## History/ Geography

## R.E.

They will be using ideas from theology, sociology and philosophy.

## Latin

We will be continuing our Latin journey following through our Primary Latin scheme this term. Our focus will be on 'An errand in town' and 'At the theatre'

## MUSIC

Through music we will be using the themes of: Stories in Sound 2 and Indian Classical music. The children will explore musical elements.

## P.E.

PE will be on a Wednesday (Games with the coach), with a focus on Athletics and Striking and fielding games. On Thursday it will be Dance (with the coach). Swimming will take place during the second half of the term on Friday's

Welcome back after the holidays, I hope you have all had a wonderful break!

Summer term is always a busy term but with lots of exciting learning opportunities ahead.

### **English**

During this term the children will continue to work on a variety of reading and writing genre including, Fiction and Non-Fiction. The children will be developing their spoken language, comprehension, composition, spelling and grammar skills. They will be learning technical vocabulary and will be encouraged to use this when talking about their tasks and learning. The children will continue to have Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar lessons (SPaG). We will be practising spelling strategies and looking at spelling rules to enhance their writing skills.

This term, our focus texts for this term are:

- Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo
- Richard the 111, retold by Marcia Williams

### **Maths**

In Year 2, the children will be developing their skills within: Measurement (money, capacity and temperature), Statistics and consolidation and practise of Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division.

In Year 3, the children will be developing their skills within: Fractions, Measurement (Time, Length, Mass and Capacity), Geometry (Properties of shapes - angles) and Statistics.

The children will be encouraged to use mathematical talk, reason and make connections between mathematical concepts. They will be learning technical vocabulary and will be encouraged to talk mathematically using sentence stems.

### **Science**

During Science, the children will be learning about Plants. They will consider what different plants need, their life-cycles and seed dispersal.

Through the second half of the term the children will learn about and explore Light.

### **Computing**

During our computing sessions, the children will learn about Stop motion and Data handling comparison Cards.

They will also be having some computing sessions with Twenty20.

### **D&T/ Art**

In art our focus will be Art of Ancient Egypt and Murals & Tapestry

Our DT focus will be: Food. The children will be investigating, planning, making and evaluating Bread & butter and Pasta

Your child will bring their reading book home every day and I would ask that where possible you could listen to them read and sign their reading record.

Please continue practising reading and spelling the Common Exception Words.

Maths homework isn't set weekly, but there may be the occasional Maths task sent home.

Any work is set according to your child's ability and your child should be able to complete this with limited support.
