3rd Sunday of Easter**





THE EASTER OF JESUS

The first reading at Mass during the fifty days of Eastertide is always from the Acts of the Apostles. What reason could there be for the liturgy to focus so much on this book during this time? There is a close connection: the joyful proclamation of Easter, made by the first disciples, is at the very origin of the Christian communities. This book is therefore not merely a historical account, but a selection of events born from Easter and reflected upon theologically under the inspiration of the Spirit in the life of the early Church. The author presents it to us in three stages, according to the memorable words of Jesus to the disciples: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Therefore, the mission unfolds first in Jerusalem. From there it spreads to the rest of Judea and Samaria. Finally, the witness reaches to the ends of the earth. Saint Luke elaborates on the ministries of Peter and Paul, although he also highlights, among others, the bold witness of Stephen, the first martyr, the dialogue between Philip and the Ethiopian official, and the activity of James, John, and Barnabas. All of this is accompanied by miracles that remind us of the words and deeds of Jesus in the Gospels. Reading the Book of Acts is so fitting, since it illustrates the life of the Church with its daily problems, its lights and shadows: The joy of the shared Easter faith amidst numerous difficulties, the witness of its members, the persecutions. Luke, companion of the Apostle Paul, does not remain silent about the tensions within the Church. The attempt by some to impose the Law of Moses prompted the first council in Jerusalem. Let us also recall the early attempts to commercialize the faith (the case of Simon Magus) or the attempts to deceive its members (the fraud of Ananias and Sapphira). Luke guides us on the difficult path of bearing witness to our faith in word and deed. To this end, he identifies us with the joys and hopes of the Church of his time, so that we may be ever more alert to problems and conflicts, both within the Church itself and outside of it. His narrative leads us to live everything in the name of Jesus, the Risen Christ, the Lord, who continually gathers his people into unity with the renewed outpouring of his Spirit. Jesus celebrated, embodied, and ordained the Passover. Understanding this reality sheds significant light on our understanding of the Lord's Last Supper and how to celebrate the Passover and crucifixion of the Messiah. In Luke's Gospel, we see the disciples and Jesus

celebrating the Feast of Unleavened Bread and making arrangements for the lamb that would be served at the meal in the upper room (Luke 22:1-12). At the Jewish Passover, three unleavened loaves of bread are placed in a three-part cloth bag. At the beginning of the meal, the host takes the middle unleavened loaf and breaks it. Half is divided into enough pieces for everyone at the table to eat. The other half is hidden for the children to find and the whole family to eat as the last meal of the meal. Jesus impresses us by taking this symbolism and applying it to himself: "While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take and eat; this is my body'" (Matthew 26:26), the same bread that would be broken on the cross. But even the unleavened bread, hidden to be found by the children and eaten at the end of the meal, points us again to the Messiah, who has temporarily hidden himself in heaven to be revealed at his second coming and at the last supper we will celebrate with him (Matthew 8:11; Revelation 19:9). The Mishnah (a compendium of rabbinic teachings) states that at least four cups of wine must be part of the Passover meal. The reason for the four cups of wine is based on the rabbinic interpretation of Exodus, where four different terms of liberation are used: "I will bring you out... I will deliver you... I will redeem you... I will take you as My own people..." (Exodus 6:6-7). Thus, the first cup is taken at the beginning of the meal, and then the biblical story is explained. After the explanation, the second cup is taken. The third cup, which corresponds to the phrase "I will redeem them," is taken after the meal. It is probably at this point that Jesus "took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you'" (Luke 22:20). Jesus takes the theme of redemption from Exodus to introduce a second redemption, this time from the sin of his people. The fourth and final cup was taken during the singing of Hallel. Also, along with this cup, the Hebrew blessing was pronounced: "Blessed are you, Lord our God, eternal King, who creates the fruit of the vine." This appears to be what Matthew describes when Jesus says, "I tell you, from now on I will not drink of this fruit of the vine..." (Matthew 26:29). In this Easter season, we are called to joyfully remember Jesus' sacrifice and meditate on him as the slain Lamb of God who redeems his people and saves all who believe in him.

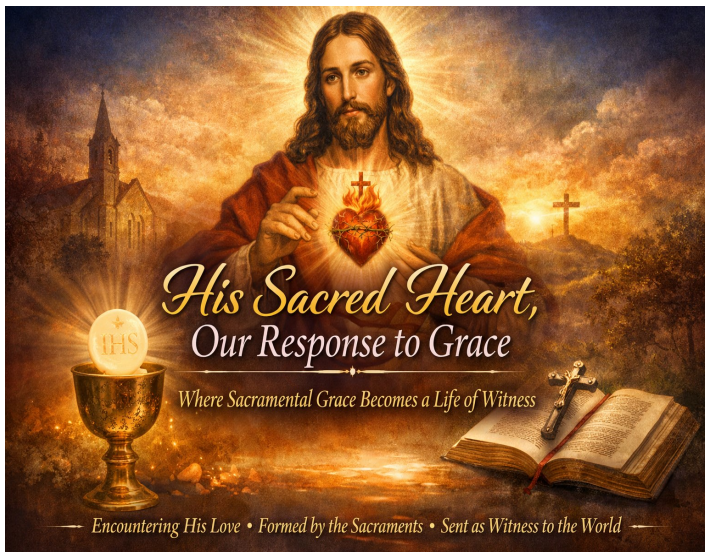

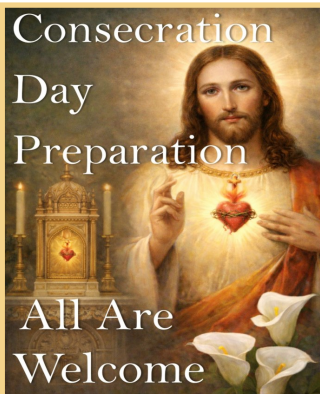

- * Drive and park where directed during a burial service. **No driving through the NW field, developed for future burial plots.**
- * For the safety of all visitors, volunteers and employees we request that the following items not be left on graves, per cemetery rules and regulations,
- * **NO glass, mylar balloons, metal stakes, toys, shells, rocks/stones, potted plants, plastic containers, lights, candles, etc. These items become projectiles when the mowing begins.**
- * **No digging** in and around graves, creating holes in the ground.
- * At no time is it appropriate to use or leave drugs or alcohol on a grave in our cemetery. **DRUGS AND ALCOHOL ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED!**
- * Artificial flowers will be removed the week of April 1st for the season. The season for artificial flowers is Dec. 1- March 31st.
- * Mark your calendars for the "Spring Spruce Up". Our bi-annual clean up will be on May 16, 9:00-12:00. All parishioners are invited and encouraged to participate. Watch for future information.
- * **Please pass this message on to anyone, family or friends, that visit our cemetery and your loved ones. We would appreciate it.**

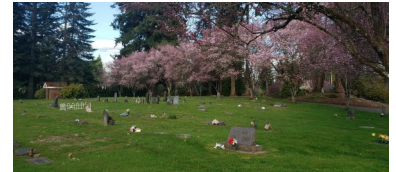

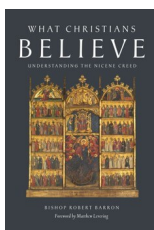
