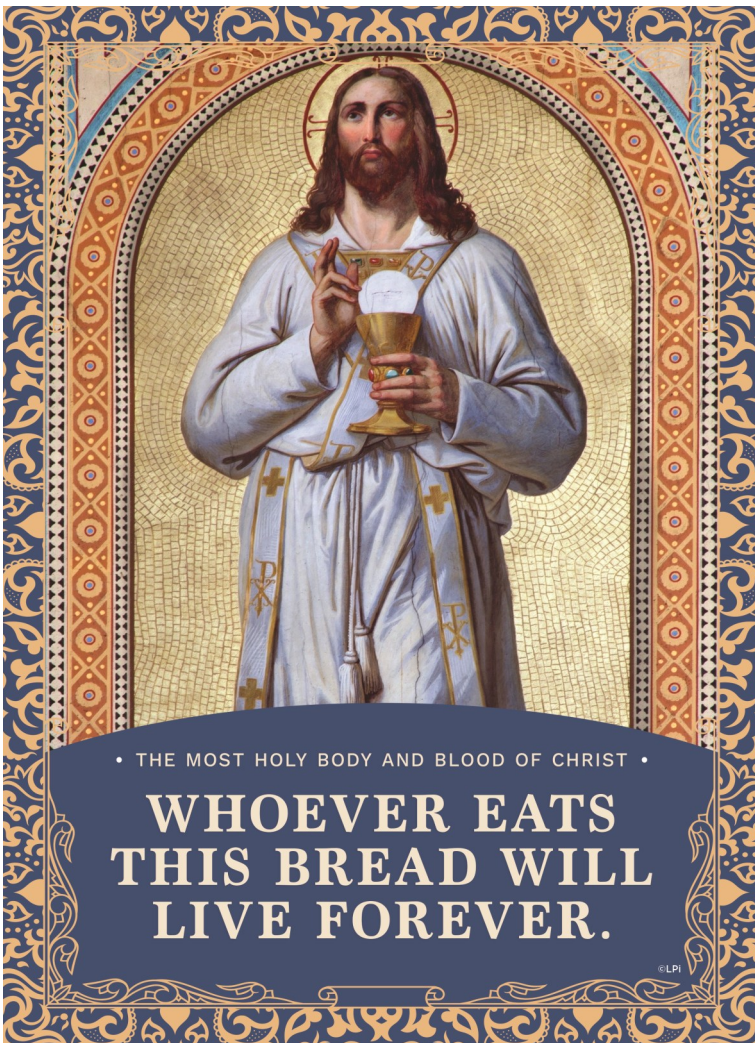

Key Reasons for Centering St. Barnabas at the Holy Assumption (HA) Site

The decision to focus the future of St. Barnabas Parish on the Holy Assumption campus is based on several strategic, financial, and pastoral pillars:

1. Structural Alignment, Financial Stewardship, and Efficiency

- **Consolidation of Resources:** Operating multiple aging campuses creates a severe financial drain on the parish budget. Consolidating our primary operations at the Holy Assumption site allows us to redirect scarce funds away from duplicative facility maintenance and directly toward ministry, spiritual renewal, and outreach.
- **Focused and Viable Investment:** After a professional walkthrough with a General Contractor, it was determined that a focused investment (estimated around \$5 million) to thoroughly renovate the HA site is a clear, viable, and responsible path. This is a far more prudent use of parish resources than maintaining multiple aging facilities.
- **Campus "Right-Sizing" and Cost Reduction:** The strategic plan involves demolishing obsolete or high-maintenance structures that drain our budget, such as the old gym, the old cafeteria, and the former HA rectory.
- **Efficient Housing for Clergy:** Instead of maintaining a large, old, and inefficient rectory, the parish is evaluating more cost-effective options, such as purchasing a smaller neighboring house or building a modest, energy-efficient residence directly on-site.
- **Long-Term Stability (The "15–20 Year" Goal):** By concentrating efforts and funds on Holy Assumption now, our goal is to create a fully renovated facility that will require minimal maintenance for the next 15 to 20 years. This structural stability allows the parish to focus its energy and finances on mission and ministry rather than constant emergency repairs.

2. Comprehensive, Modernized Facilities and Accessibility

- **Collaboration with EUA Architects:** We are working closely with EUA architects to design a campus that is fully accessible, welcoming, and compliant with modern building standards.
- **Radical Accessibility Upgrades:** Key improvements to the HA site will include installing an elevator to serve both the main church and the basement, as well as adding ADA-compliant restrooms to meet current building codes and properly serve the needs of an aging congregation.
- **Modernized Gathering Spaces:** The architectural plans focus on modernizing our gathering spaces to foster better community interaction, supporting the hospitality pillars of our missionary plan.
- **Protection of Critical Social Ministries:** Holy Assumption houses our Food Pantry, a vital, highly active social outreach program that serves approximately 1000 neighbors every month. Centering operations here protect these essential pastoral spaces from displacement, preserving the structural footprint required for our ongoing outreach, community meetings, and weekday chapel.
- **The Formation Hub:** The presence of the school building at the HA site provides an invaluable infrastructure for youth ministry, the *Blooming Catholics* program, and

adult faith formation, allowing us to run multiple catechetical tracks in a safe, appropriate environment.

3. Strategic Future for the St. Augustine (SA) Site

- **Interest from Notre Dame School:** One of the most compelling reasons for this transition is the clear interest from Notre Dame School in the St. Augustine site. They have shown an explicit intent to rent and eventually purchase the SA school building.
- **Realization of the Pastoral Vision:** Capitalizing on this rental and sale opportunity fulfills our long-term goal of having a vibrant Catholic school affiliated with our parish territory. This partnership will bring new families, youth, and vitality to the area, entirely free from the financial and administrative burdens of the parish having to manage a school operations system.
- **Capitalizing on Secondary Assets:** Financial evaluations show that secondary parish assets—such as the St. Rita campus property and eventually the SA school—represent highly marketable assets. The strategic sale or lease of these properties creates the liquid, debt-free funding structure necessary to finance the \$5 million targeted improvements at Holy Assumption.

4. A Unified Parish Identity and Missional Location

- **Breaking the "Two-Site" Mentality:** Centering the parish at one primary location helps move away from historical geographic fragmentation. It establishes a clear, unified physical "heart" for St. Barnabas, signaling a new chapter of growth and stability for the community.
- **Optimized Experience for the Newcomer:** Concentrating our hospitality efforts, ushers, and greeters at one well-equipped, accessible site ensures a consistently high-quality, welcoming experience for visitors from the wider West Allis area.
- **Geographic Alignment & Proximity to the Margins:** Holy Assumption sits at the absolute geographical center closest to the growing residential population sectors of West Allis. This positions the parish ideally for local dynamic evangelization, enabling us to engage directly with neighborhood issues, support those on the peripheries, and shift our stance decisively "**from maintenance to mission.**"
