to schedule Masses, while also following the Canon Law of the Church:

- † The Catholic Church's Canon Law assumes a standard of one intention per Mass.
- † One Mass every Sunday must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as Pro Populo (For the People) as required by Canon Law.
- † A Mass intention may be requested for a deceased loved one, a living person who is sick or suffering, a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life, in Thanksgiving to God.
- † **ALL requests MUST be scheduled through the Parish Office at least two weeks before the desired date.**
- † Requests will be honored on a first-come-first-serve basis in the order in which the request is received at the Parish Office.
- † The suggested stipend for a Mass is \$20.00.
- † Mass Intentions will be listed in the church bulletin.
