

10 Foundational Truths for Building a Real Relationship with God

When you first start seeking God, it's easy to get swept up in religious rules, expectations from others, and spiritual confusion. I've been there. What no one told me—and what I'm telling you now—is that you can skip all of that and go straight to God. This guide offers the raw, foundational truths I wish someone had handed me on Day 1. It's honest, direct, and focused on one thing: helping you develop a real relationship with God, not just religion.

1. God Wants a Relationship. Satan Wants to Destroy It. God deeply desires connection with you—real, personal, ongoing. But Satan's mission is to interrupt, distort, and ultimately destroy that connection. Knowing that you're in a spiritual battle keeps you alert and reminds you to stay close to the only One who can protect and lead you: God

2. Both God and Satan Speak to You—Learn the Difference. Spiritual voices are real. You need to discern which voice is God's and which isn't. God's voice brings peace, clarity, and truth. Satan's voice brings confusion, guilt, pressure, and fear. Learning the difference is essential to staying grounded.

3. God Will Get Your Attention—In a Way That's Unique to You. God knows you. He knows how to speak your language. Don't compare your experience to someone else's. The way He communicates with me will be very different than how He'll communicate with you. Stay open to His unique approach.

4. Knowing Satan Is Just as Important as Knowing God. Most people avoid teaching about Satan, but ignorance is dangerous. Understanding that Satan is real, and how he works helps you recognize deception, temptation, and distraction before it takes root. Your walk with God is much safer when you know who the enemy really is.

5. Your Relationship with God Doesn't Start with Religion. Reading the Bible, going to church, and giving financially are not the starting points of a relationship with God. There's no checklist, no required ritual. God doesn't need your obligations—He wants your honesty and attention.

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6. Seek God, Not People Who Know Him.

Learning from others is helpful, but only God can teach you who He truly is. Don't rely on secondhand faith. Go directly to the source—talk to Him, ask Him questions, and let Him reveal Himself to you personally.

7. Don't Let People's Opinions Drown Out God's Voice.

Before taking advice from others—even well-meaning Christians—talk to God. He will never lead you astray, and His truth will always line up with wisdom. Let Him be your first voice, not your last resort.

8. Prayer Isn't Complicated—Just Talk to Him.

There are no magic words or special positions. You don't need to kneel a certain way or say religious phrases. Just speak to Him like you would a trusted friend. Whether it's a whisper or a thought, He hears you. Always.

9. Mad at God? That's Okay. Talk to Him Anyway.

God isn't intimidated by your emotions. He doesn't have to be on good terms with you to talk to Him, or for Him to respond. Tell Him the truth—even your anger, doubt, confusion, or disappointment. He can handle however you feel about Him. He listens without judgment.

10. You' Will Be Changed—And It Won't Be Easy.

A relationship with God means transformation. He will gently, yet firmly, work out anything in you that blocks intimacy with Him. It's painful at times, but necessary. Don't fear the discomfort—it's growing pains, not punishment.

You don't have to get everything right. You just need to start. Take your time. Be honest. Keep showing up. This journey is not about becoming religious—it's about becoming real with God.
