

PASTOR'S LETTER

LOVE IS THE CHRISTIAN'S IDENTITY CARD

Vatican City, April 24, 2016. "Love is the Christian's identity card." "Only with courageous decisions can the greatest dreams be realized." "Free is the one who knows how to say yes and who knows how to say no." "Jesus calls you to put your talents to use in life." "God always wants you to stand tall." These were some of the phrases from the homily that Pope Francis delivered to the more than seventy thousand young people who participated in the Holy Mass celebrated in St. Peter's Square. Starting from the phrase in the Gospel of Saint John: "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another," the Holy Father said: "What a great responsibility the Lord entrusts to us today! He tells us that people will recognize Jesus' disciples by how they love one another. In other words, love is the Christian's identity card; it is the only valid 'document' for being recognized as disciples of Jesus. ...If this document expires and is not continually renewed, we cease to be witnesses of the Master. ...The true friend of Jesus is distinguished primarily by concrete love; not love 'in the clouds,' no, but concrete love that shines forth in their life. Love is always concrete... And this is a daily task: learning to love." "Above all, loving is beautiful, it is the path to happiness," he emphasized. "But it is not easy; it is challenging, it requires effort. For example, let's think about when we receive a gift: it makes us happy, but to prepare that gift, generous people have dedicated time and effort, and in this way, by giving us something, they have also given us something of themselves... Indeed, to love means to give, not only something material, but something of oneself: one's personal time, one's friendship, one's personal abilities." "Let us look to the Lord, who is unsurpassed in generosity. We receive many gifts from him, and we should thank him every day... Even when we forget, he remembers to give us a special gift each day. It is not a material gift to hold in our hands and use, but a greater gift for life... He gives us his faithful friendship, which he will never withdraw. The Lord is our friend forever. Moreover, even if you disappoint him and distance yourself from him, Jesus continues to love you and be with you, believing in you more than you believe in yourself. This is the unique nature of the love that Jesus teaches us... Because the main threat that prevents us from growing properly is when no one cares about you—this is sad—when you feel marginalized. On the other hand, the Lord is always by your side and is happy to be with you... He calls you to follow him, to "put out into the deep" and "cast your nets," trusting in his word; that is, to put your talents to

use in life, alongside him, without fear. If you listen to the Lord's voice, he will reveal to you the secret of tenderness: to care for another person means to respect them, protect them, and be patient with them. And this is the manifestation of tenderness and love." Your happiness is priceless and non-negotiable; it's not an app you can download on your mobile phone: not even the latest version will help you be free and great in love. Freedom is something else entirely. Because love is the free gift of those with open hearts; it is a responsibility, but a beautiful responsibility that lasts a lifetime; it is the daily commitment of those who know how to realize great dreams. Love is nourished by trust, respect, and forgiveness. Love doesn't arise from talking about it, but from living it; it's not a beautiful poem to memorize, but a life choice that must be put into practice. How can we grow in love? The secret lies in the Lord: Jesus gives himself to us in the Holy Mass, he offers us forgiveness and peace in Confession. There we learn to receive his love, make it our own, and spread it throughout the world. "And when loving seems arduous, when it's difficult to say no to what is false, look at the cross of the Lord, embrace it, and do not let go of his hand, which leads you upward and lifts you up when you fall. Throughout life, we always fall, because we are sinners, we are weak. But there is the hand of Jesus that lifts us up and raises us. Jesus wants us to stand tall. That beautiful word that Jesus said to the paralyzed: 'Get up.' God created us to stand on our own two feet. And this hand often comes through the hand of a friend, the hand of our parents, the hand of those who accompany us in life. You are called to build the future in this way: together with others and for others, but never against anyone. You don't build 'against': that's called destruction. You will do wonderful things if you prepare yourselves well, starting now. Do as the world champions in sports do, who achieve great goals by training with humility and tenacity every day." May your daily program be the works of mercy: Train yourselves enthusiastically in them to become champions of life, champions of love. In this way, you will be known as disciples of Jesus. In this way, you will have the true identity of Christians. And I assure you: your joy will be complete."

Living the Mass: The Eucharist We Celebrate Shapes the Life We Live A Parish Journey into the Eucharist

Part II: We Listen: God Speaks to His People

After God gathers His people, He does not remain silent. In the Liturgy of the Word, the living God speaks to His Church, just as He has done throughout salvation history. This part of the Mass reminds us that our faith is not built on ideas or opinions, but on a relationship with a God who reveals Himself through His Word.

The readings from Sacred Scripture are not chosen at random. Over the course of the liturgical year, the Church carefully unfolds the story of God's saving love, allowing us to hear from the Old Testament, the Psalms, the Apostles, and above all, from Christ Himself in the Gospel. When the lector proclaims the Word, it is God who speaks to His people here and now. This is why we listen attentively, not as an audience, but as disciples eager to hear the voice of the Master.

Between the readings, we sing or recite the Responsorial Psalm. This is more than a musical pause. The Psalm is our prayerful response to what we have heard. In these inspired words, the Church teaches us how to speak back to God, with trust, praise, sorrow, and hope. Even our children learn, through the repeated refrain, that God's Word invites a response from the heart.

As the Gospel Acclamation rises, usually with a joyful "Alleluia," we stand. Standing is a sign of readiness and reverence. We rise because Christ Himself is about to speak to us in the Gospel. During Lent, when the Alleluia is set aside, our posture still proclaims anticipation. We are preparing to meet the Lord who calls us to conversion and deeper faith.

"When God speaks, disciples listen with open hearts."

In the proclamation of the Gospel, we encounter the words and actions of Jesus Christ. The Church signs herself with the cross on the forehead, lips, and heart, quietly praying that God's Word may be in our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts. This small gesture teaches us something profound: the Gospel is meant to shape the way we think, speak, and live.

The homily flows directly from the Gospel and the other readings. It is not meant to be a lecture or commentary alone, but a sacred moment when the Word of God is broken open for our lives today.

Through the homily, Christ continues to teach His people, guiding us in faith and challenging us to live what we have heard. Saint Augustine once told his listeners that when the Scriptures are proclaimed and explained, it is Christ who is speaking to His Church. Listening with open hearts allows His Word to take root.

For families, the Liturgy of the Word is a powerful teaching moment. Children learn by watching adults listen attentively, respond in prayer, and reflect quietly. In this way, the Mass forms not only individual believers, but whole households in faith.

The Catechism reminds us that "when Sacred Scripture is read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his Word, proclaims the Gospel" (CCC 1348). To listen at Mass, then, is an act of discipleship. It requires attention, patience, and a willingness to be changed.

As we continue this season of Ordinary Time and look ahead to Lent, the Church invites us to ask ourselves how we listen to God. Do we come prepared to hear His Word, or distracted by other concerns? Are we willing to let the Scriptures challenge us, comfort us, and guide our daily choices?

Listening at Mass is also an act of stewardship. God entrusts His Word to us, not to be stored away, but to be lived. When we receive the Scriptures with open hearts, we become responsible for what we have heard. The Word we listen to on Sunday is meant to shape the way we speak during the week, the choices we make, and the care we show to others. Faithful listening leads naturally to faithful living.

Lord Jesus,

You are the Word made flesh. Open our ears to hear your voice, our minds to understand your teaching, and our hearts to live what you proclaim. May your Word take root in us and bear fruit in our lives.

Amen.

What challenges do you see that exist in the Five Mountain Catholic Community? An example could be having several families with teenagers but not being able to hire a youth minister.


Question 3:


Consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus
