Welcome back after the Christmas break and into 2026. We would also like to extend a warm welcome to our new families that are joining our pre-school.

During the spring term we are going to be looking at the following topics:

Dinosaurs

The children will be learning about dinosaurs and begin to understand that many things happened in the past. We will support them to identify key features of dinosaurs and become familiar with some dinosaur names. During this topic they will also be learning about the palaeontologist Mary Anning.

Growing & Changing

During the second half of this term we will be learning about growing and changing. They will be learning about environmental changes such as different seasons as well as the changes and growth of plants and animals and the human lifecycle. If you could email/send in a baby picture and a picture of them now for our display to show how we grow and change.

Literacy/Communication and language-

We will be using the books – Harry and the dinosaurs, Dinosaur Roar, Tree, Jack and the beanstalk and the Hungry caterpillar to support our learning over this term

Each week the children will complete an activity around the theme with an adult and independently. Our focus within literacy and communication language this half term is mark making in different medias, acquiring new language linking to out topic, using different tenses, asking relevant questions and sharing experiences.

Maths –

This term for maths we are going to be looking at the numbers 3, 4, 5 and 6, we will be supporting the children to consider the counting principles counting real life objects, objects that are the same then moving onto different coloured/sized objects. We will be using a five frame for them to understand lining up objects and having a clear start and end point when counting.

We will also be looking at height, length, mass and capacity.

Personal, social and emotional-

This term we are going to be learning about friendships. We are going to be doing activities which encourage play with others and joining in an activity together, we will think about what makes a good friend and think about how we can be good friends. We have a range of texts to read together to support their understanding of the topic and will then be participating in relating activities.

RE -

For RE this term we will be looking at which stories are special to different people? And how do different people celebrate at different times? We will do this in a relaxed way through stories and songs.

Fine Motor Skills –

Each session we have a free choice fine motor skills activity set up for your child and all children have 2 1-1 sessions per week to help support their fine motor development. If you could support this at home with any fine motor activities e.g. playdough, Duplo, inset puzzles, and mark making.

Forest School –

Our forest school will restart on 13th January. Our session is held on a Tuesday afternoon, in all weathers. Please be mindful of this when packing your child's forest school clothes. We kindly ask that your child arrives to pre-school, readily in their forest school clothes on Tuesdays. We will support the children in putting on their outerwear before going outside. Please can we remind you that wellies are not permitted for forest school due to safety reasons.

Tuff Spot Ideas – Each week we set up the tuff tray with a small word that the children have requested or shown an interest to. If your child has an interest out of school that we could adapt into a tuff tray then please let us know via email.

Spare Clothes – Can you please ensure that your child has a full set of spare clothes in their bag, along with nappies/wipes if needed.

Absences – Please can you ensure you let us know asap if your child is not going to be attending their sessions as otherwise we need to call you as we have a duty of care for your child if they should be in session.
