Kevin won first prize several years running for his gumbo. Additionally, his passion for sharing his culture extended to providing live crawfish to the people of San Antonio, enriching the city's connection to Cajun traditions.

Kevin also studied to be an AC/Heating tech and worked for several years in San Antonio rescuing people from the extreme heat by providing fast and reliable service. Many times, he wasn't paid for his services, but he just helped because they needed it.

Kevin was a friend to all. He could be seen donating his time, skills and tools to help a neighbor in need. Whether it was to give a person a bed for a few nights or to coax an aging AC unit to work, Kevin was there.

Beyond his professional accomplishments, Kevin's true joy stemmed from his family. He leaves behind his loving wife of 18 years, Pamela Dooley, a testament to their enduring bond. Kevin was predeceased by his father, John Dooley. He is Survived by his mother, Leona Dooley, brother, Rand Dooley, sisters, Denise Dooley, Alexis Broussard spouse (Carol), and Erin Dooley (spouse Brent Romero) two daughters, Kaitlyn Dooley and Joelle LeBreton (spouse Joshua), and stepdaughter Tricia Bogen (spouse Leslie). Kevin's legacy of warmth and love lives on in the hearts of his family. His memory is further cherished by his granddaughter, Julia LeBreton, who will carry forward his spirit.
