# **Snippets from the Archives**Golf in Gullane through youthful eyes

Gullane is known to many for its golf courses, with the game having touched generations of its residents and visitors. This article of 'Snippets' looks at the game from the youthful eyes first from the early 20th century followed by a couple of accounts from those who were adolescents in the

Henry Bell came to Saltcoats Farm in Gullane in May 1914. "I was ten years old then and what a treat it was to be close to the railway and the golf course just over the other side of it. Gullane was a very busy place then and the trains were full of golfers and so were the hotels." "I had never seen a golf course before, and I thought I'd try my hand at carrying clubs. Well, I wasn't much of a success in the first round, but I went out with a lady in the afternoon and got on grand. Some weeks, in the school holidays, I could make more money than my father working on the farm, but a good thing never lasts long - the Great War started and that finished off all the golf."

Bob Hunter, recounts, as a young boy, carrying for a judge. "One of the best, he was Lord Hunter and a member at Muirfield – a lovely small bag, about three or four clubs – that suited me grand! Just the job. 2/6d. a round – that was 1/-. from old Richie at the gate, then 1/6d. later. That was round about 1918, when I was 9 or 10 years old... There was another man I caddied for who came to stay at Bisset's. An Irish doctor, a left-hander. He was a

right gentleman – he came with his wife and two daughters, and they used to play a lot of foursomes. When I was 13, he asked, "Would you like to go to Ireland?" I didn't know – I said I'd only read about Ireland." Bob does recall that not all players were as gen-

erous as these two, he recalls that the recognised fee for a round was 1/6d. "Golfers who paid less were called 'Blisters' and when one appeared, the Caddie Master could never find us!"

In the same period and of a similar age was Allan Campbell, who though not a regular caddy, would sometimes be standing with his friends at the caddy shed, where Gullane Golf Club's professional's shop is now. "I'd find a bag thrust at me – "Here you are, boy!" and I went round and quite enjoyed it. I carried for one man a whole month -Admiral Rose, he was called. He and his friend decided to play round every course in East Lothian, and they took my friend, Mick Wallace, and me with them. Lockhart, who had the garage by the Golf Hotel, had cabs for hire and they hired a cab. Mick and I sat up beside the cabbie and we did a round a day. They would go to one of the local hostelries for a meal - somewhere like the 'Waggon' at Aberlady after Kilspindie, or the 'Castle' at Dirleton after Archerfield, and they would say, "Now, feed these two boys in the kitchen." We'd tuck into a three-course dinner and then back into the cab and home. I would be about ten - and that was a good month!"

Tom Porteous, born in 1911, became 'attached' to the Linga Hotel. "I'd turn up early with my 'piece' and my two emery cloths, one dry and one oiled. I'd be assigned to a gentleman staying there and sometimes we'd be away to Kilspindie, sometimes Luffness and



rarely, Muirfield with me sitting beside the taxi driver. At dinner time, when I'd eaten my piece, I'd polish up the cloth heads with emery cloths. There was no golf on Sundays but when the school holidays arrived, you could make a fair bit."

In the early years of the twentieth century, the boys had come into their own when there were special events either at Gullane Golf Club, at Muirfield, or at Archerfield. The headmasters of both Dirleton and Gullane schools recorded in their logbooks distress at the absenteeism this caused and devised means of reducing it. In 1906, James Wilson in Gullane recorded "A large Golf meeting being held at Muirfield. On recommendation of the School Board, closed the school." Another perspective comes from Charlotte Johnstone, born in 1914, whose family returned to the village each year. "Every year we quit the city to spend August and September in Gullane... When golf clubs were required Mr Aitken's shop was the place to go. It had a nice mixed smell of wood shavings from the hickory shafts and of the stuff that was rubbed into the binding. The well-equipped golfer usually had a driver, a brassie, an iron about a no.1 - a mashie and a mashieniblick for getting out of the formidable bunkers, faced with wooden sleepers that were quite likely to hurl the ball back at one. A golf lesson with Mr Fisher was sometimes required and excellently given."

To conclude here are a couple of accounts from the late 1960s and 1970s. Alan Macdonald's family moved to Gullane in 1967 when he was 8 years old and they lived in a top floor flat in Lammerview Terrace. "I started playing on the children's course with a 7 iron I'd got as a birthday present. I then got an annual child permit to play on Gullane no 3 which cost 7/6d. I didn't have brothers or sisters but quickly made friends with Alex Galloway who lived in Muirfield Drive and who'd been brought up in the village having met him at the golf course and we spent our time mainly kicking a football about with other local boys or playing golf on No 3."

"Being young we didn't play 18 holes on no 3 but usually would play 9 holes – the first 4 holes then back down 'the Saucer' as it was known, now the 15th hole. If the course was busy, we couldn't always cut in at the Saucer but often if we could see people in the distance coming up the previous hole, we'd quickly tee off and run down the hill."

"For golf as a boy, you couldn't join Gullane GC as a junior member until age 14 but Alex Mason who stayed in the village started East Lothian Boys Golf Club which I joined. The club played competitions in the summer over the likes of Gullane 2 and 3, Kilspindie and I got my first handicap of 34."

Alan's friend Alex Galloway also remembers. "Everyone in Gullane either played or was aware of the importance of golf in the village's everyday life and heritage. Both of my brothers played golf, and we all won the two golf trophies 'Honour Bright' and 'Babe Zaharias'. Brian won them both in 1964, when only P7 boys could participate, I from 1969-71 and Johnny, by far the most gifted of us, from 1972-74. The Peel Trophy also found a spot on my Mum's windowsill."

"A summer permit for No. 3 Course cost £7/6 and we made great use of it. A typical summer's day consisted of eighteen holes in the morning, a visit to the beach in the afternoon and at least nine holes of golf in the evening."

Perhaps the last word should go to Bob Hunter on his childhood, "We were lucky – golf was cheap, and the beach was free". Do you have memories of Gullane from an earlier time and would you be willing to record these, large or

small? These could then be included in our archives so that they might be available for future use in these articles and for possible future publications. If so, we'd be very pleased to hear from you Please send any items by email to:

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#### **Gullane Glorious Bloomers**



The whole of Gullane is now a riot of colour thanks to the new additions at the East end of the Village. Starting with the 2000 Crocus and Daffodils planted last October at Muirfield Park which brightened up February, to the fantastic 2 new triple planters at Gullane Entrance and Cherish. This alongside the 5 new Barrels at Muirfield Drive, Fenton Road and College Way has ensured a colourful display all along Main Street.

We now have 6 Triple Planters, (2 kindly rescued from Dunbar Bloomers) an extra large one at Golf Club, 17 barrels, 27 planters and 31 hanging baskets, plus the Community Garden and the Blue Stane area to water feed and maintain!

At the Village Hall and Recreation Hall we have also planted up bulbs with the Beavers and Scouts, and donated some plants to cheer up around this area. The Village Hall have also added 2 Planters to add a welcome at their Entrance

We are planning to plant a further 8000 Purple Crocus Bulbs around Gullane. This is an Initiative from NB Rotary Club, to help "End Polio Now" and to provide protection against Polio worldwide. This will take place in October this year with and the help of GVA, we look forward to a purple display early Spring and every year going forward.

We also intend to take on the challenge of renovating sanding and painting the 16 benches around Goose Green and Main Street which all need some TLC. It's been great to have a few new bodies volunteering to help with this task.

To continue to keep Gullane Glorious we do need to ask for the continued support from ELC Amenity Team ,our wonderful volunteers, and any donations which are always gratefully received.

## Calling all padel enthusiasts - let's bring padel to Gullane!

In last September's newsletter we wrote about bringing padel to Gullane. Your response was most encouraging, with 375 people from Gullane, North Berwick and surrounding areas keen to join a club based in Memorial Park near the Millenium Woods.

The padel facilities will be a not-forprofit community initiative and part of the redevelopment of the park supported by East Lothian Council. We have engaged a project management firm with experience of delivering various padel courts throughout Scotland, they will work with council planners to secure planning permission.

We are on course to being registered as a Scottish charity and this will allow wider access to grants.

The courts will be covered to make them playable throughout the year and also help with sound isolation and the cost of this is professionally estimated to be £450K.

To date we have raised £100K and we

estimate we need to raise a further £150K from grants and donations. However, we cannot progress grant applications or apply for other funding until the planning permission has been approved.

For now we are asking for a pledge from you as this will make a massive difference to how quickly we could potentially get the courts up and running. 
## Alan Aitken Art Exhibition & sale of paintings


