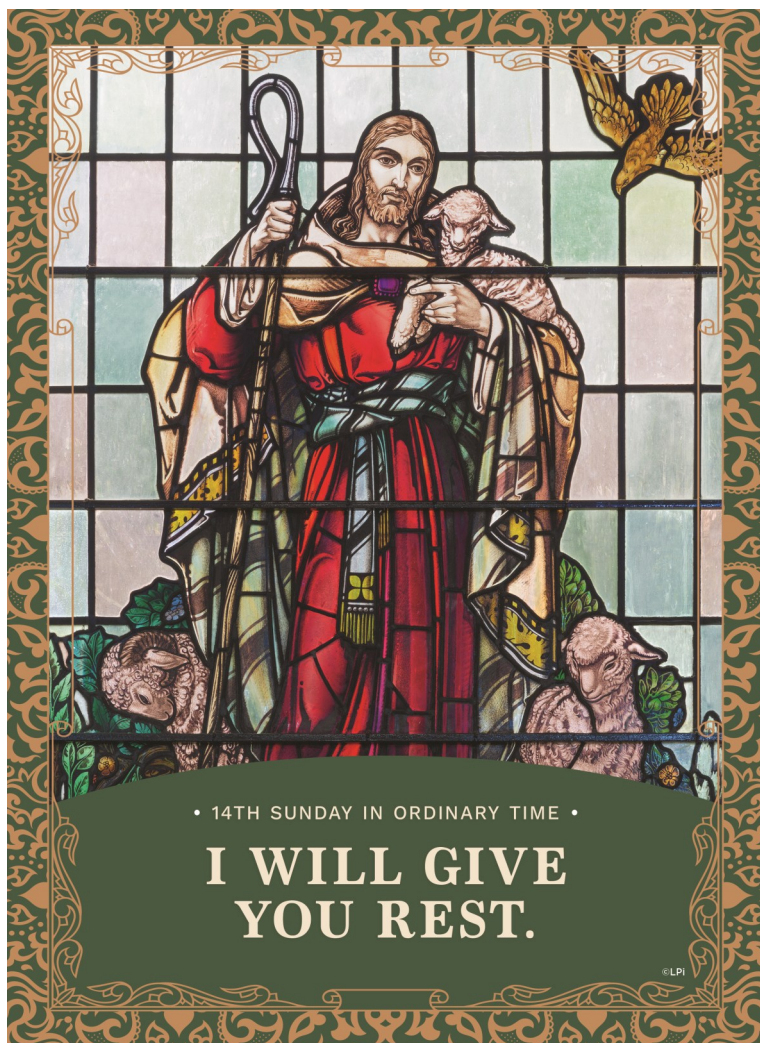

The parish budget for the 2026 / 2027 fiscal year has been submitted to the archdiocese.



The budget reflects a \$170,000 deficit, which the Finance Council is working to reduce. Richardson School will be vacating the St. Augustine school site at the end of August. We are engaged in discussions with multiple businesses interested in the school building. We have received approval from the Vatican to sell the rest of the St. Rita site and are working to finalize its sale with Academy of Excellence. With the sale, we are identifying items within the St. Rita church that will be brought over to St. Barnabas.



Trustee Nominations will take place in the near future.

Message from Fr. Gerardo

How to Receive Holy Communion Properly

"The Eucharist is not ordinary bread, so we should never approach it casually."

For Catholics, Holy Communion is not merely a symbol or ritual. The Church teaches that the Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church 1374). That is why receiving Holy Communion is one of the most sacred moments in the life of a Catholic. Yet many people were never properly taught:

- * how to approach
- * how to receive
- * and how to prepare themselves spiritually

As a result, some receive casually, distractedly, or without understanding the reverence required. But Holy Communion deserves more than routine. It deserves awareness, preparation, and reverence. We are not merely receiving something, we are receiving Someone.



1. PREPARE YOUR HEART BEFORE MASS

Receiving Holy Communion properly begins long before the Communion line. A Catholic should come to Mass prayerfully and with a clean conscience. The Church teaches that anyone conscious of grave (mortal) sin should first receive the Sacrament of Confession before approaching Holy Communion (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church 1385). The faithful are also expected to observe the Eucharistic fast, normally refraining from food and drink for at least one hour before Communion (cf. Code of Canon Law). Preparation matters because the Eucharist is sacred. The soul should be ready for the One it is about to receive.

2. APPROACH THE ALTAR WITH REVERENCE

When it is time for Communion, approach calmly and prayerfully. Avoid rushing, chatting, looking around unnecessarily, or treating the procession casually. The Communion procession is an act of worship, not merely movement. As you approach the minister, make a sign of reverence before receiving. In many places, this is done with a bow of the head (cf. General Instruction of the Roman Missal). Even the way we walk toward the Eucharist should reflect faith.

3. HOW TO RECEIVE THE HOST

The Church permits receiving Holy Communion either: on the tongue or in the hand (where approved by the bishops' conference). If receiving in the hand: place one hand over the other respectfully, receive the Host carefully and consume it immediately before moving away. If receiving on the tongue: open the mouth respectfully, extend the tongue slightly and remain still while the minister places the Host. Before receiving, the minister says: "The Body of Christ." The communicant responds clearly: "Amen." This "Amen" is not a routine response, it is a declaration of faith in the Real Presence of Christ.

4. RECEIVE WITH ATTENTION AND CARE

The Eucharist should never be handled carelessly. The faithful should ensure that no fragment of the Host is deliberately neglected or treated irreverently. One should also avoid walking away while still holding the Host. Holy Communion is not ordinary food. It is sacred. The Church teaches that Christ is fully present even in the smallest Eucharistic particle (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church 1377). Reverence is not exaggeration, it is recognition.

5. AFTER RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

After receiving Communion, return prayerfully to your place. This is not the moment for distraction or conversation. It is a privileged time for thanksgiving, silence, and personal prayer. Many saints encouraged Catholics to speak to Jesus interiorly after Communion: thanking Him, offering intentions and seeking grace and strength. The One you prayed to, is now sacramentally present within you. Do not rush away from a sacred encounter.

6. COMMON MISTAKES PEOPLE SHOULD AVOID

Many abuses or mistakes happen not from malice, but from lack of formation. Some common things to avoid include: receiving without proper disposition, chewing gum during Communion, walking away without consuming the Host, treating the Eucharist casually and approaching without reverence. The goal is not fear, but awareness of the greatness of the sacrament.

IN SUMMARY: RECEIVE WITH FAITH AND REVERENCE

Holy Communion is one of the greatest gifts Christ gave His Church. To receive properly means: preparing the soul, approaching reverently, receiving attentively and responding with faith. The Eucharist is not ordinary. And when we truly understand Who we are receiving... our attitude changes. Do I receive Holy Communion with routine or with deep awareness of Christ's presence? "The way we receive the Eucharist reveals how deeply we believe in it."

A Time of Transition and Renewal at St. Barnabas Catholic Parish

Dear Parish Family,

The recent communications from Parish Finance and parish leadership at the Town Hall Meeting reflect an important moment in the life of St. Barnabas Catholic Parish: a time of transition in which we are responding to new financial realities while continuing to strengthen our pastoral mission.

These conversations are not simply about budgets and numbers. They are about discerning how we can continue to be a vibrant, faithful, and sustainable community after the significant changes connected with the transition from St. Rita's Parish.

The sale and transition of St. Rita's represents more than a change in property. It marks a new chapter in the life of our parish. We are moving from a larger structure, with greater building responsibilities and operational costs, toward a more focused model that allows us to continue serving our community in a sustainable way.

As part of this transition, the parish is carefully reviewing expenses, staffing needs, building-related costs, and opportunities for new sources of income. At the same time, we are looking at ways to strengthen stewardship, increase parish involvement, expand community activities, and explore opportunities connected with our school property and retreat center.

One of the most important parts of this conversation is the role of regular parish giving. A strong and sustainable parish depends not only on responsible financial management but also on the generosity and commitment of its members. This is why our stewardship efforts are so important. The question before us is not only:

“How can we reduce expenses?”, but also:

“How can we deepen our commitment and participation as a parish family?”

Our community events, including the parish festival, are another example of this balance. These gatherings provide much more than financial support: they create relationships, strengthen belonging, and build the identity of our parish. At the same time, we must continue to evaluate how these activities can be both meaningful and financially responsible.

We are also committed to responsible budgeting. When projected income cannot be confirmed, it is important to plan realistically and honestly. Facing challenges clearly allows us to make wise decisions and move forward with confidence.

From a faith perspective, this moment invites us to reflect on what is essential. The goal is not simply to maintain what we have always done, but to ask how God is calling St. Barnabas to continue its mission in a new reality.

A smaller structure does not necessarily mean a weaker parish. It can become an opportunity for a more focused, engaged, and missionary community. The challenge ahead is to transform our plans — stewardship growth, responsible use of our resources, new opportunities for ministry, and careful financial management — into concrete results.

We move forward with both responsible stewardship and trust in God's providence. Good administration helps us make faithful decisions, and faith reminds us that our mission is always greater than our resources.

Thank you for your continued prayers, generosity, and commitment to St. Barnabas. Together, we can continue building a parish community that is strong, hopeful, and faithful to its mission.

Una época de transición y renovación en la parroquia católica de San Bernabé

Querida familia parroquial:

Las recientes comunicaciones del Consejo de Finanzas y de los responsables parroquiales durante la reunión abierta (Town Hall Meeting) reflejan un momento importante en la vida de la Parroquia S. Bernabé: un tiempo de transición en el que respondemos a nuevas realidades económicas mientras seguimos fortaleciendo nuestra misión pastoral.

Estas conversaciones no tratan simplemente de presupuestos y números. Se trata de discernir cómo podemos seguir siendo una comunidad viva, fiel y sostenible después de los importantes cambios relacionados con la transición de la parroquia Santa Rita.

La venta y la transición de Santa Rita representan mucho más que un cambio de propiedad. Marcan el comienzo de un nuevo capítulo para nuestra parroquia. Estamos pasando de una estructura más grande, con mayores responsabilidades edilicias y costos operativos, a un modelo más enfocado que nos permita servir a nuestra comunidad de manera sostenible.

Como parte de esta transición, estamos revisando cuidadosamente los gastos, las necesidades de personal, los costos de mantenimiento y las oportunidades para generar nuevos ingresos. Al mismo tiempo, buscamos fortalecer la corresponsabilidad (stewardship), aumentar la participación parroquial, ampliar las actividades comunitarias y aprovechar mejor las oportunidades que ofrecen nuestra escuela y nuestra casa de retiros.

Uno de los aspectos más importantes de esta reflexión es la contribución regular de los fieles. Una parroquia fuerte y sostenible depende no solo de una administración responsable, sino también de la generosidad y el compromiso de sus miembros. Por eso nuestros esfuerzos para promover la corresponsabilidad son tan importantes.

La pregunta que tenemos ante nosotros no es solamente: **¿Cómo podemos reducir los gastos?**, sino también: **¿Cómo podemos profundizar nuestro compromiso y nuestra participación como familia parroquial?**

Nuestras actividades comunitarias, incluido el festival parroquial, ilustran bien este equilibrio. Además de aportar recursos económicos, fortalecen los vínculos, el sentido de pertenencia y la identidad de nuestra parroquia. Al mismo tiempo, debemos procurar que estas actividades sean también económicamente responsables.

Estamos igualmente comprometidos con una planificación financiera prudente. Cuando los ingresos proyectados no pueden confirmarse, es importante actuar con realismo y honestidad. Afrontar los desafíos con claridad nos permite tomar decisiones acertadas y avanzar con confianza.

Desde una perspectiva de fe, este momento nos invita a preguntarnos cómo Dios llama hoy a S. Bernabé a continuar su misión. Una estructura más sencilla no significa una parroquia más débil. Puede convertirse en la oportunidad de ser una comunidad más comprometida, más misionera y más centrada en lo esencial. El desafío es transformar nuestros proyectos —el crecimiento de la corresponsabilidad, el uso responsable de los recursos, nuevas oportunidades pastorales y una administración prudente— en resultados concretos.

Seguimos adelante con una administración responsable y con plena confianza en la providencia de Dios. Una buena gestión nos ayuda a tomar decisiones fieles al Evangelio, y la fe nos recuerda que nuestra misión siempre es más grande que nuestros recursos.

Gracias por sus oraciones, su generosidad y su compromiso con S. Bernabé. Juntos seguiremos construyendo una comunidad parroquial fuerte, llena de esperanza y fiel a la misión que el Señor nos ha confiado.
