



This financial includes day-to-day operating revenue and expenses. This does not include non-operating expenses such as major maintenance, one-time credits like government program reimbursements and investments or LOA revenue and expenses. An investment advisor, eCIO was chosen to manage our investment income for St. Barnabas! The Finance Council will be starting some sub committees, and we would like some parishioners to serve on them. Two sub-committees that are most urgent include a committee for personnel and for technology. If you have a Human Resources background or similar skills, please consider joining this committee. If you have a background in IT, computers, telephone then please consider joining our technology committee. Also, our weekly collection counting teams could us some help. Currently the team is mostly comprised of parishioners from the St. Rita site. We are seeking help from any parishioner, but especially from parishioners from the other two sites. This team counts the collections from all three sites, records those collections and deposits the collections. Currently we have three counting teams that rotate and count every third Sunday after Mass. Anyone interested in joining a subcommittee or helping our counting teams should contact the Finance Council.

For the year 2025 - 2026, we are looking for volunteers who would like to serve as Blooming Catholic's catechists.

Our Path Forward: From Maintenance to Mission

Dear Parish Family,

I want to share some important information about our parish, information that I believe calls all of us to a deeper reflection on our shared mission. With the dedicated help of our secretary, Rita Gawronski, and Brianna Duff from the Archdiocese Office of Missionary Planning and Leadership, we've recently compiled our Mass attendance data from the last decade.

Please take a moment to look at the Mass counts for our former three parishes:

<u>Parish</u>	<u>2014</u>	<u>2019</u>	<u>2024</u>
Holy Assumption	255	190	221
St. Augustine	243	235	130
St. Rita	545	374	200
TOTAL	1043	799	551

It's striking to see the remarkable decline in just one decade: from a total of 1,043 parishioners participating in Sunday Masses ten years ago, last year we dropped to 551. That's nearly half. This isn't just about numbers, it's about the vibrancy of our community and the reach of the Gospel in West Allis.

Beyond Buildings: Our True Mission

In this context, I want to talk about the significant shift our parish is embarking on. While we must address the burden of maintaining an excessive number of properties – 17 in total – our greatest challenge, and our deepest calling, is not just about buildings. It's about offering programs and activities that truly interest and engage people of all ages and generations, drawing them closer to Christ and His Church.

As baptized and confirmed Catholics, we've all been sent by the Lord. We have a fundamental role in evangelization, not just as clergy or staff, but as everyday missionary disciples. We're called to move from a mindset of simply "maintaining" what we have, to one of actively "missioning" to those around us.

Practical Ways to Embrace Our Missionary Call

How can we foster this missionary mindset and attract new life, especially younger generations, to our parish? Here are some concrete ideas for how each of us can contribute:

- **Be a Welcoming Witness:** Start with your own life. Remember that you are an apostle. You can have spiritual conversations, invite friends, family, or neighbors to Mass or a parish event, and simply bear witness to your daily faith experience through how you live. Your personal invitation is powerful!
- Form Small Faith & Mission Groups: Consider gathering a few friends or neighbors to form "cells" or small faith and mission groups. These groups can meet regularly in homes to share faith, pray, and discern together how you can serve and evangelize in your immediate surroundings your street, your workplace, your social circles.

Our Path Forward: From Maintenance to Mission

- Creative Outreach & Service: Let's think creatively about how our service can become a bridge to the Gospel.
 - Do you have a passion for sports? Consider coaching a youth sports team or organizing a parish league. It's a fantastic way to build character, community, and share Christian values.
 - Are you skilled in a particular area like technology, art, music, or cooking? Offer to **teach workshops or classes** for teenagers or young adults. These aren't just skill-building, they're relationship-building opportunities.
 - Enjoy social events? Plan casual gatherings for young adults, like a game night, a coffee meetup, or even a local hiking club. Simple invitations can open doors.
 - Have a heart for service beyond our walls? Organize a community garden clean-up, start a neighborhood tutoring program, or plan visits to local nursing homes – not just to provide a service, but to bring Christ's love and companionship.
 - Are you tech-savvy? Help us amplify our message online through social media, updating our website, or even starting a parish podcast to reach those who might not yet be walking through our doors.
- Share Our Stories: Let's inspire each other! We invite all of you to share your missionary experiences, write short articles or testimonies for our bulletin or website, or use your own social media to amplify the parish's message outwards.

An Outgoing Church

Pope Francis constantly reminds us that we are called to be an "outgoing Church," one that isn't afraid to step out of its comfort zone and encounter others where they are. This vision applies to everyone – clergy, religious, and especially you, our beloved laity. Each of us has received unique charisms, gifts from the Holy Spirit, which are meant to be used for the building up of the Kingdom.

Together, trusting in these charisms, we can transform St. Barnabas into a vibrant missionary community, truly alive and radiating Christ's love to West Allis and beyond.

Please prayerfully consider: What unique contribution are you called to make as a missionary disciple?
