#### A STUDY OF FOUR BOOKS WITH ENDANGERED SPECIES ANIMALS

#### **EACH STUDENT WILL:**

- Read and discuss new vocabulary words, facts, and events in four Magic Tree House books and Fact Trackers
- View a video clip as an additional resource for this study
- Draw a travel line on the world map to show Jack and Annie's journey from Frog Creek, Pennsylvania to a new destination for each book
- Enter the endangered species facts and the student's opinion in a Compare and Contrast graph for each one of the four books or Fact Trackers
- Discuss and generate a class list of how students and adults can help the Endangered Species animals
- Discuss and generate a class list of dangers to extinction for the Endangered Species Animals
- Design a t-shirt to help save an endangered species animal

#### **MATERIALS NEEDED**

- Map of the World activity sheet one for each student (in Appendix)

- Endangered Species Compare/Contrast Graph one for each student (in Appendix)
- Endangered Species Compare/Contrast Graph Teacher Suggested Answer Key (In Appendix)
- Design a Shirt activity sheet one for each student (in Appendix)


#### **OVERALL PROCEDURE**

- 1. The following three lesson activities can be used for any Magic Tree House book or Fact Tracker about an endangered species animal. The four books chosen for this lesson are:
  - #36 SUNLIGHT on the SNOW LEOPARD
  - #37 RHINOS at RECESS
  - #38 TIME of the TURTLE KING
  - #39 WINDY NIGHT with WILD HORSES

## **LESSON ACTIVITY ONE - Let's Map It!**



This map is customized to show Jack and Annie's travel destinations in all of the Endangered Species books listed in the Appendix

#### **DIRECTIONS**

After reading each of the four books, the students will engage in this mapping activity.

#### The students will:


- 1. Familiarize themselves with the information on the map—the seven continents, the oceans, the countries, and the destinations Jack and Annie travel to in the Endangered Animals books.
- 2. Document Jack and Annie's travels for each book on the chart below the map.
- 3. On the map, draw a line from Frog Creek, Pennsylvania (Jack and Annie's hometown) to the destination spot where Jack and Annie traveled, in each book. Label the route with the number or book name.
- 4. Use additional map pages to continue this lesson with more books found in the appendix of this lesson.



#### Lesson Extension – Bulletin Board Idea

Put a large world map on a bulletin board so the class can track the destination of every Magic Tree House book read during the year or for a particular course of book study, such as Endangered Species, Historical Figures, Merlin Missions, etc. Use push pins and string to trace the route. Create a flag for a student to write the book's name on. Pin the flag where Jack and Annie land.

## **LESSON ACTIVITY TWO - Let's Graph It!**



This graph can serve as a student resource for discussions and lessons

#### **DIRECTIONS**


- 1. Lead your class into a discussion about why animals are endangered and how the people of the world are working together to help save them. Offer blank charts in the room for students to add ideas such as *Important Endangered Species Vocabulary, Dangers for Animals, and Ways to Help the Animals.* The charts will serve as a reference when filling out this Compare/Contrast Graph and other lessons.
- 2. Guide the students to fill in the categories of this graph as a culminating activity after reading.
- **3.** Re-play the video *Extinct and Endangered Animals for Kids*, on page 1 of this lesson plan, to learn about ways to help save the animals.
- 4. Use additional pages to document more than four books.



#### Lesson Extension – Game Time idea

This finished graph is the perfect card for a JEOPARDY game. Have the students come up with the questions for each category and the teacher can organize and display the game on the computer or overhead projector. Also, creating these questions is great for family homework, classroom group work, or an activity for early finishers of daily classwork.

## **LESSON ACTIVITY THREE - Let's Design It!**



The student will show support for an endangered species of their choice

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Discuss ways that people and animals can live together to help make this a better planet for all. What can children do and what can adults do? (Re-play the video clip on page 1 for specific ideas)

  EXAMPLES for children: go to zoo camp to learn more about animals, attend a beach clean-up day, etc.
- 2. Each student will draw a picture of an endangered species animal.
- 3. They will add a slogan of encouragement on the t-shirt. Brainstorm with the class. EXAMPLES: Let's Share the Planet, Stop the Poachers, Clean the Environment, Protect the Oceans, Recycle, Every Creature Matters ... Keep a chart of their ideas and encourage them to add on.



#### **Lesson Extension – Share Time idea**

Have students bring something to share with the class about this study of Endangered Animals. It could be a **text-to-text connection** (e.g., a book, pamphlet from a zoo ...), a **text-to-self connection** (e.g., a souvenir or photo from the zoo, an animal t-shirt ...}, or a **text-to-world connection** (e.g., a map, an ecology event ...)

#### **BLANK WORLD MAP (optional)**

PRE-LESSON ACTIVITY - Make a geography lesson using the map by having the students label the continents, oceans, and countries.
