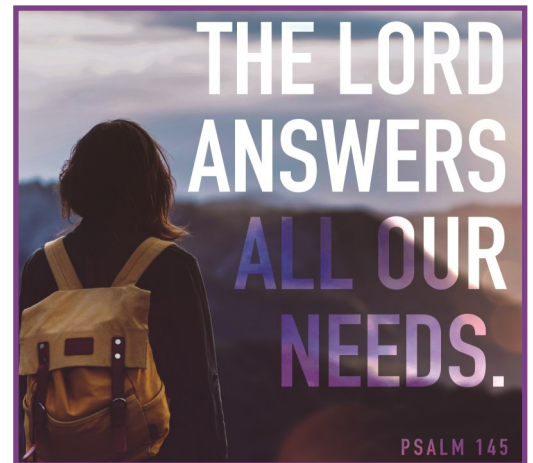

We are currently in the process of obtaining estimates for the restoration and reinstallation of the original pews. Once we have more information, we will share updates with the parish.
