Today we celebrate the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time. As we approach Lent, our minds and hearts need to prepare for the journey. The Gospel today gives a strong message. We are urged to follow what Jesus gives us – through our thoughts and deeds. Scripture is meant to lead us to conversion. How will we change ourselves during Lent 2026? That is the question we need to ask ourselves. We can use the Scriptures - daily & weekly; the Saginaw Books for Lent; participate in the Stations of the Cross - either in Church or privately at home; sitting quietly in church reflecting, or attending weekly Mass on Tuesdays (beginning February 20th at St. Mary at noon or on Tuesdays at noon beginning February 24th at St. John the Baptist). There will not be weekly Mass on March 5-March 10. Lots of choices... Take time to reflect...


