Manuel Jung was born on April 22, 1932, in San Antonio, Texas to Jung Heung and Concepcion Del Valle Jung. His mother died when he was 5 years old, and he was raised by his maternal grandparents, Elueterio and Victoria Del Valle. He had two siblings, and he had a happy childhood. He played football in high school and took printing shop where he learned how to print newspapers. After graduating from Fox Tech High school in 1950, he enlisted in the United States Navy. He was stationed in San Diego, California. He became a hospital corpsman and said he would make casts for his shipmates who had broken an arm or leg. He served on a PT boat and often, he would say how he traveled to Hawaii and Japan. Manuel served during the Korean War and was honorably discharged in 1954.

After he was discharged from the Navy, he returned to San Antonio, Texas, and found work as a stockman at the Jorrie Furniture Company. Then he applied to work for the United States Postal Service working as a distribution clerk. He then moved up to become the manager of mailing requirements. Manuel was selected to work for 6 months at the Post Office Headquarters in Washington, D.C. Manuel continued to move up and

became the Postmaster of Seguin and then Floresville. He retired after 32 years of service in 1985. Manuel was a hard worker and often had a part-time job besides his full-time job at the post office. He sold jewelry, pre-burial funeral plans, and life insurance. He won two free trips to Hawaii for his sales and membership drives. After being retired for several years, Manuel got a part-time job working as a library aide for 12 years at the Thousand Oaks Library.

Manuel was an easy-going, friendly, kind-hearted, and likable person. He enjoyed kidding around with people. Often, when paying at a restaurant, he would ask the food server, "Do you accept the Sears credit card?" He loved making people laugh. He enjoyed many friendships. He loved his family and would do anything for them. Manuel enjoyed watching sports on television, especially football, track and field, tennis, and wrestling. His favorite past-time was going to Las Vegas to gamble. He also visited casinos in Louisiana, and Texas. Sometimes, Lady Luck would shine on him. Manuel was 91 years old when he passed away. He is survived by his loving wife, Sylvia. They had been married for 61 years. He is survived by his children, Elaine Jung, Robert Jenkins and his wife, Cecilia, Ione Christine Jung, Michael Anthony Jung and his wife, Jana. He has five grandchildren, Robert Wicklund, Melissa Allen, Chris Allen, Michael Anthony Jung, Jr. and Kristen Marie Blount, and three great grandchildren Kazmir Jung, Jaden Baird, and Sophia Blount. He is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews. He was pre-deceased by his sister, Anna May Casarez, and his brother, Gilbert Jung.
